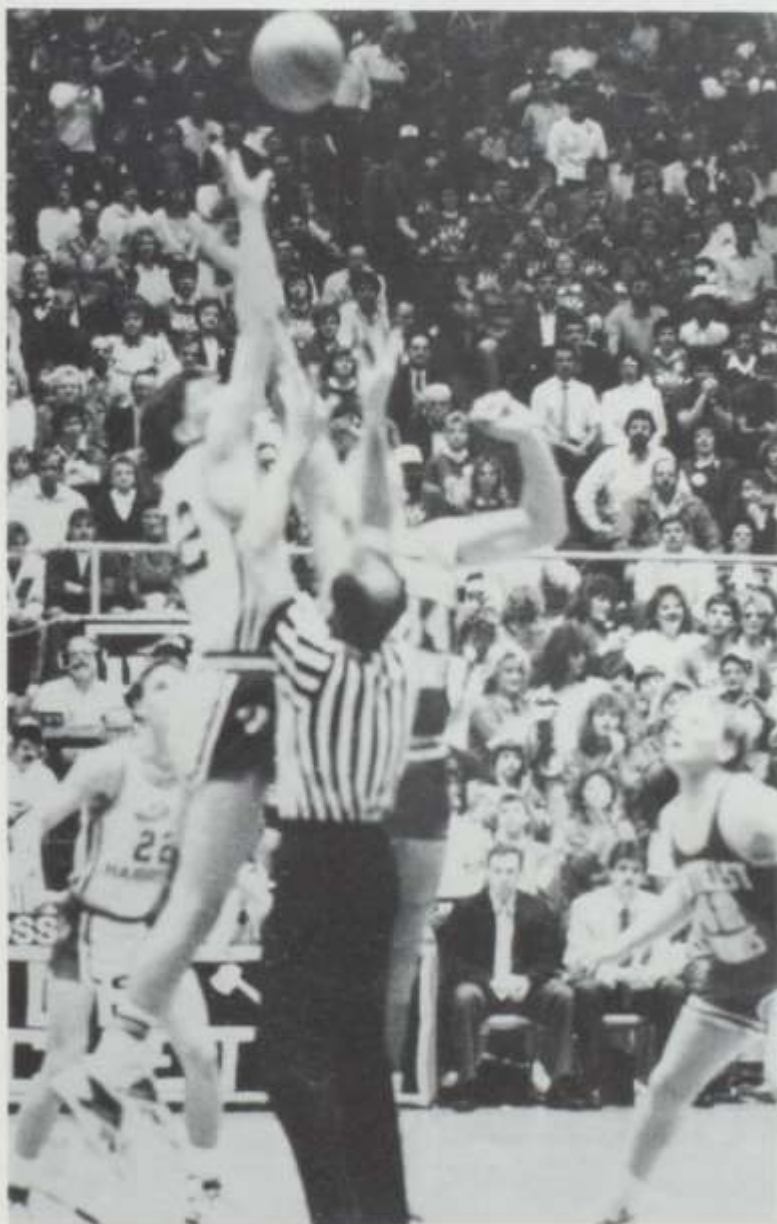
Fall

The year of 1987-88 was a year of firsts. Along with the Cross Country team achieving a first by reaching semi-state the Northeast Dubois High School spelling team performed amazing feats.

Although the first competition wasn't until Oct. 5, Mrs. Himself found her dictionaries, spelling tests, and lists from previous years. She then formulated a list of students that would be potential spellers and armed with her ammunition of knowledge, she assaulted the student victims with words, words, and more words. Some of these spellers then journeyed to Forest Park to compete against area schools. Although they were inexperienced at the time, they did really well by finishing second behind Loogootee. So far, the spelling competition was just practice. The real competition was at Tecumseh on Oct. 15. The team did an outstanding job. They won their division and outspelled all other eighteen teams in southern Indiana.

