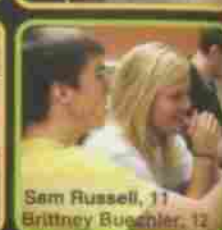

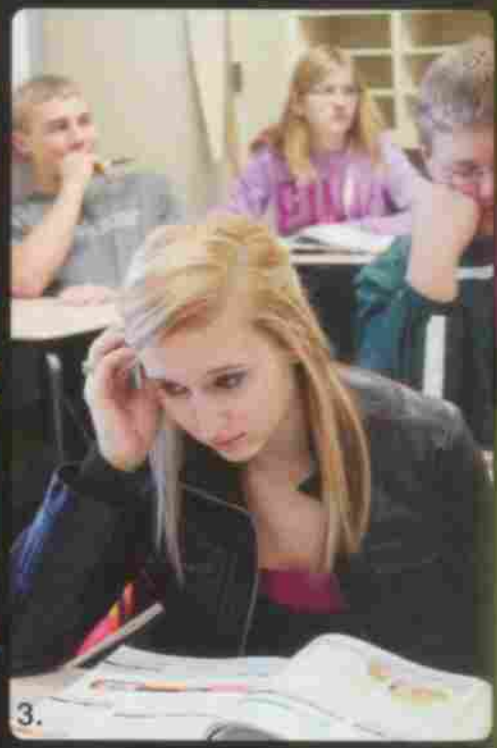

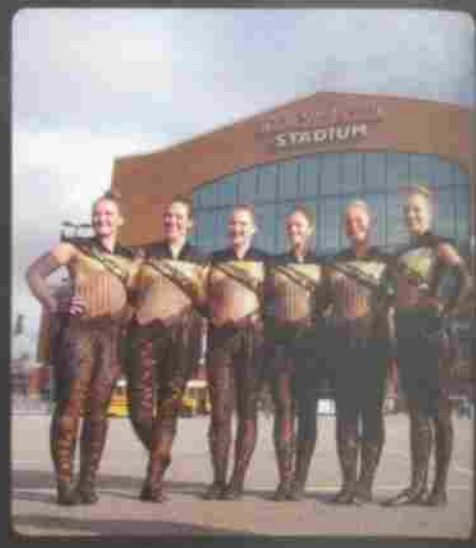
Colorguard

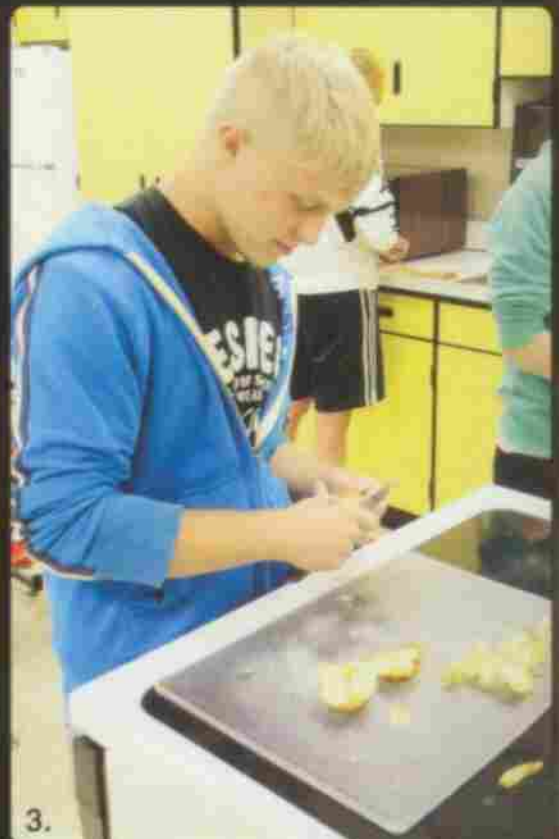

