

The Story Unfolds

On September 1, 1951, forty two anxious but green Freshmen were enrolled in Dubois High School. At the beginning it appeared obvious that many of these would distinguish themselves and would become outstanding.

Kreitzer, Principal; Mr. Elmer Zehr, Social Studies; Mr. Ralph Seger, Coach and Commerce; Mrs. Ruth Schiller, Mathematics and Latin; Mr. John Walker, Science; Miss Thelma Sater, Commerce and English; Miss Jesse Mae Quebbeman, Home Economics and Miss Charlotte Coomer, Music.

Our class officers were President - Mary Ann Baer; Vice President - Robert Skaggs; Secretary - John Popp; Treasurer - Dian Rohrscheib; Class Reporters Charles Himsel and Shirley Nordhoff.

Miss Quebbeman was our class sponsor. Our basketball queen attendants were Shirley Hall and Shirley Nordhoff. In the second half of school, Alberta Lampert was forced to quit school due to illness. We were however pleased to learn that after her convalescence she returned to school and will no doubt complete her high school education.

When we returned as sophomores we found that we had lost two more of our number, Emily Hiemer who had returned to Germany and Milton Hodges.

During the year we had four new teachers, Miss Barbara Price replaced Miss Quebbman; Mr. Aaron Parks took the Science classes from Mr. Walker and also taught Vocational Agriculture, a new department that had been added; Mr. Chapman taught English and Mrs. Eva Lasher replaced Mrs. Charlotte Coomer Rasche while Lula Ellen made her appearance.

Our Sophomore class officers were President - John Popp; Vice President; Patricia Fromme; Secretary - James Friedman; Treasurer Shirley Hall; Class reporters Charles Himsel and Shirley Nordhoff.

This year our Basketball Queen attendants were Shirley Nord-hoff and Virginia Knies, Mr. Chapman was our class sponsor.

After four months vacation we reported back for our junior year in high school to discover that we had lost Mary Eileen Schepers, Shirley Kane and Eugene Hostetter. Faculty changes included Mrs. Henry Seger for Miss Price, Mr. Henry Seger for Mr. Chapman and Mrs. Rasche again returned to the music department.

The junior class officers were President - Mary Ann Baer; Vice President - Thomas Reck; Secretary - Shirley Hall; Treasurer Geraldine Nonte; Class reporters - Shirley Hall and Thomas Reck.

Our basketball queen attendants for the year were Shirley Nordhoff and Virginia Knies. Donald Opel was elected cheer leader from our class.



Thelma Sater was our junior sponsor and some of the activities of the class were as follows; selling magazines, a junior carnival, the class play entitled "The Campbells Are Coming" and the Junior-Senior Prom. All the activities were a huge success and we became quite prosperous. During the year we lost James Wineinger and Eileen Coble but we gained Gene Neukam who came to us from French Lick High School.

Again in our senior year there was a change in faculty as Mr. Paul Phillips took the place of Mrs. Schiller and Mrs. Amanda Tolliver replaced Miss Sater. Two new departments were added as Mr. Parks took Farm Shop and Mr. Phillips taught a class in Industrial Arts.

Our class officers were President - Robert Skaggs; Vice President Thomas Reck; Secretary - Virginia Knies; Treasurer - Geraldine Nonte; Class Reporters were Mary Ann Baer and Floyd Thimling.

Our class sponsor was Mr. Zehr, who helped us order our announcements and helped guide us to a successful conclusion to our senior year. Mr. Henry Seger was kind enough to sponsor our senior play entitled, "Girl Shy."

Virginia Knies was elected as the basketball queen and her attendants were Shirley Nordhoff and Geraldine Nonte. Shirley Hall was selected as the Holiday Queen. Donald Opel again served as a yell leader and Mary Ann Baer was selected as the representative in the D. A. R. Good-Citizenship Contest.

We sincerely feel that our senior year was the greatest year of our life and already have a feeling that we will be sorry that it is all over. However, we are heartened with the knowledge that all good things must come to an end.


For our class motto we chose, "Success Lies In Effort." Our class colors are blue and white and the class flower a white carnation.


of the Press, Assembly, and Petition. Last and most important, Freedom of Speech.

You, oh Citizen of "America the Beautiful," have heard me because you and I are free. And as long as I am free, my voice will speak . . . "Forever and Forever."




