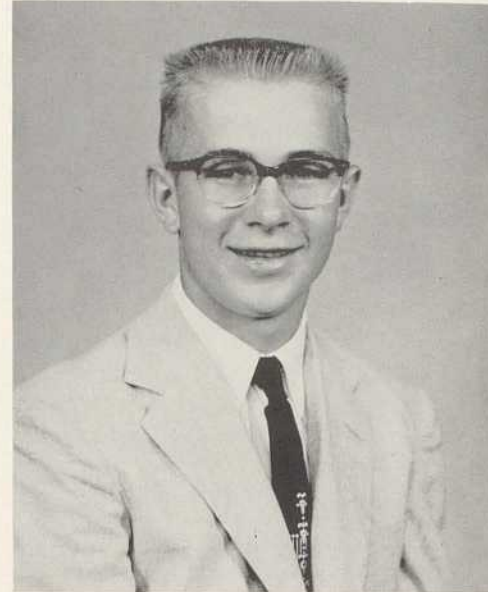
BONNIE FISCHER

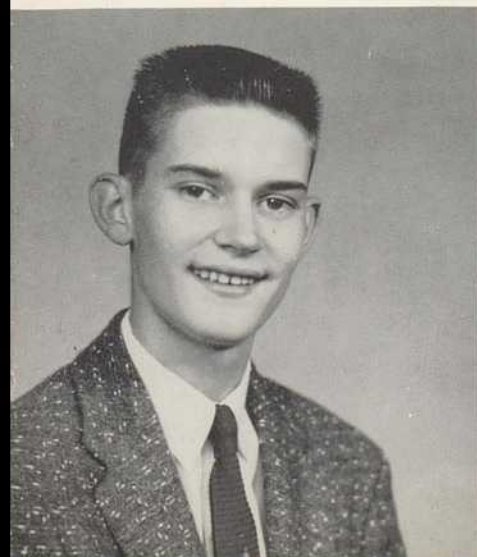
NORMAN LUEKEN

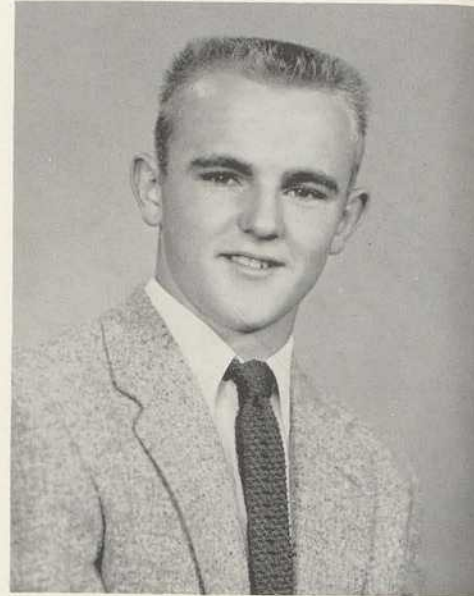
CLARA MAE SCHIPP

The Ferdinand Chamber of Commerce selected 6 ft. 3 in. forward, Dennis Durchholz, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Durchholz, of Ferdinand, as winner of the coveted Sportsmanship Trophy, which was presented to him at the annual Sportsmanship Banquet held in the high school cafeteria Thursday evening, May 4th.

DENNIS DURCHOLZ SHATTERS BASKETBALL RECORDS

Dennis "Turk" Durchholz capped a most spectacular season as one of Ferdinand's outstanding basketball athletes. In the past season he shattered almost every record of the school. He started the upward climb during the English game on February 8th when he set a new scoring record for the Ferdinand gym, as well as a new individual mark for a Ferdinand player, by pouring in 34 points. By the end of the sectional he had bested a one-season record by 47 points, having a total of 378. He lacked only 37 points of tying the all-time scoring record of 804 set by Leon Wendholt at the close of the 1953-54 season.