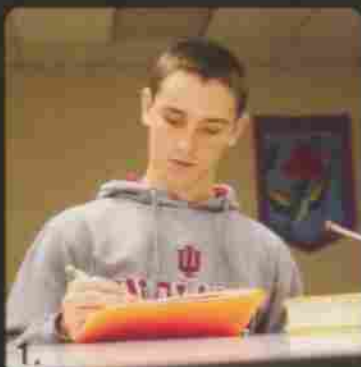

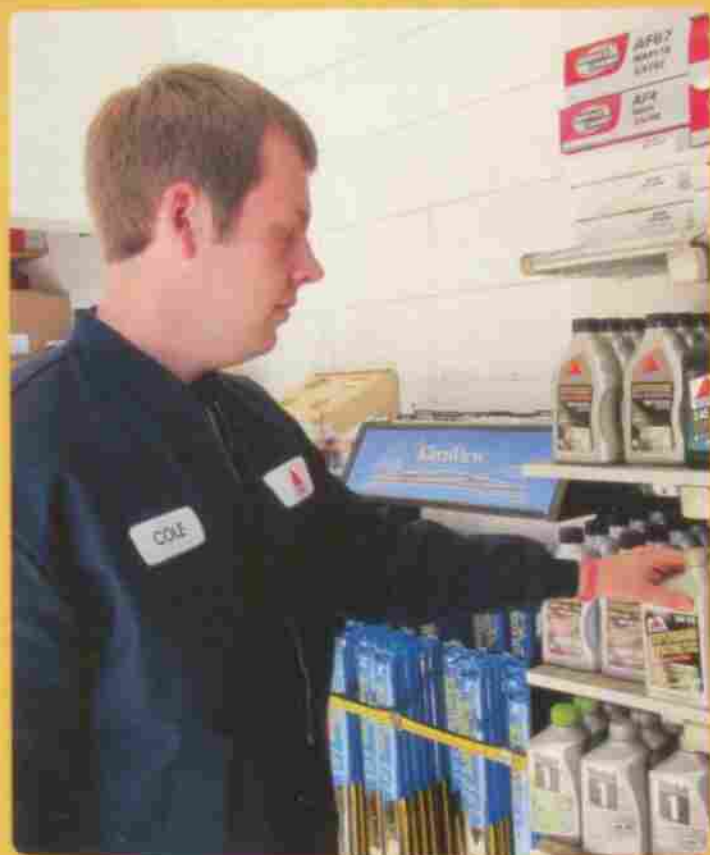

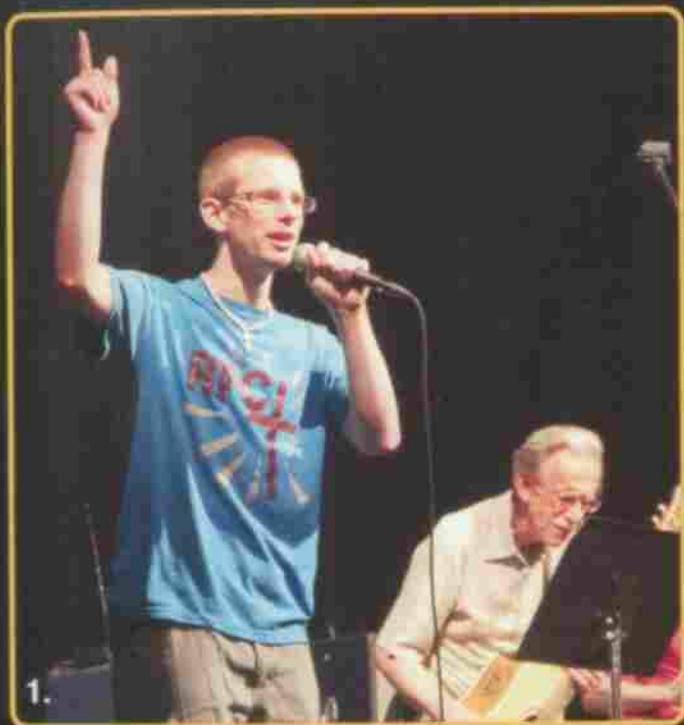

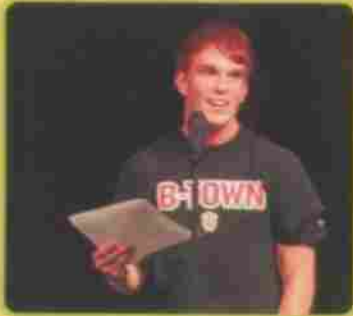

