


Noah Schepers (10) experimenting on. his iPad, seeing if his tongue would work the same as his fingers. He found out that the tongue does not produce the same results.








"I think the iPad gives the student and access to educational technology information anyplace anytime. The iPads should increase educational learning opportunities as well."

Mr. Fox








