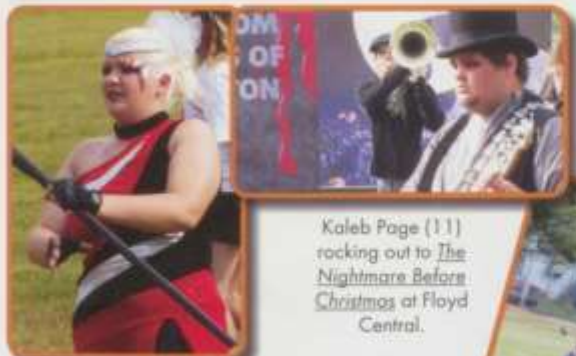

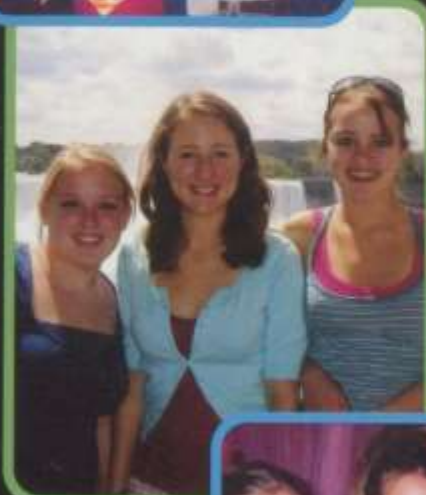

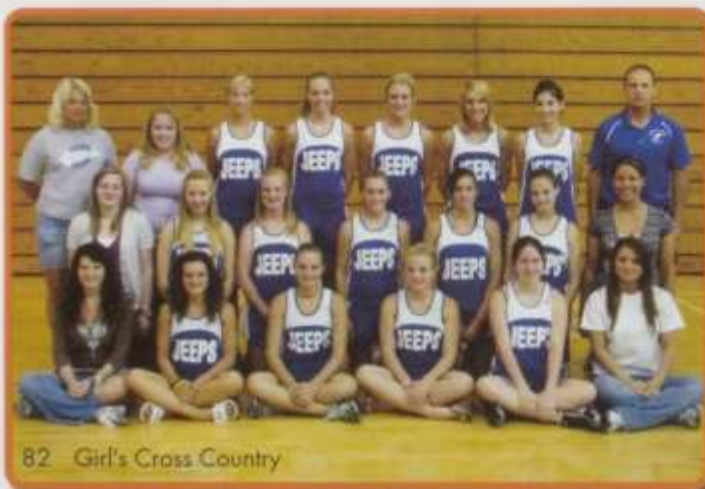

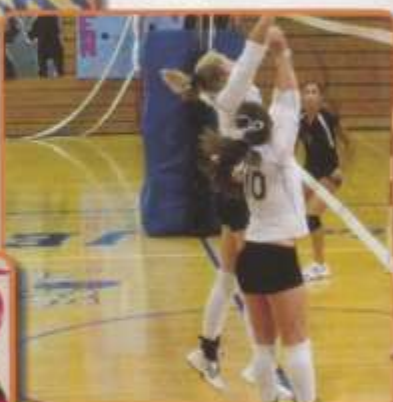

