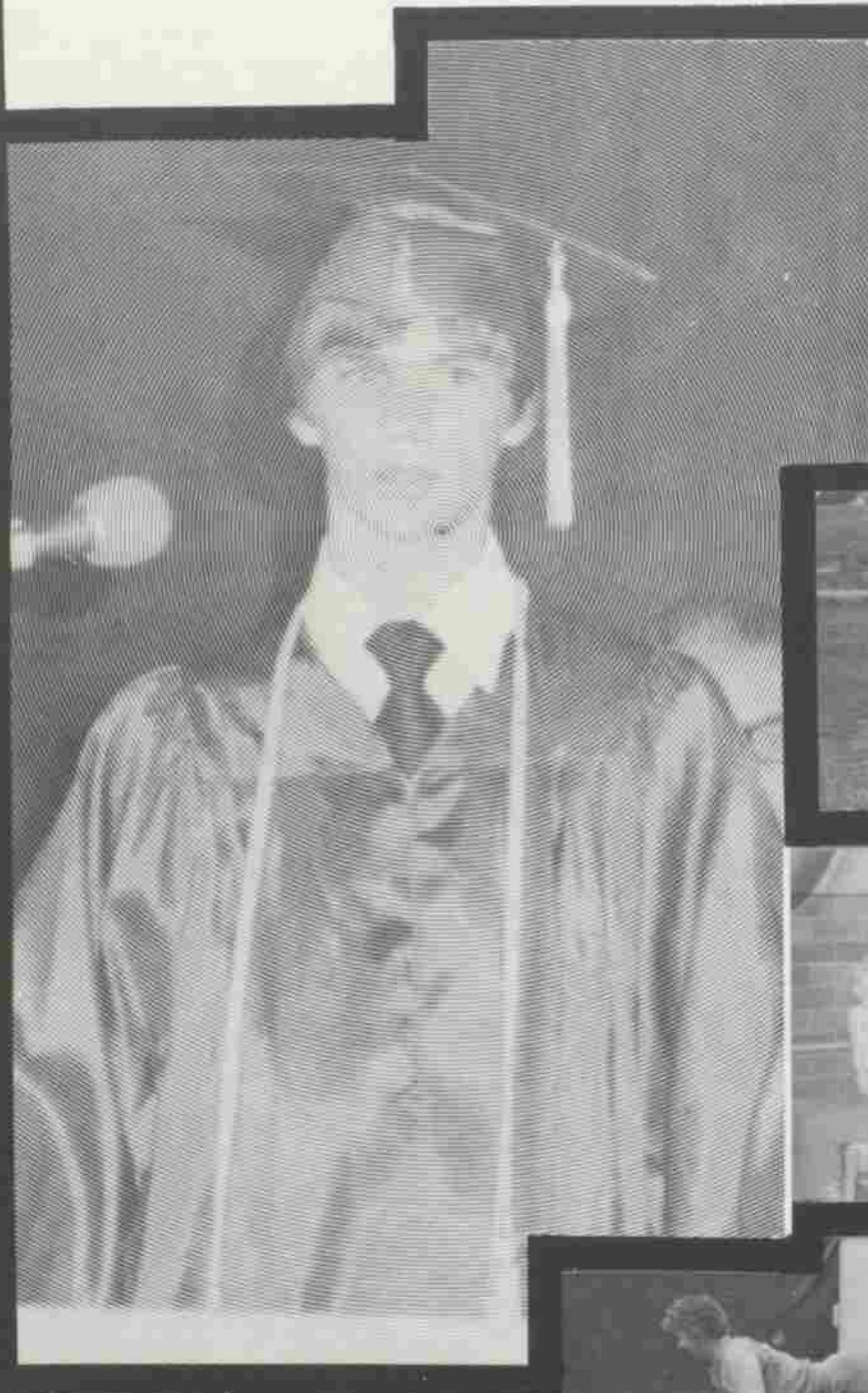

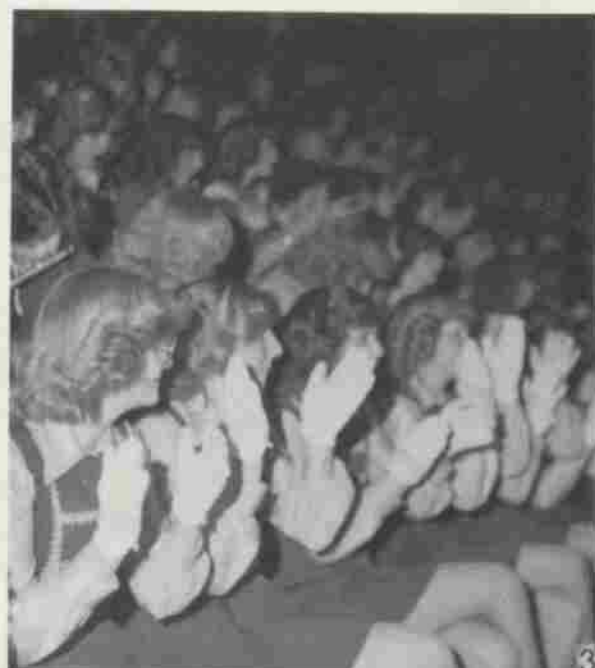
