
Your high school year.....


Gathering together to get the game plan set is the Varsity Volleyball team. The team ended the season with a very good note with winning sectional.




Northeast Dubois Show Choir presents "Disney Movie Magic"!









The team studied harder than ever, knowing that Kouts would be on their tail





At North Harrison the teams did well again with the Fine Arts team placing 1st and the Science and Math teams placing 2nd.


