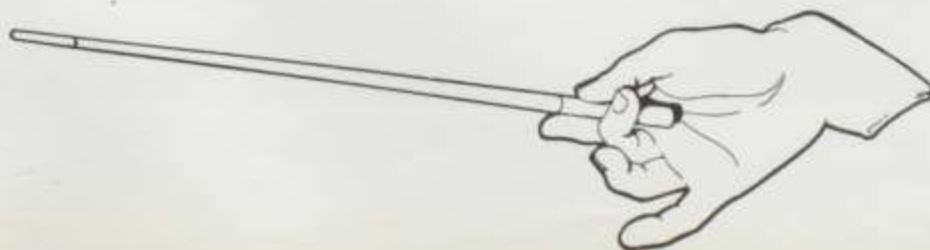

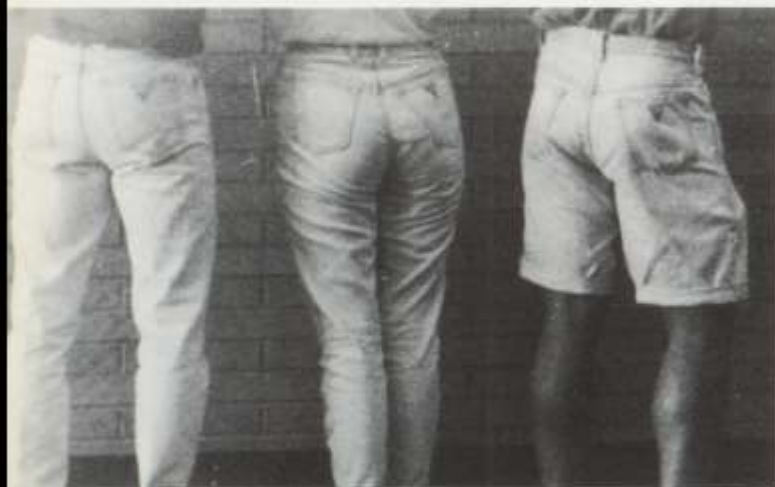

## IN NUMBERS

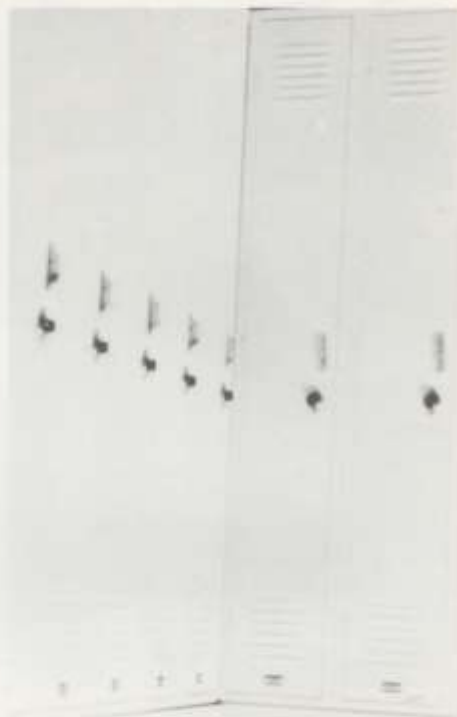

Those who chose college faced endless hassles. College days allowed seniors to take a day off of school and visit a prospective college. Then came the paper-

