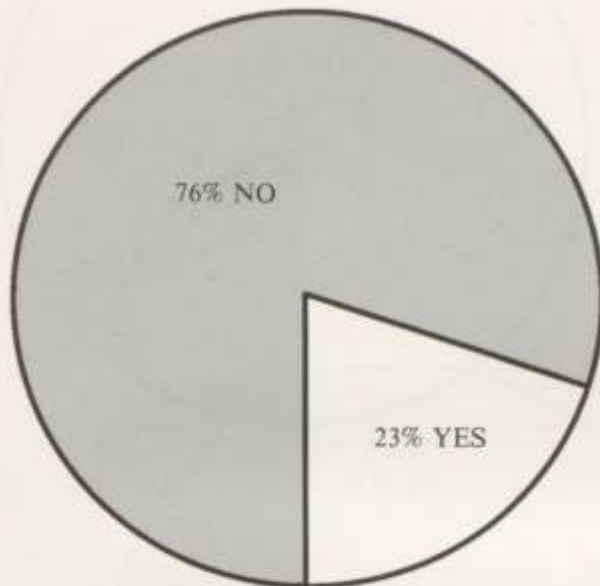

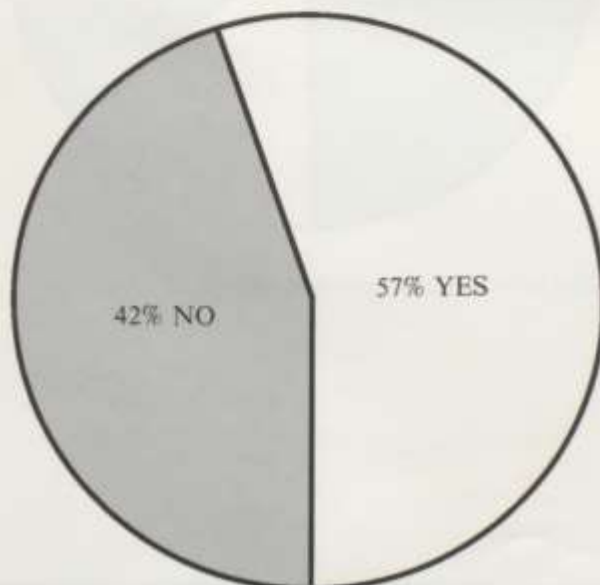
Ahhh . . . our high school year is finally done,

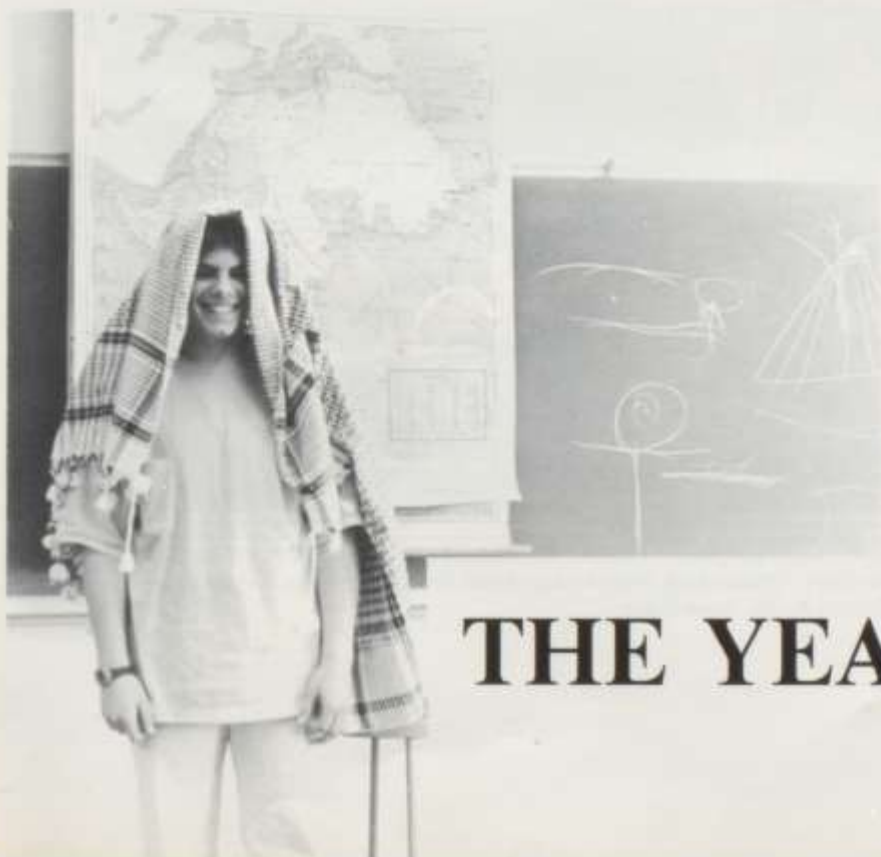

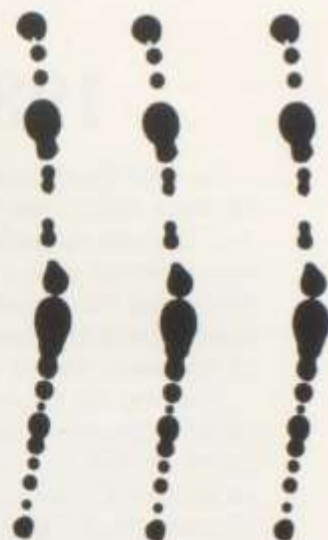

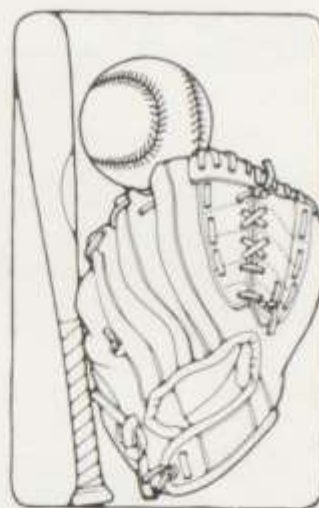