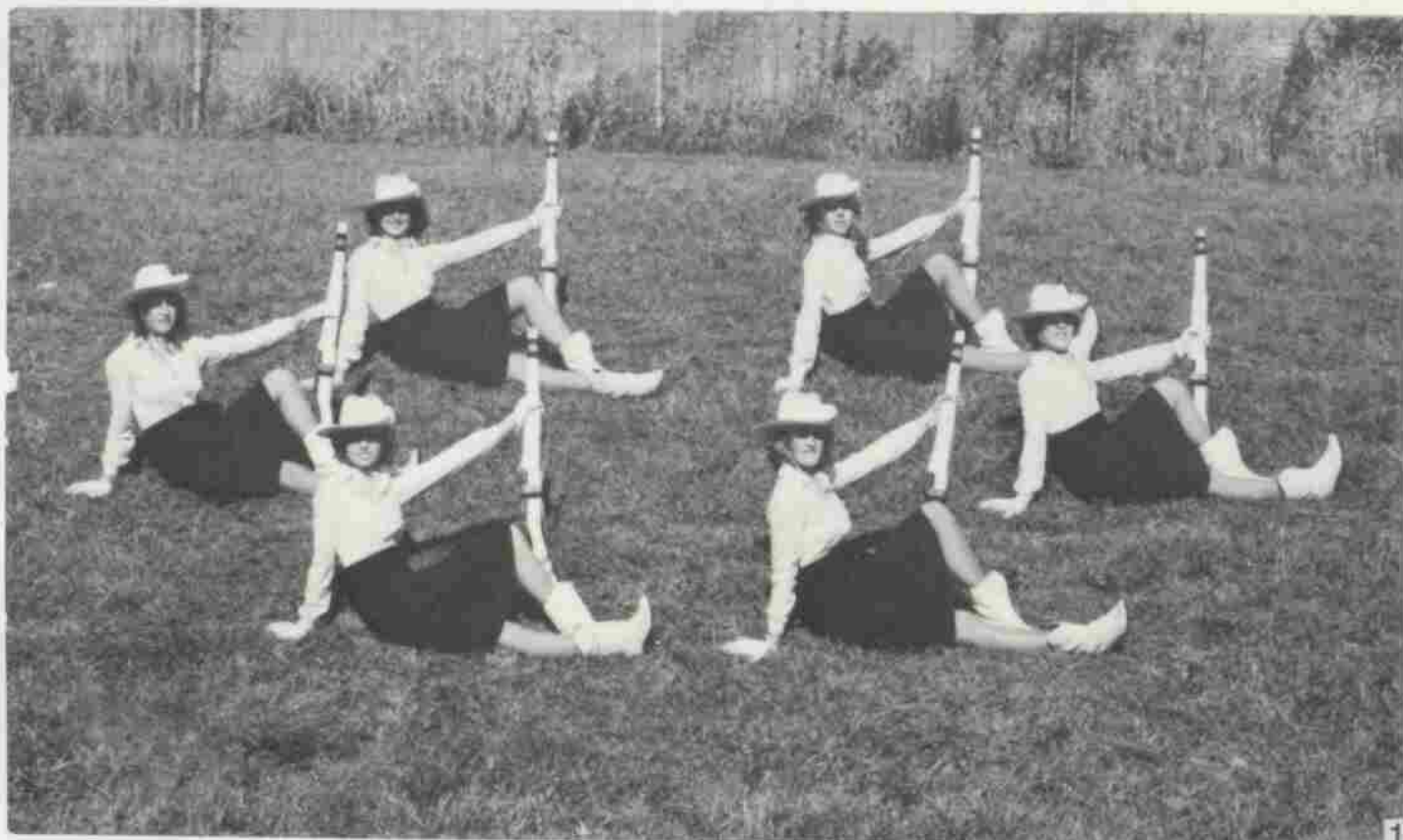
# *Drill Corps marches with pride*