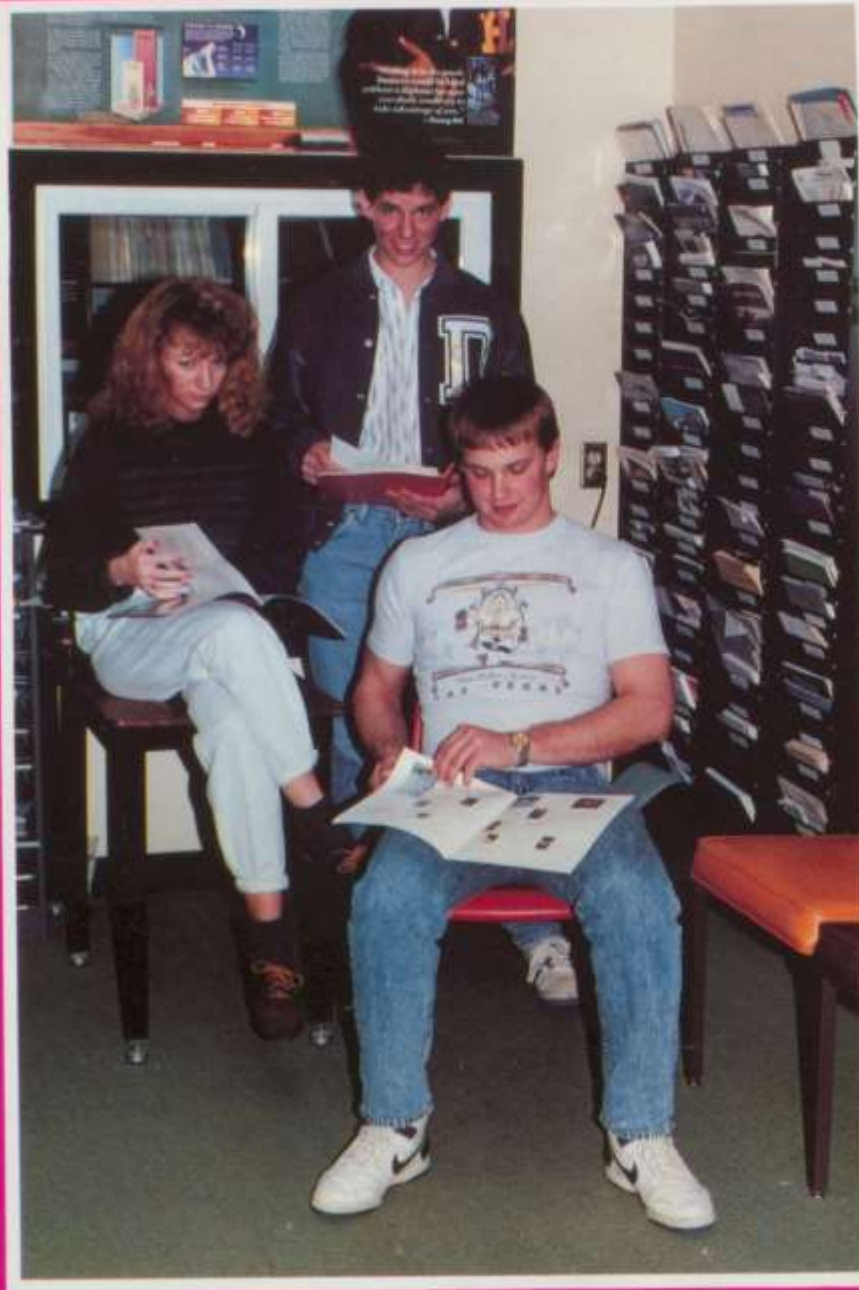

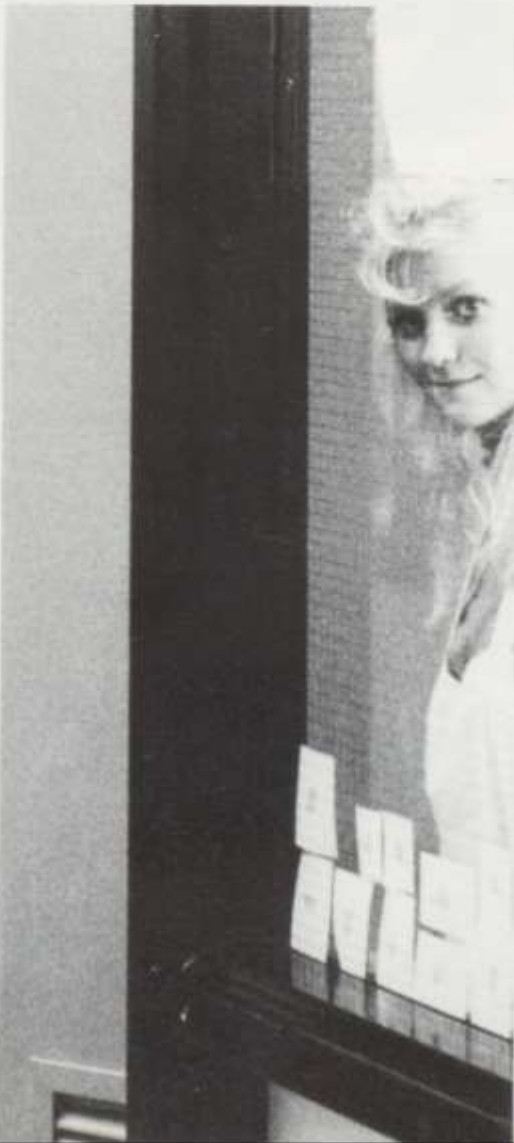

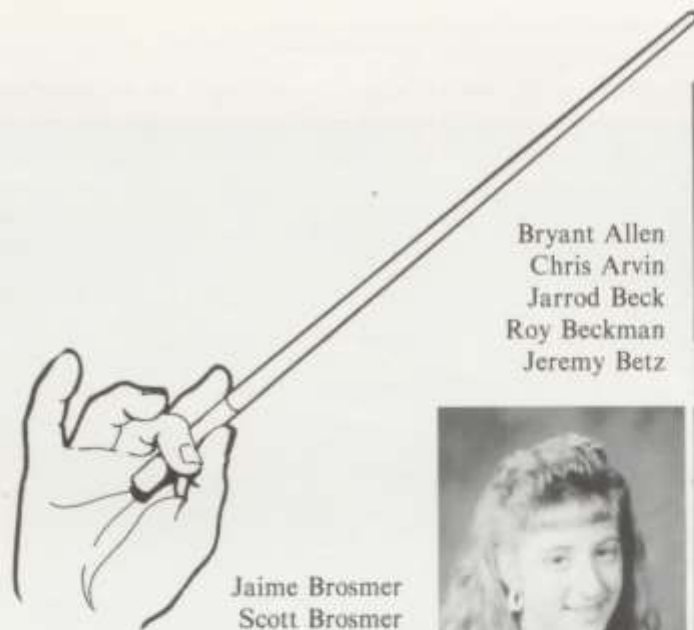

On November 10, the Jeeps traveled to North Central