

Our time was spent in amusing our mind with Civics, English, Home Economics, Typing, Bookkeeping, Health and Safety, Algebra and Shorthand.

I finally, thought of Leroy Pieper and asked Ruth about him. She told me he was now married to Mary Ann H. and rwned a Barber Shop here in Dubois. Mary Ann didn't like the country so Leroy had to move to town. Poor Leroy! Well we could have told you this yet in school days.

Ruth said that Junior Denu was now a Greyhound Bus Driver. We know he used to like to drive a school bus to haul the good looking girls to school but we didn't know that he lets all the good looking ones ride free on the Greyhound and makes the others pay double. What a shame:

Now that it was getting late, and we had talked over old times and all we wanted to hear, we decided to journey back to our same old work in this business world. My vacation is now over and I find myself once more back on the farm. I was thinking it all over and just thought how silly the whole class of "1947" turned out to be.
