
Perhaps there's nothing you can do; The thing is strictly ours to do;

The Chorus enjoyed doing all of their performances, but the most fun for them to do was the Blacklight Show which was also very profitable for the Music Department.









When I am at school, I think about the people there. It's weird to think that somehow everyone I have met at school (teachers, students, and close friends) has in some way changed me.









(Volleyball) Girls Bring First Sectional Title to Dubois High

Rain and Delays Force the Slide Into a Troubled


After a slow start the '75 baseball team, under Coach John Church, put it together and the victories started sliding in.


And now, the end is near . . .