High School in Indianapolis to the state competition. The team finished second in Class 4 at State, correctly spelling 71 out of 80 words. 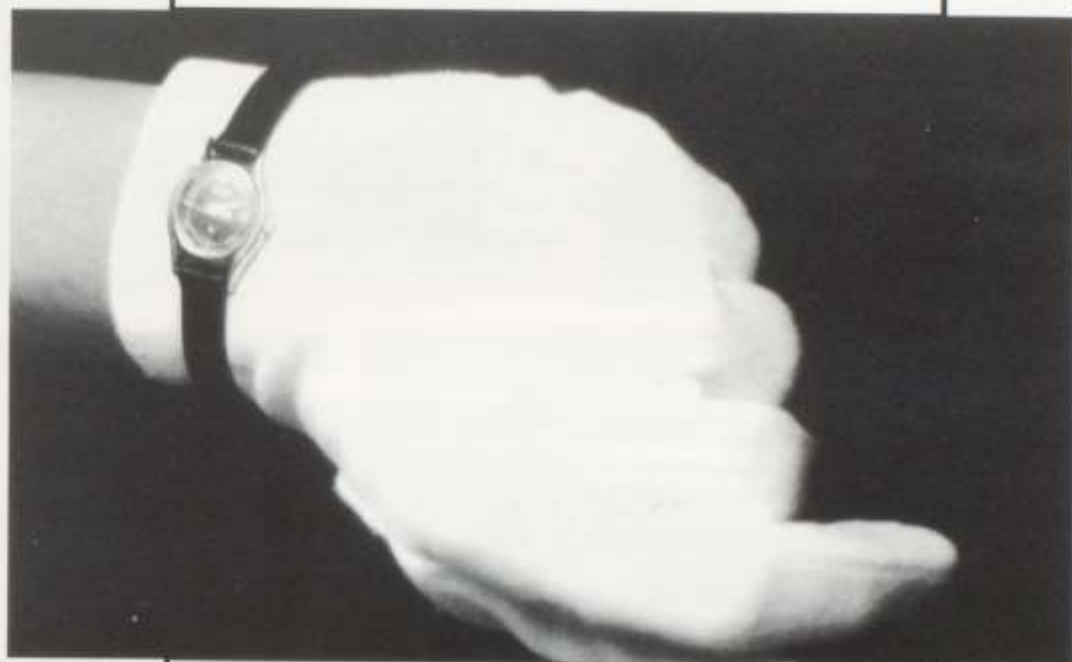