But the work did not end there. The win qualified the team for state. Mrs. Himself doubled her efforts to prepare the spellers. She also had the job of choosing a select few to represent our school. This team's hard effort and diligent work paid off on Nov. 14 at Indianapolis at the Northeast Dubois High School Spell Team won the state title in their division. 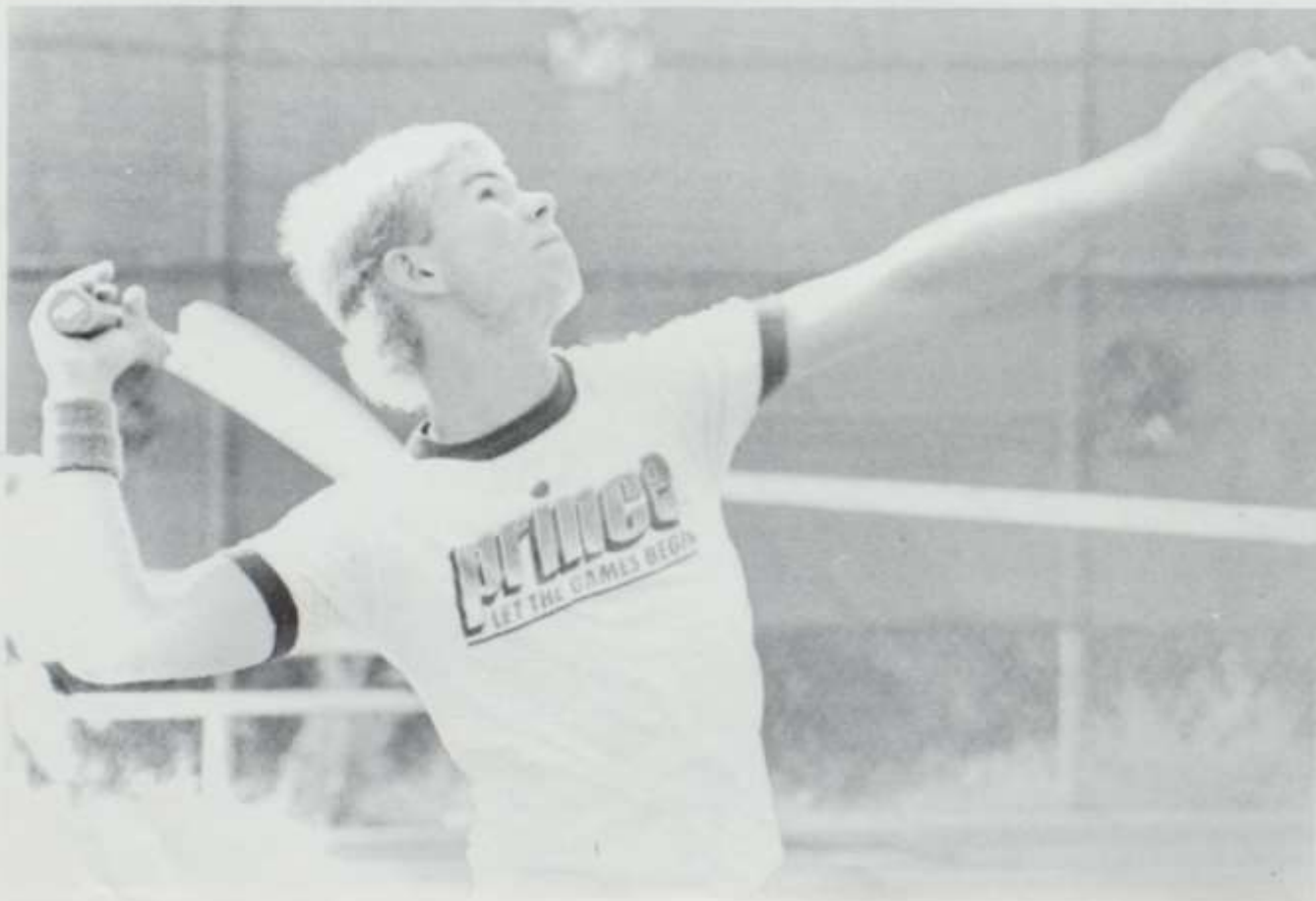

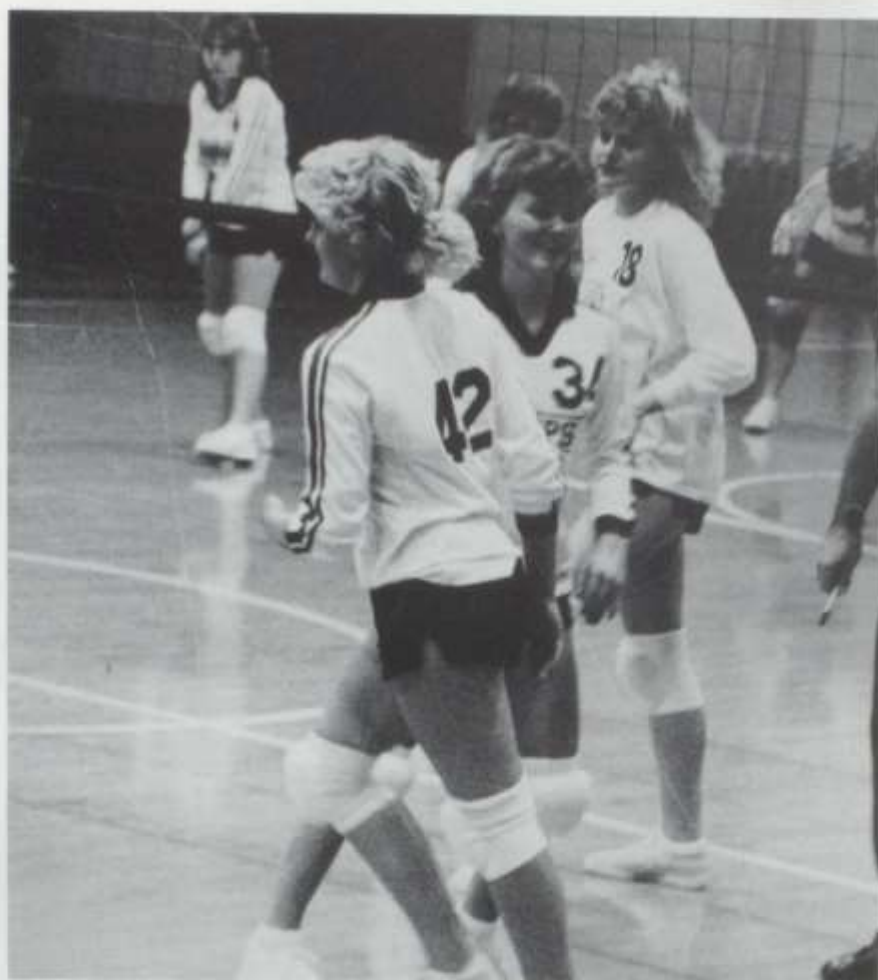

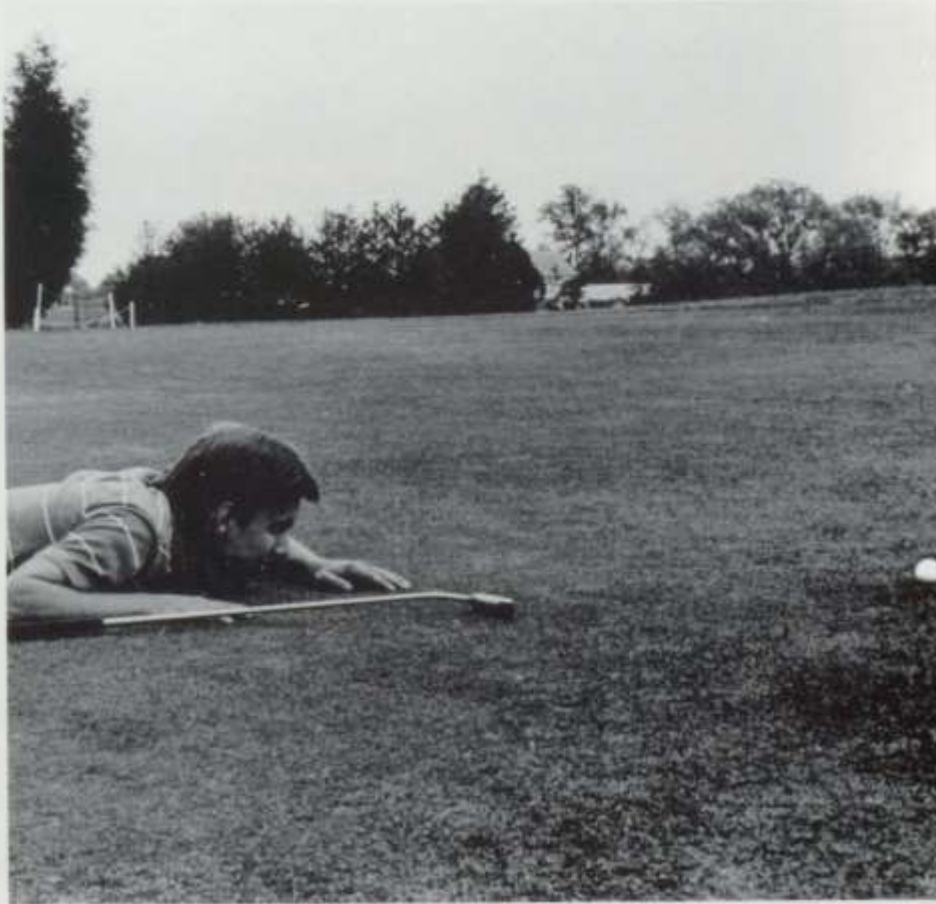

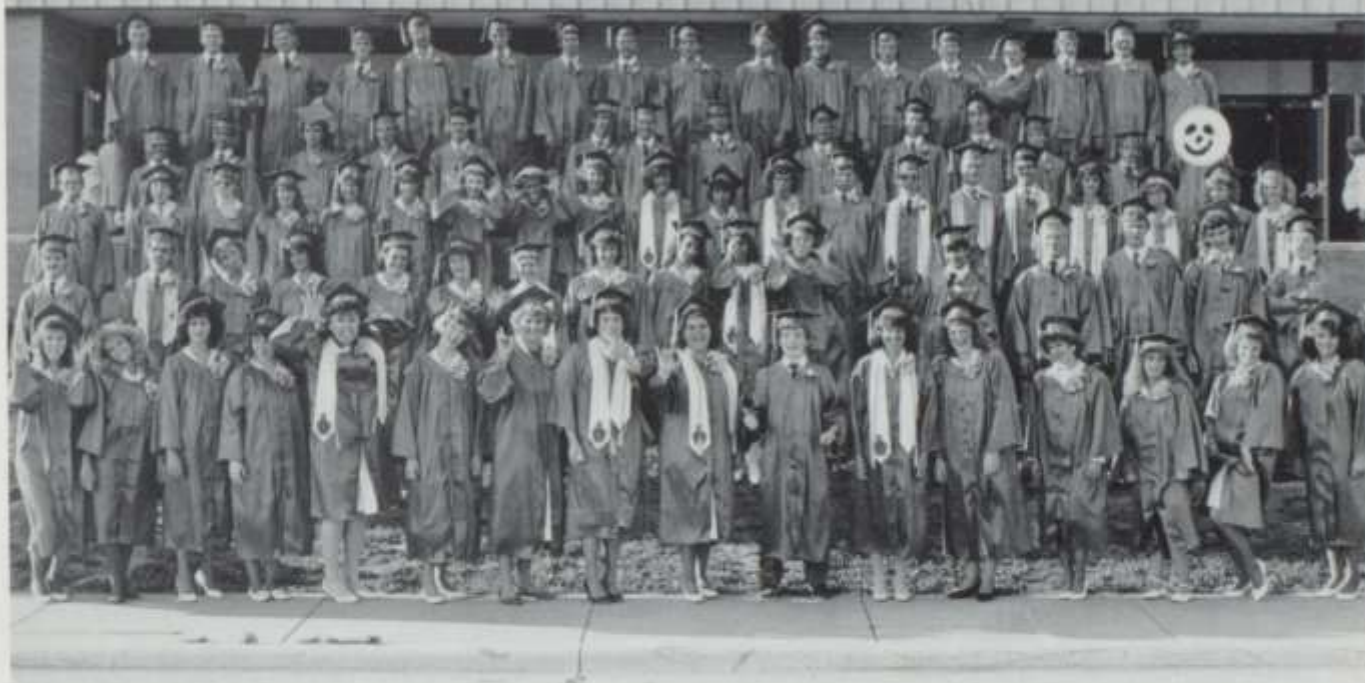