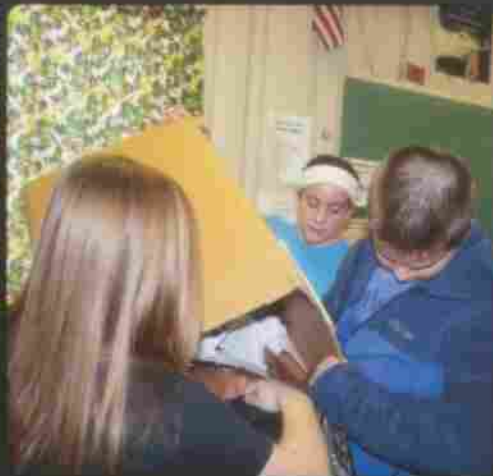

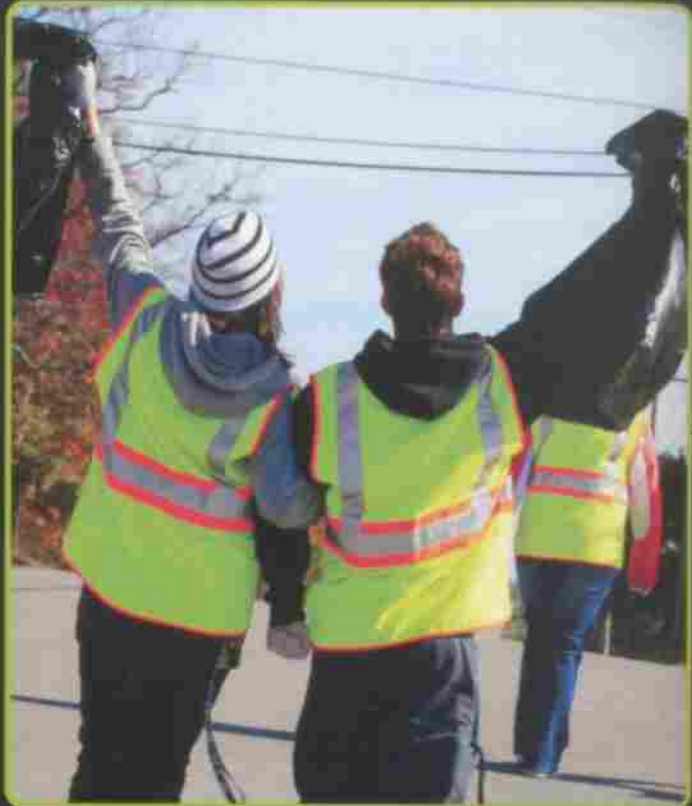

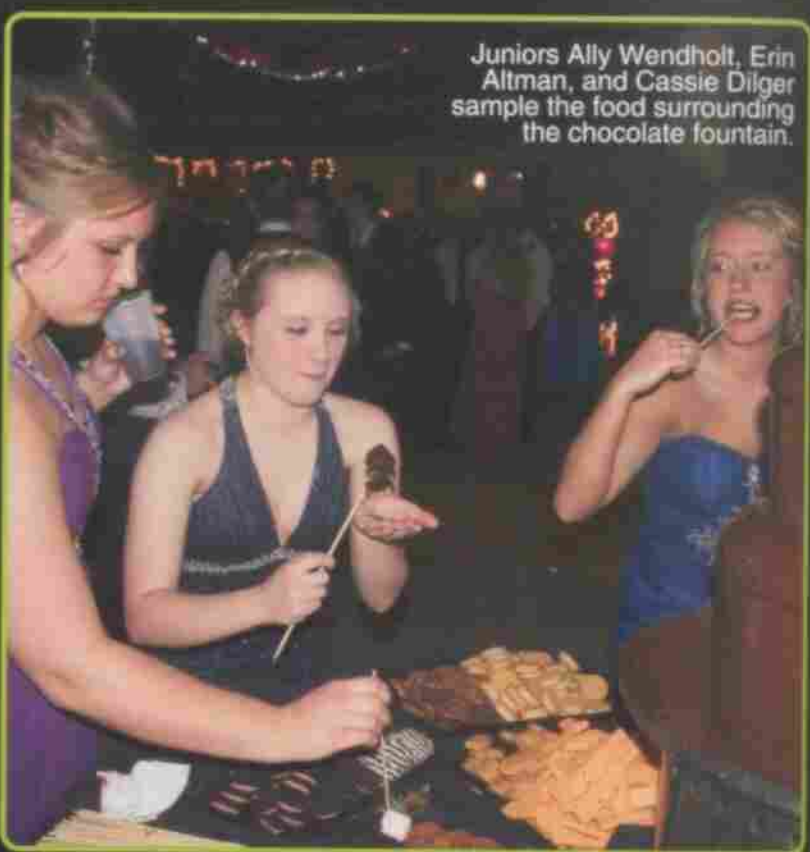

