












Throughout the season, fighting sharpshooter, Jim Ruhe, showed his ability to rebound and hit from the field.


Ed Pauckner led the team in rebounding and points. His seasonal average was 16.8.

Captain Gene Vaal and Co-Captain Jim Werne also contributed their fair share to the scoring column.











RECORD BREAKERS during the 1963 track season: Ernie Brames set a new P.V.C. record of 2:12 in the 880-run; Jim Ruhe broke both the P.V.C. record and the school record for the pole vault by clearing the bar at 10ft. 7 3/4 in. and also set a new school record for the broad jump of 19 ft. 3 in.; Ed Pauckner set a new school record of 42 ft. 10 in. for the shot put; and Gerald Schaefer broke two school records by running the high hurdles in 17.7 seconds and the low hurdles in 23.6 seconds.