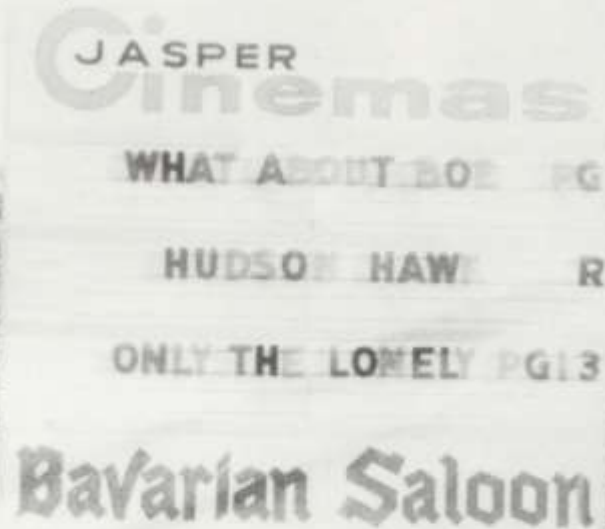

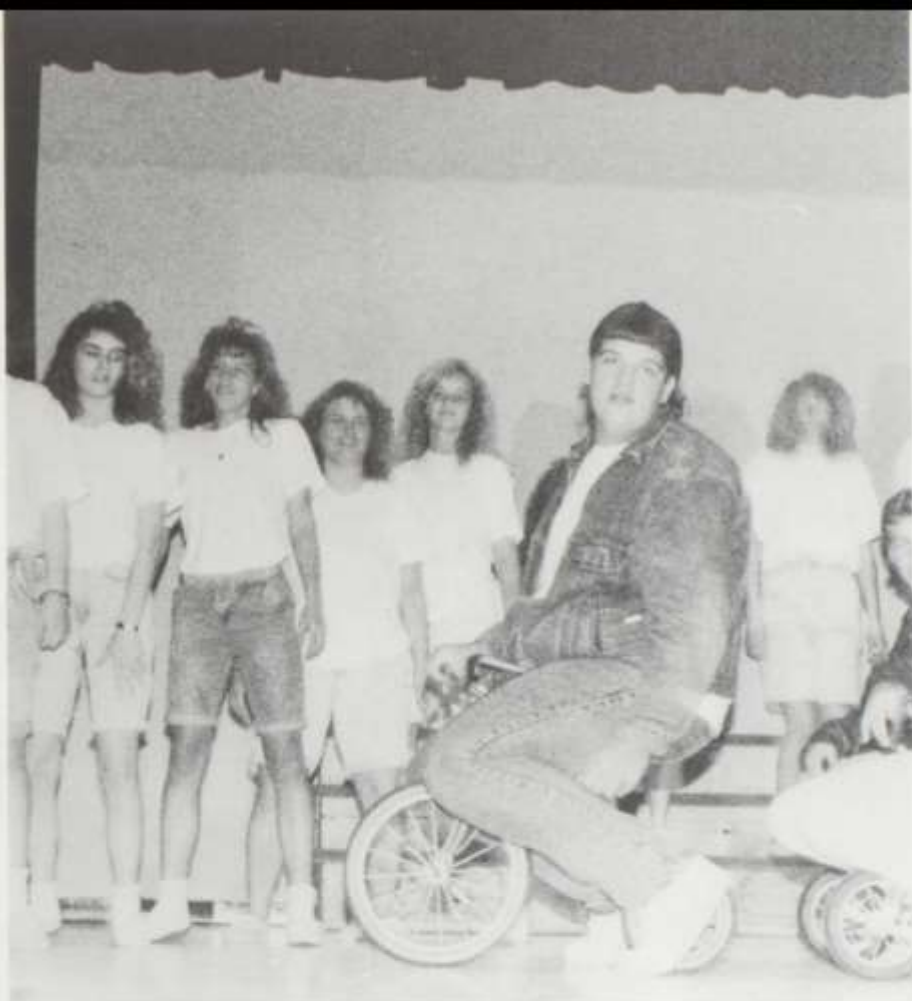