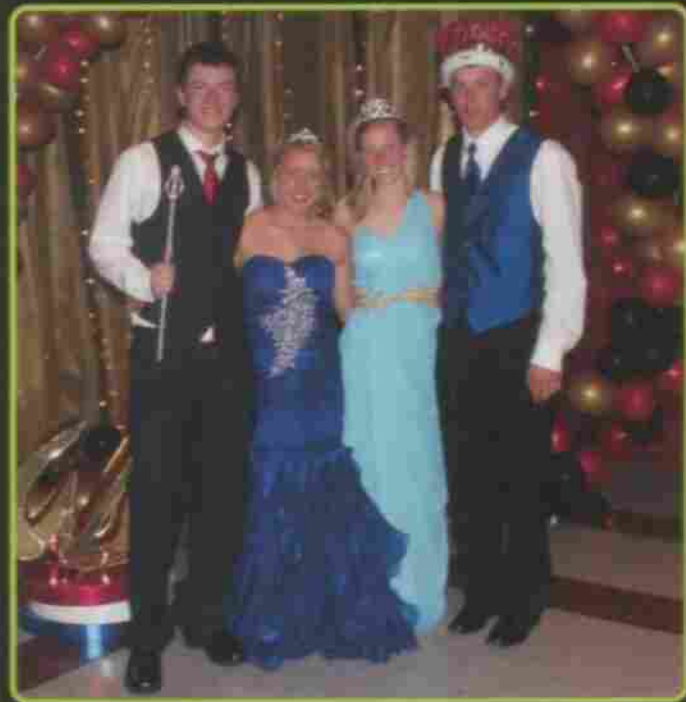

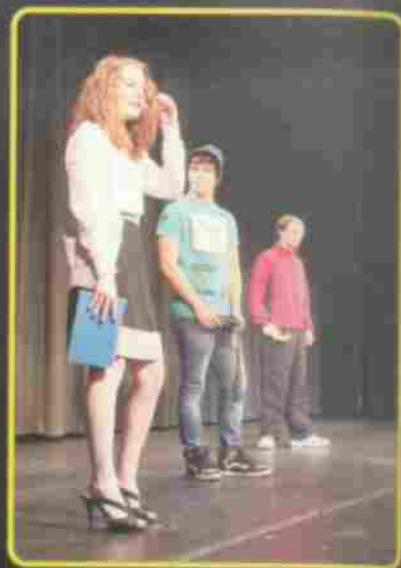

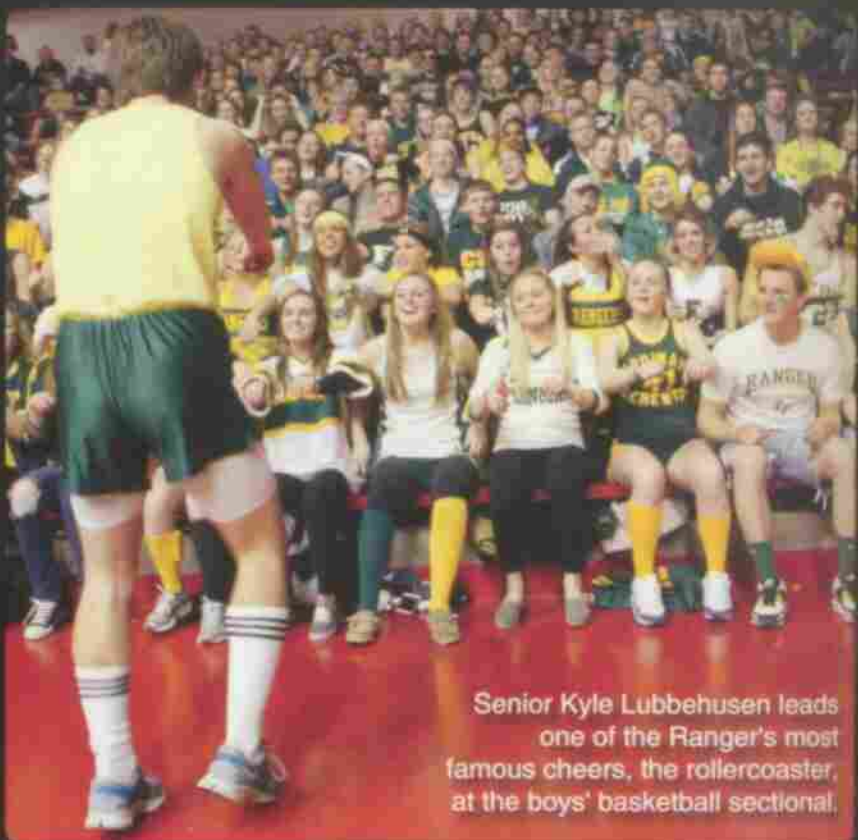

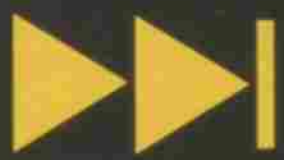