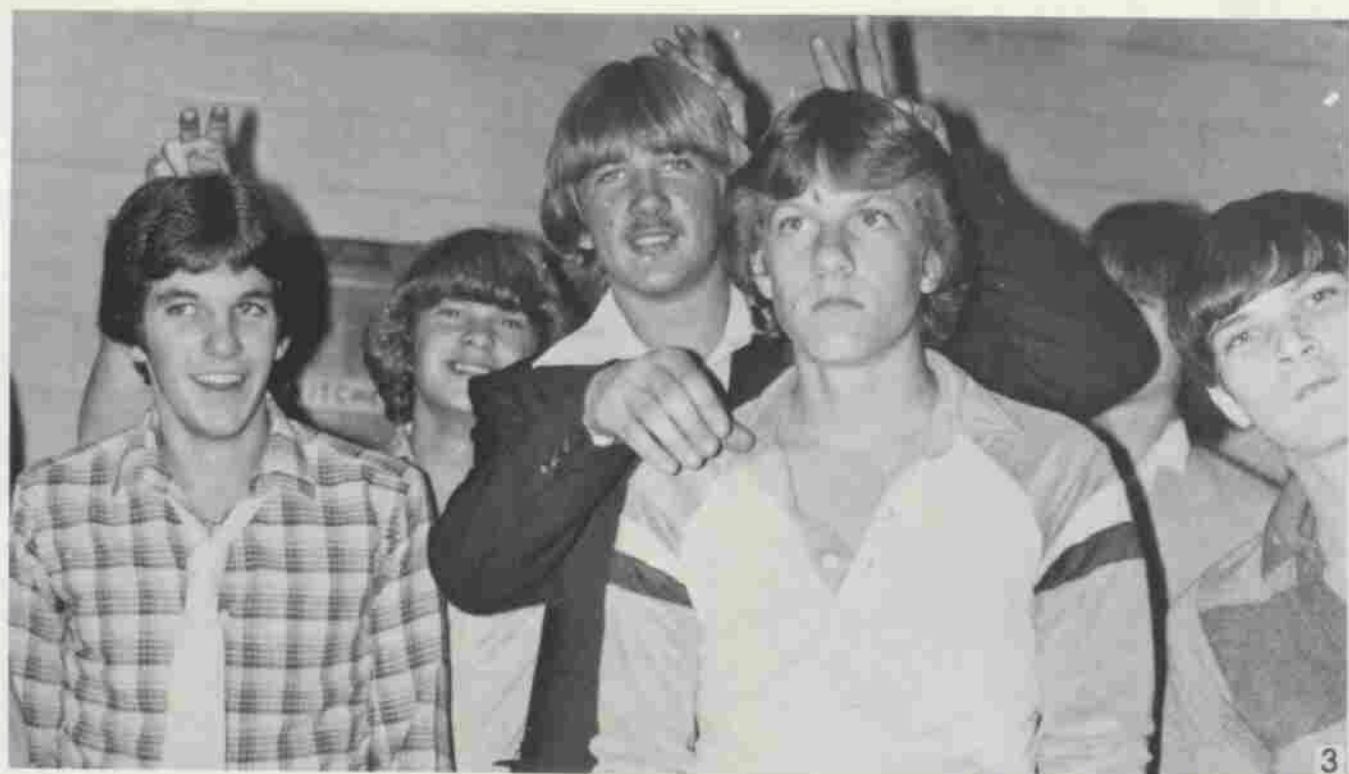

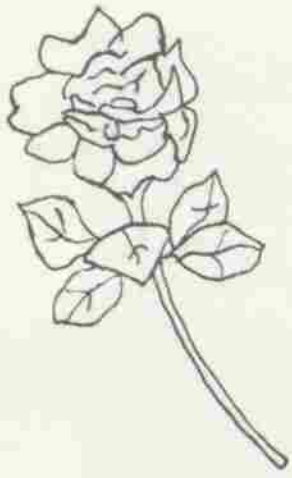
# Joan Lindauer is crowned 1981 Basketball Queen

