Known as John Dopy, is allowed out on weekends but only under adult supervision, has the highest insurance rates among seniors due to Mazda incidents.

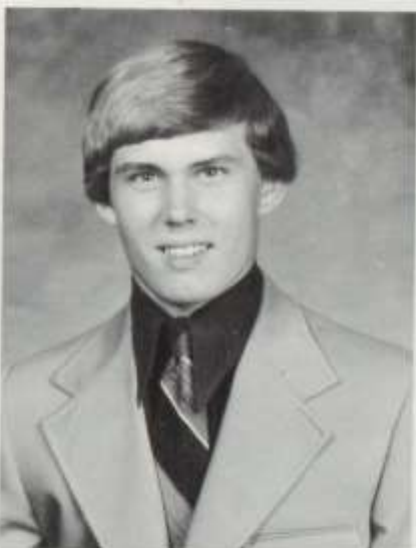

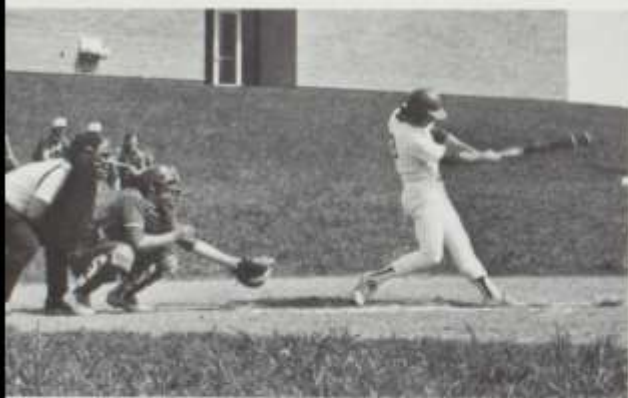
Lost River Not Lost to the Jeeps