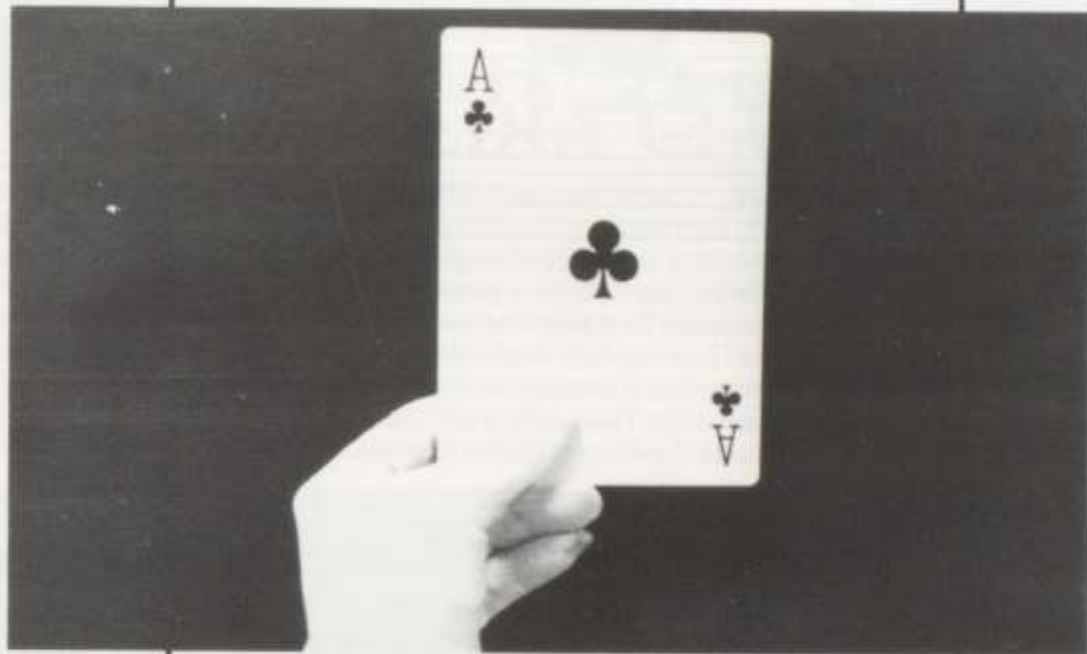

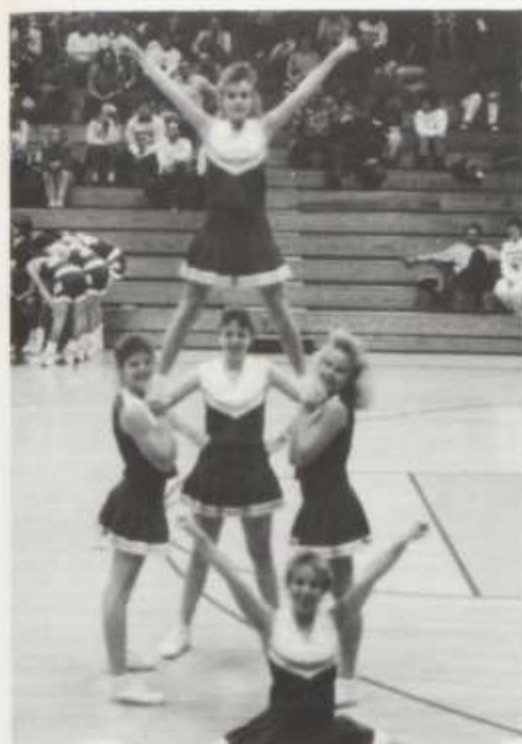

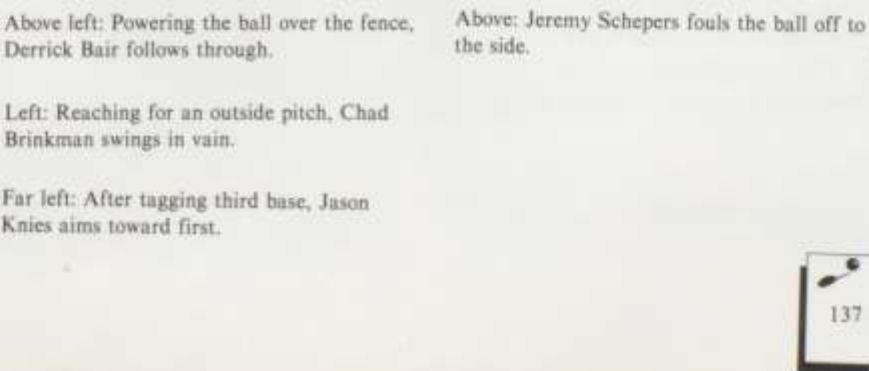