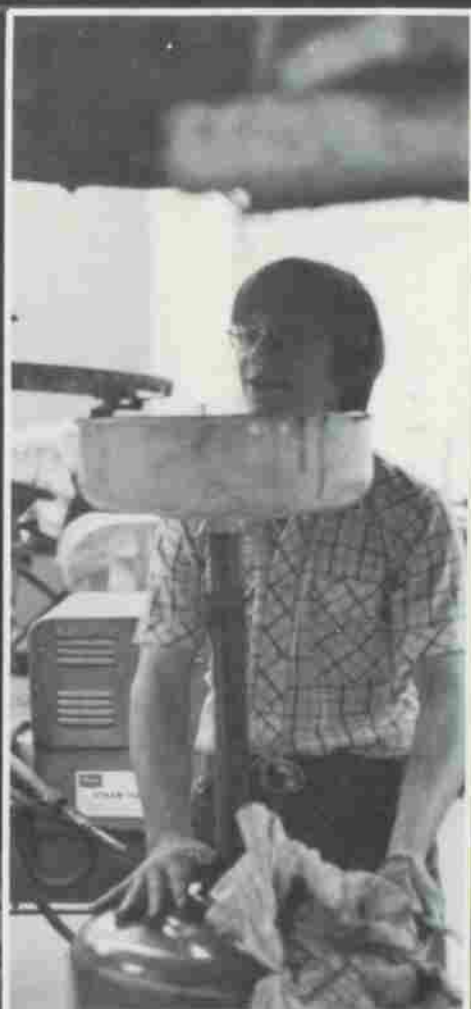

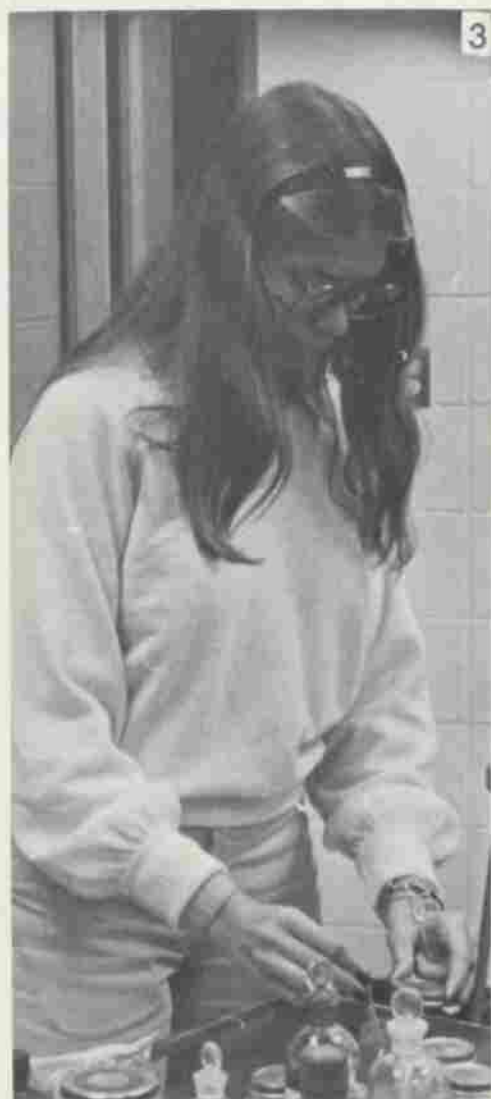


## *Math . . . a process