








Dan Balka




Vic Betz

JUST A SHORT WALK

Stepping onto a plane in Cincinnati, none of us had any idea what we were about to experience. Along our French teacher, chief chaperone, and trip planner, Mrs. Tenside, did share it was her 11th European experience. After our parents and us off with many signs, we met the group traveling with us from Castle High School, led by former NDHS teacher Shannon Wells, and then a few more days from Chicago, we arrived in Paris. To most of us, the whole thing still seemed surreal. The meeting from our first glimpse of the Eiffel Tower might have seemed mostly of actually being in Europe was starting to sink in. From the Luxembourg Garden to Notre Dame to the Louvre, famous and historical experiences we packed our days, getting where we needed to go on the Metro. The culture of Paris was a different experience for most of us; we walked miles under the streets of Paris, winding through ancient underground tunnels. And this was just the beginning. A couple days in the city of Florence, including our cooking school experience, gave us a taste of real Italian life. And when we thought our days couldn't get enough activities and sight seeing packed in, we experienced Rome in one day. We walked through the huge city to see the Vatican, Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel, Trevi Fountain, Spanish Steps, and the Tower Fountain. After a German tour guide showed us where Caesar was buried, we walked into the Colosseum in Rome. It's pretty safe to say it was the trip of a lifetime to be able to see so many incredibly famous landmarks, places, and buildings within a 10-day time. The little details and funny stories I couldn't fit in this summary are what the whole group will remember, and this experience that not many high schoolers can say they have had will never be forgotten. "This vacation happens once in a lifetime" (This will always remain in my head).