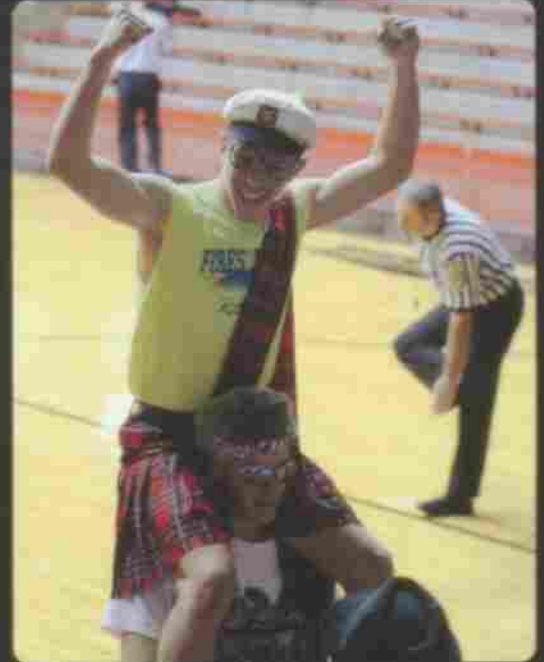

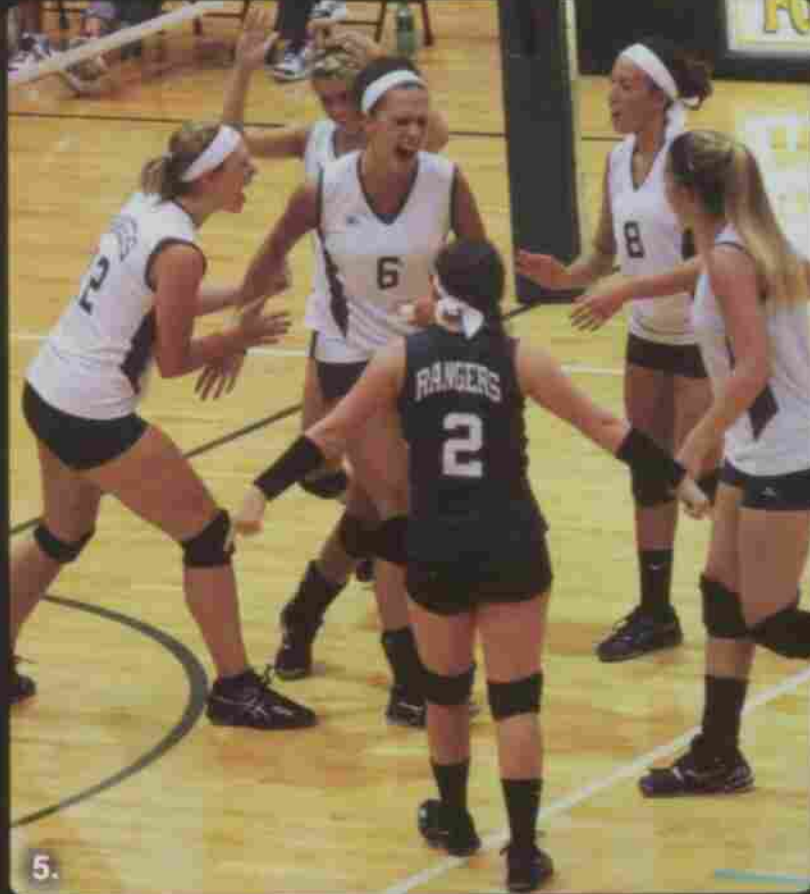

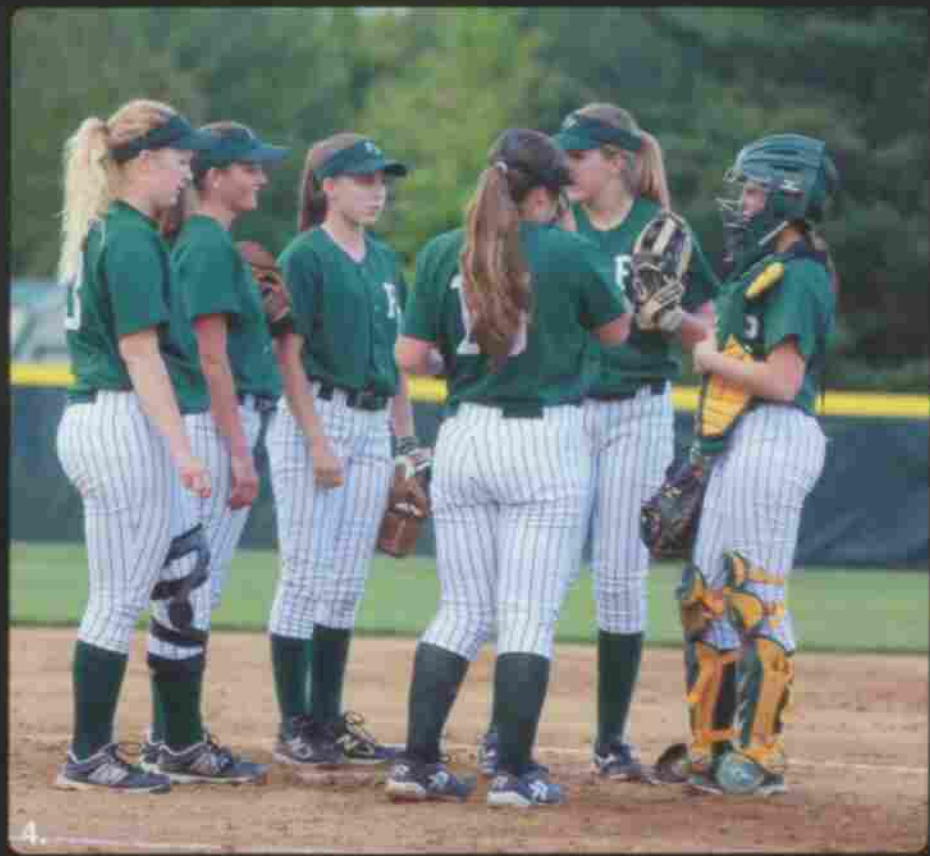

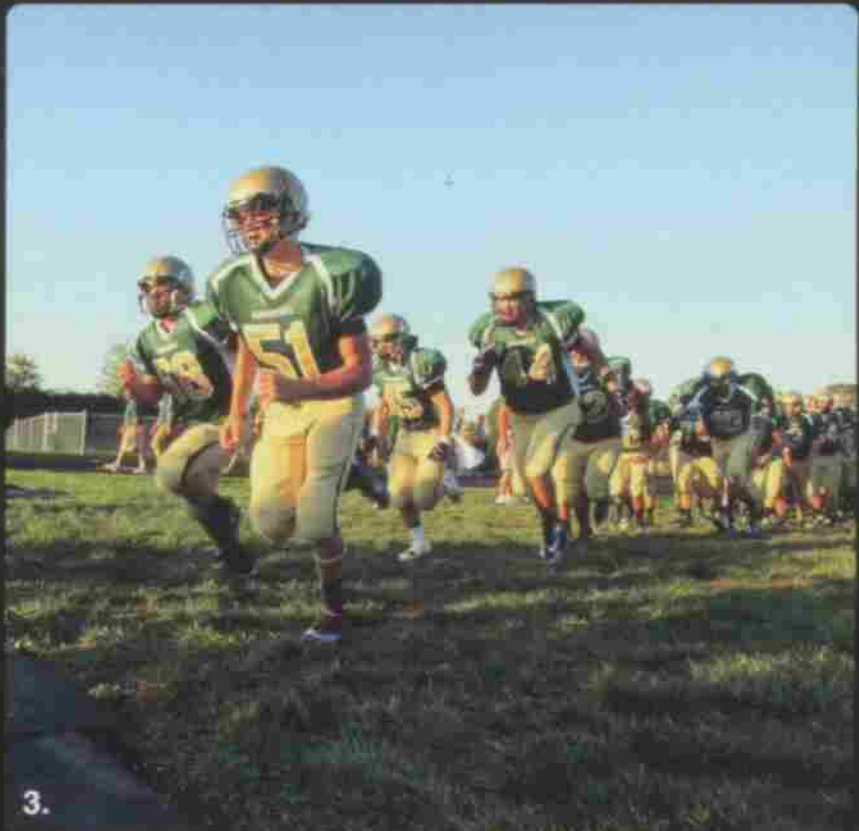