of work*

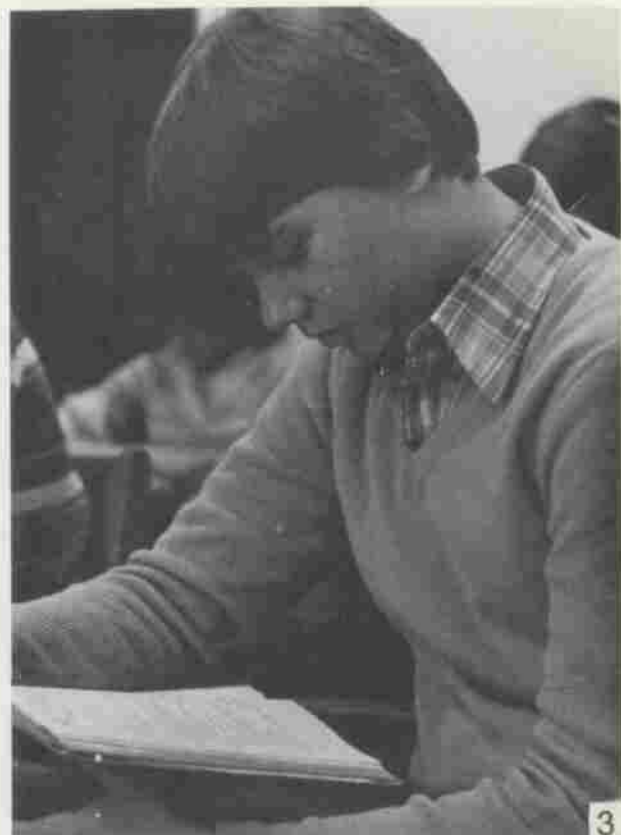




## *¿Hablo Englese?*

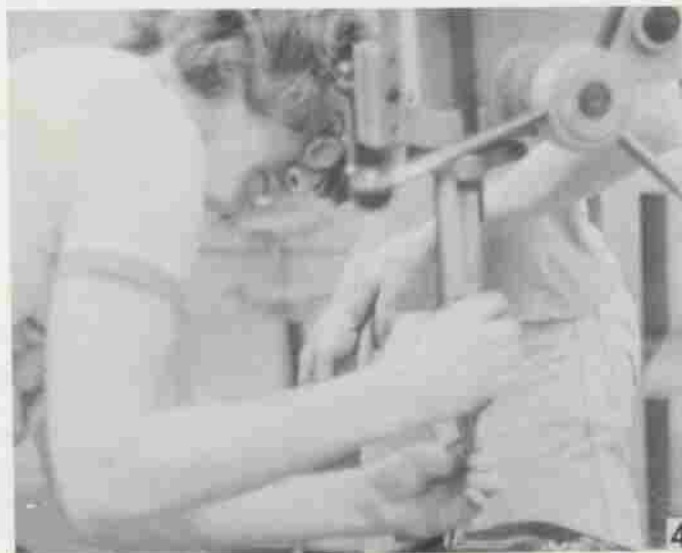


