
At the State Competition, the Northeast Dubois Spell Bowl Team finished 1st in the State in Class IV, correctly spelling 77 out of 80 words.



Prizes were given away each hour and at the end of the party,a breakfast was then held to conclude the 1990 Jr.-Sr. Post Prom.











This year's show music consisted of "Tronada", "Anything Goes", "Tequilla", and "Just Can't Stop Loving You."






FRESHMAN BASKETBALL

I feel good about this team because they represented the Northeast Dubois School District to the best of their abilitity - a goal we all strive to achieve. Coach Matheis.










Baseball Fever-Catch It!


