This year's spellbowl team was determined to follow in the path of the previous team and reach the State finals. Their first competition was the Blue Chip Conference held on September 26, at Loogootee High School. The team earned first place through a tremendous effort.

The regional competition took place on October 13. Our spellers brought home another first place after out spelling all other 25 teams competing at Southridge High School. The win qualified the team for state.

They continued working to improve their spelling skills in preparation for the big competition. It was held at North Central High School in Indianapolis on September 26. 





The setting was a black background with black carpet. The background was trimmed with silver and pink foil arranged in a geometric design accentedbouquets of black, silver, and pink foil balloons.

The underclassmen attendants were fushia, floor-length dresses and carried white roses accented with babies breath and greenery. The underclassmen escorts were black tuxes with tails accented with black satin cumberbunds and bow ties.





























A Winning Season







As the season progressed injuries caused setbacks and the Jeeps struggled to a 7 win and 14 loss season. The senior oriented team stayed with it to the very end.