# Industrial arts. . . building for the future

*Rangers run on*



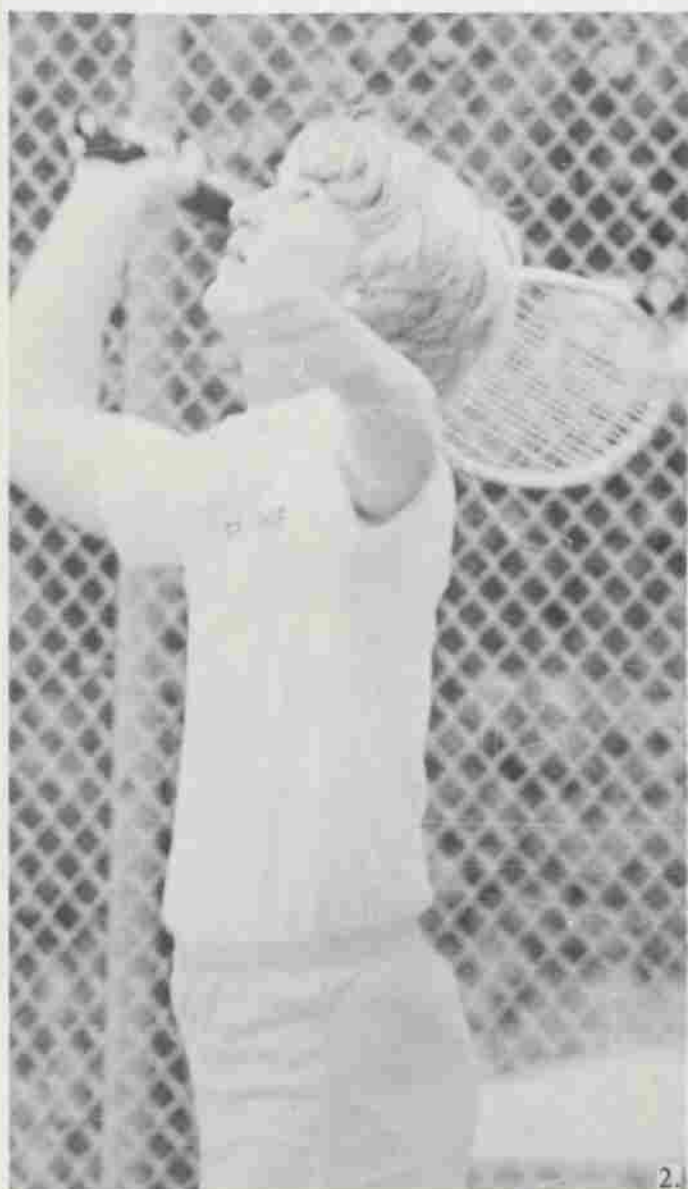

