This is a great accomplishment since only five schools in our class make it to State competition in Indiana. At state, both teams tied for first place, but by the luck of the tie-breaker, they each placed second in the state. The academic bowl teams also participated in two local competitions: Blue Chip and Area. Each team excelled in their own subject due to their hard work and dedication. Special recognition is owed to Thomas Kraemer and Kirby Frank who have participated in Academic Bowl all four years of their High School career.

Can you spell C-H-A-M-P-I-O-N? The Jeeps' spell bowl team members could certainly help you out. They came out with first place finishes in all but one preliminary competition. A few of the team members spelled all words correctly at all of the competitions. 




















## GRADUATION


Many memories have occured throughout the school years. For example: intramural teams, field trips, home basketball games, and weekend hangouts at the IGA.