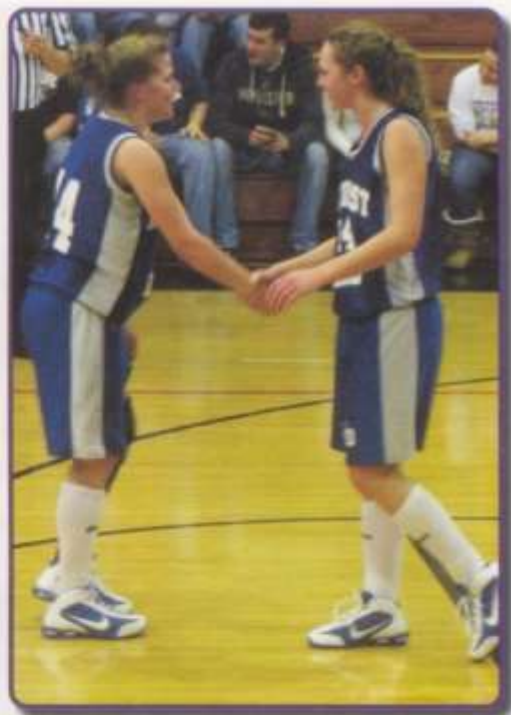

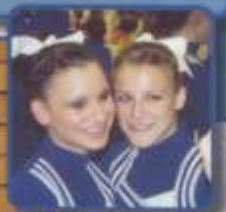

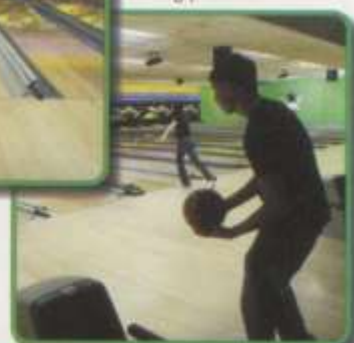

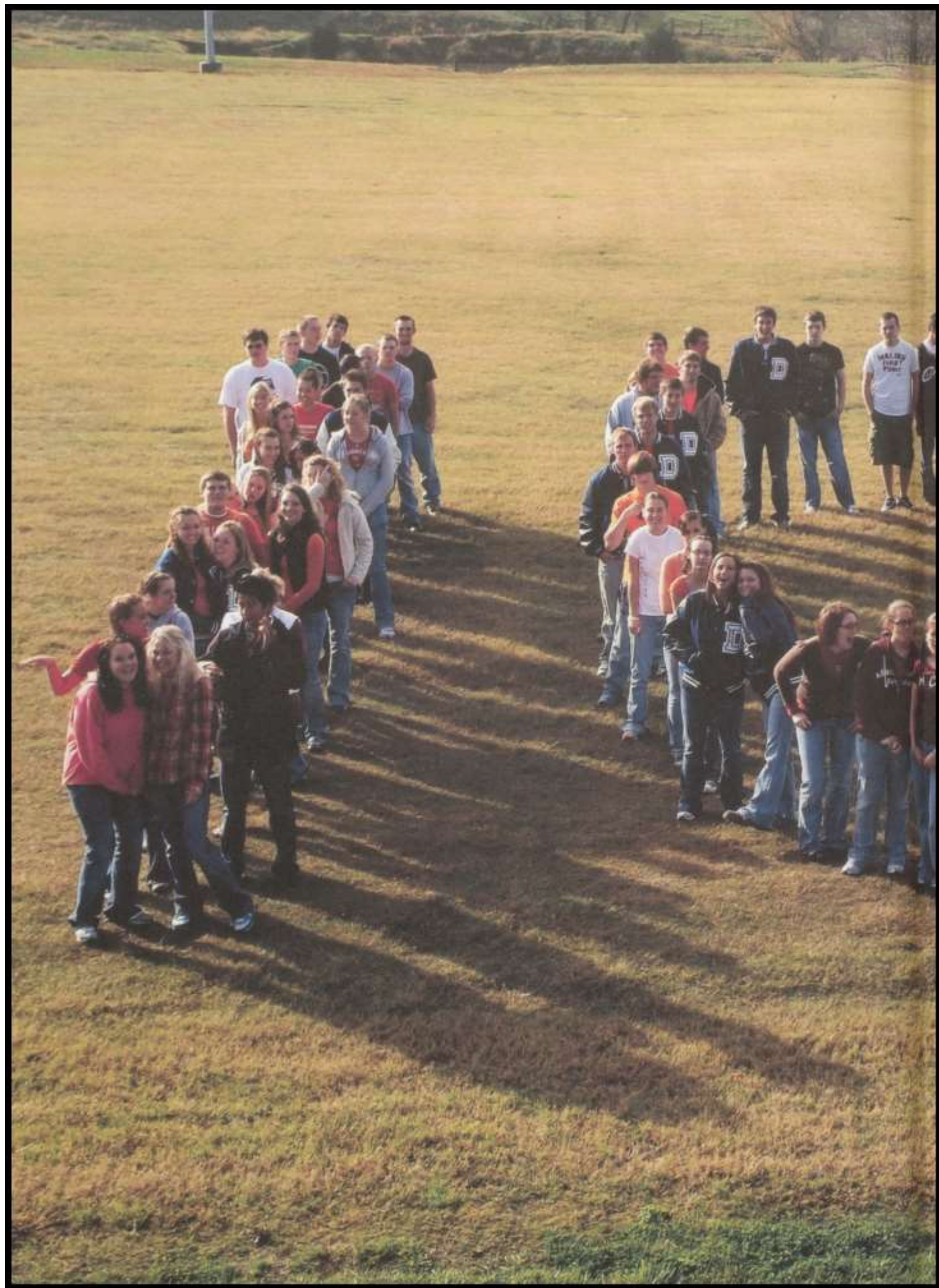
TIME after TIME...