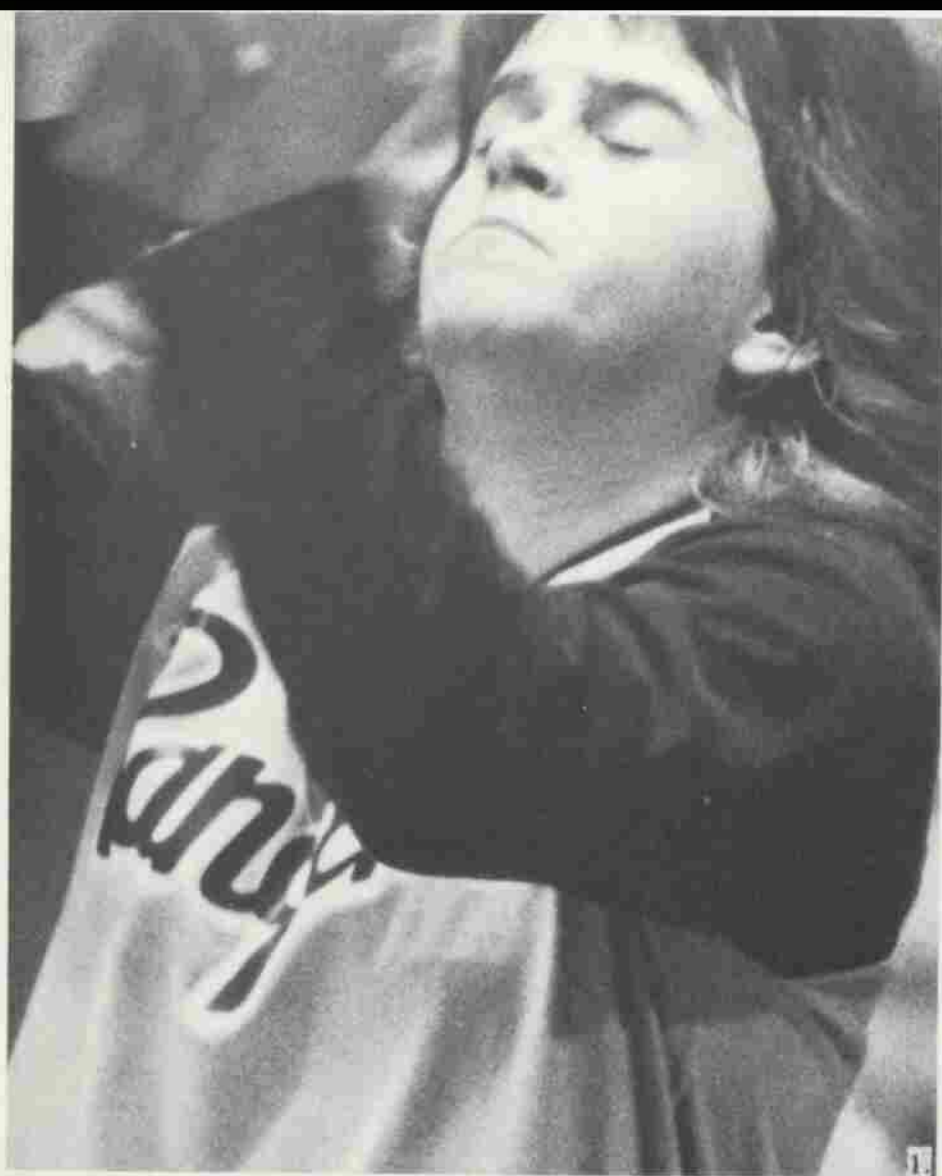

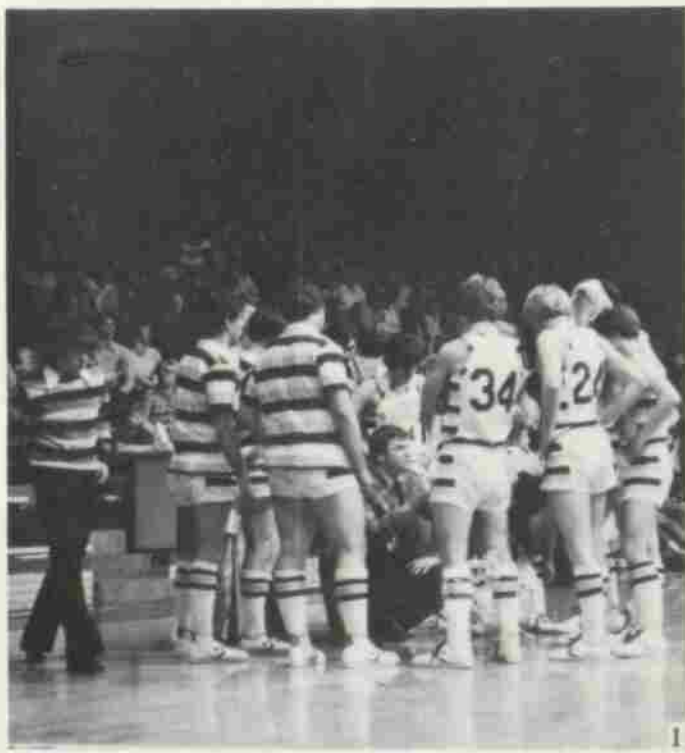