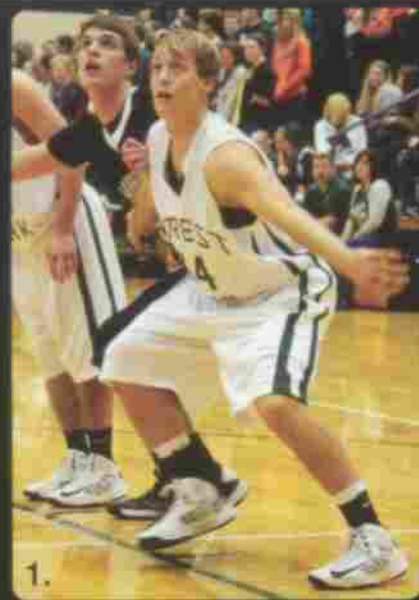


Boys' Basketball

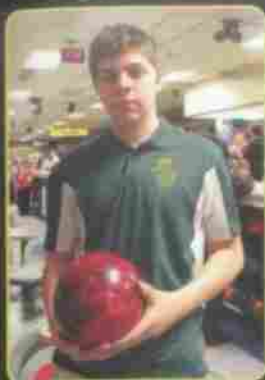

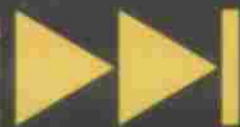

There was no shortage of gifted young men eager to run, jump, and throw. At each meet the boys showed just how conditioned and talented they really were. 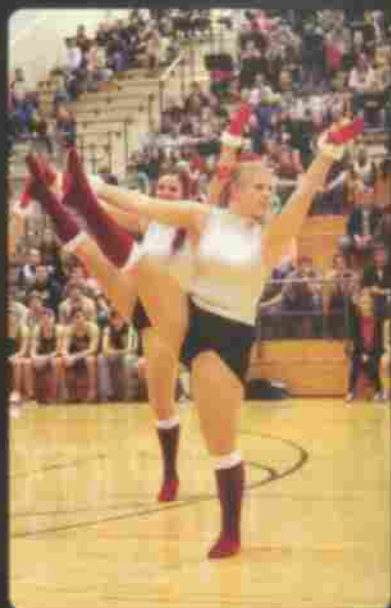