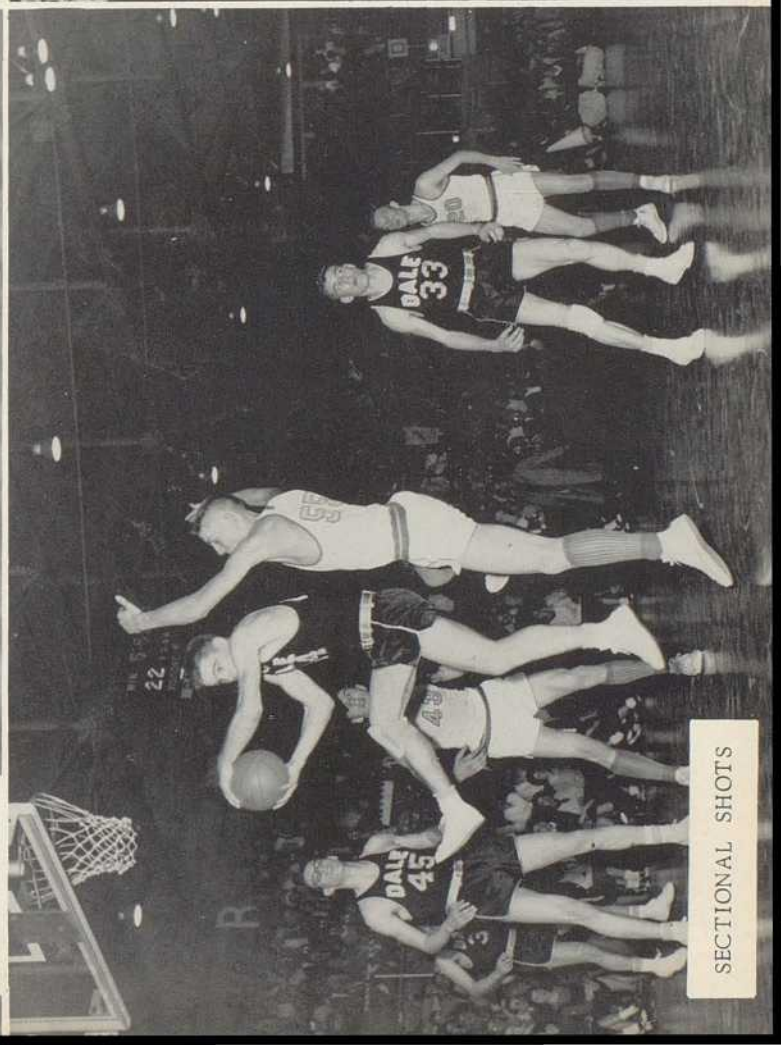




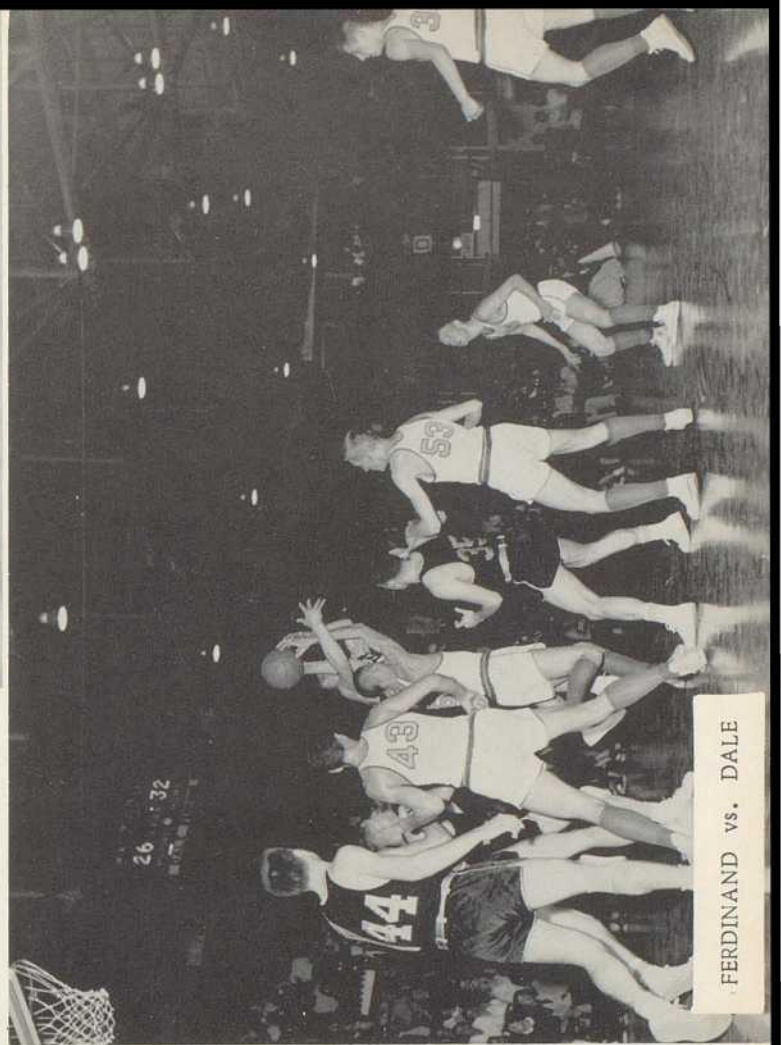