# Varsity enjoys successful season

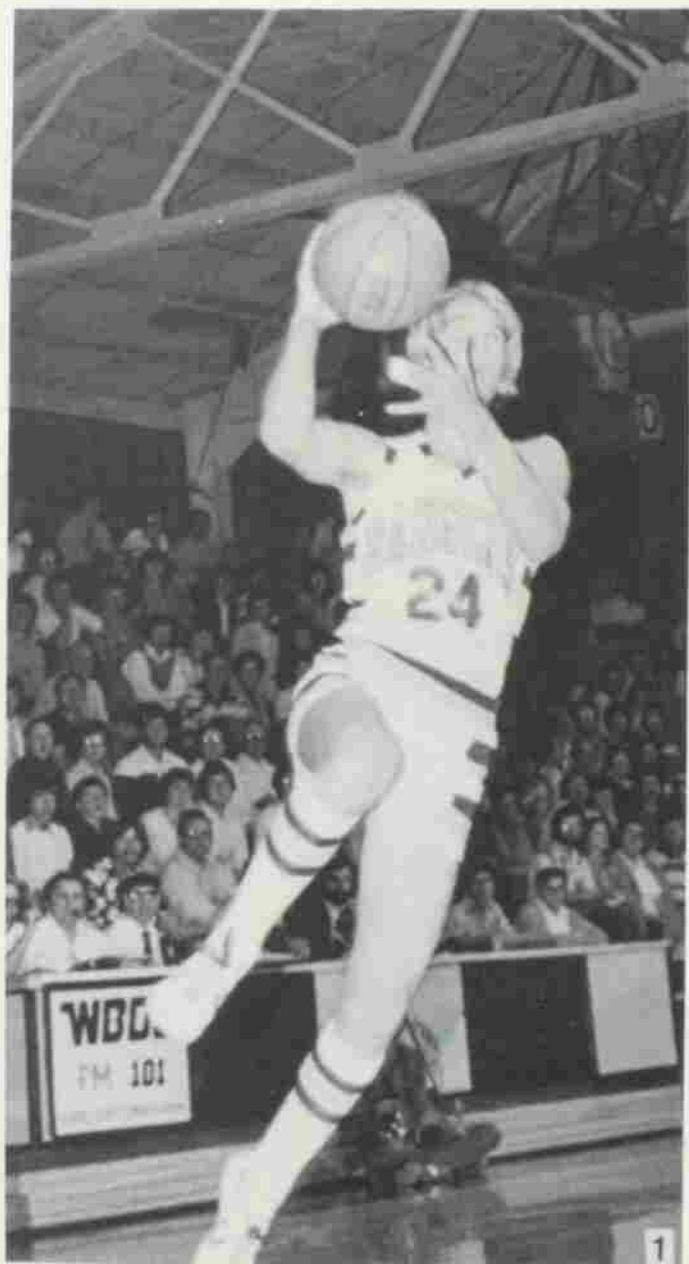

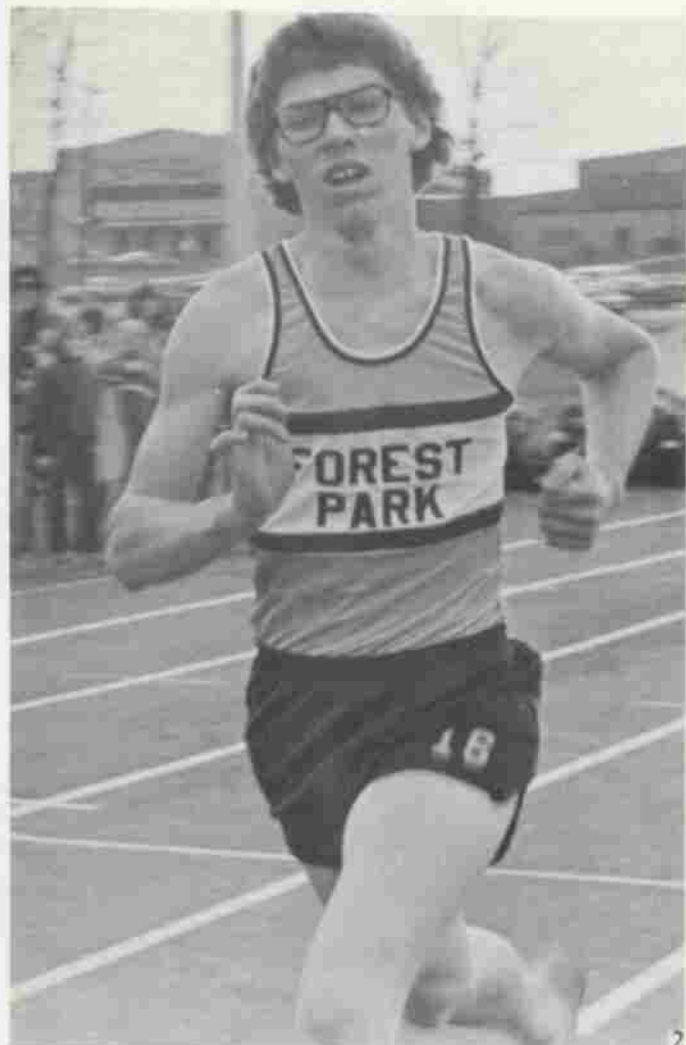
