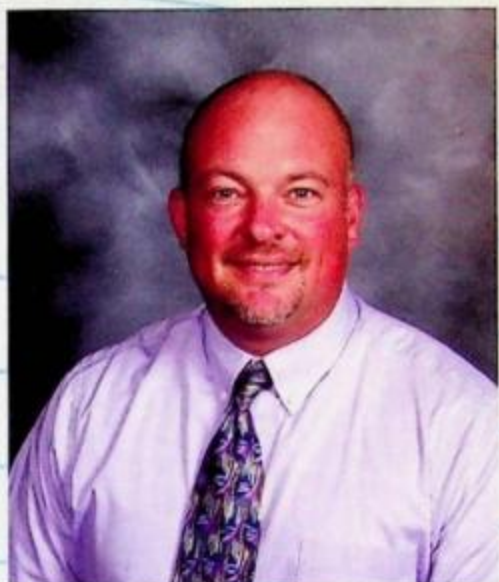

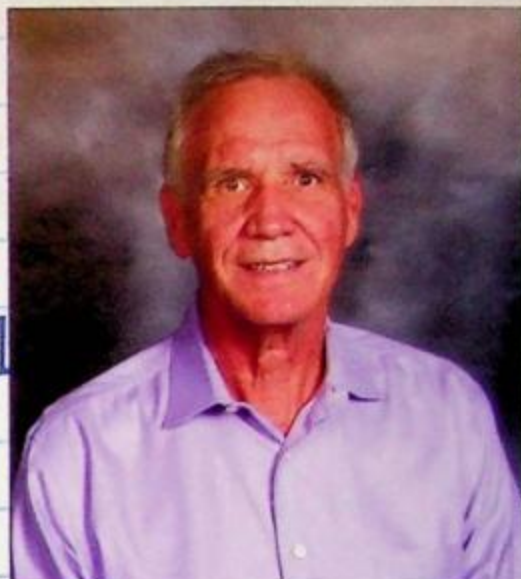


# Forest Park Alma Maters lead the way

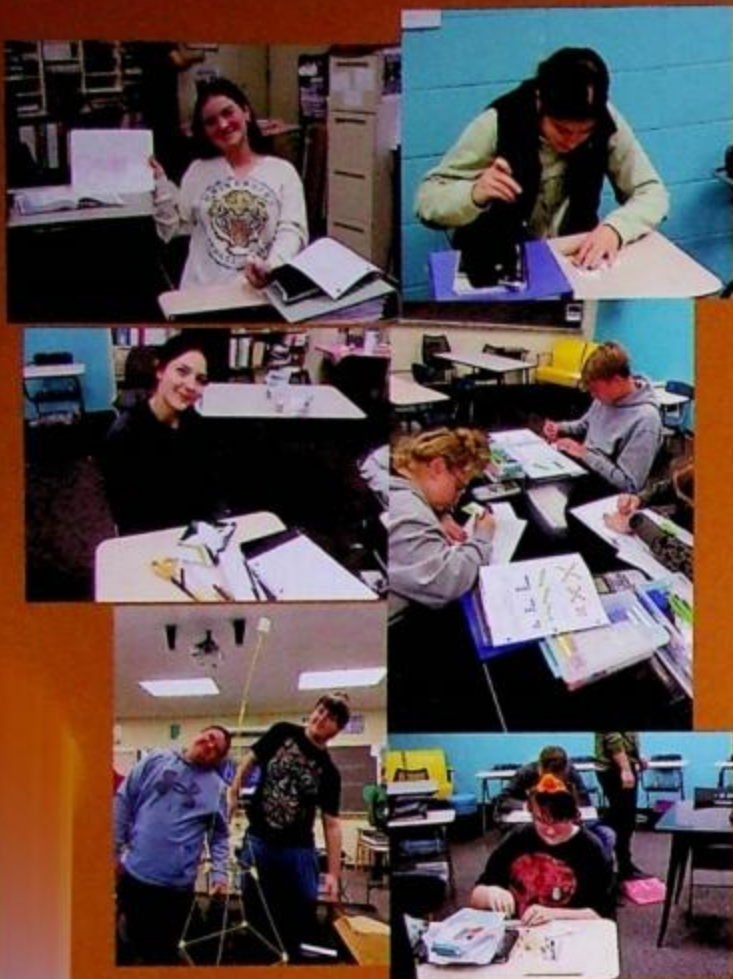
### Through Foreign Language

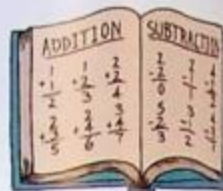

## Frame it up



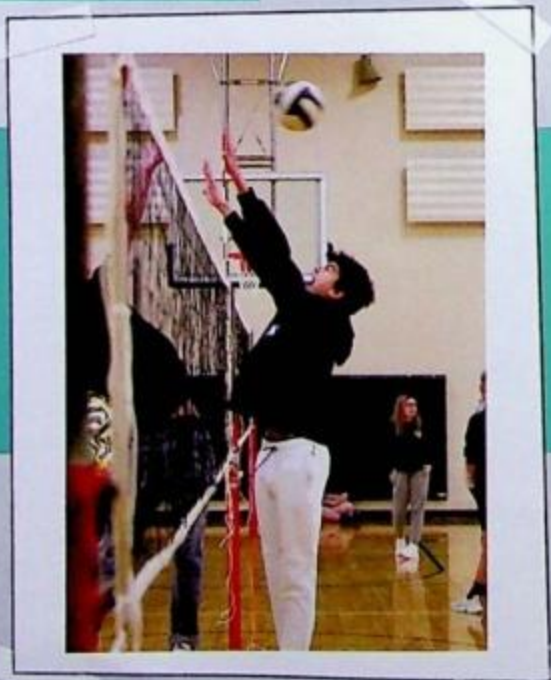

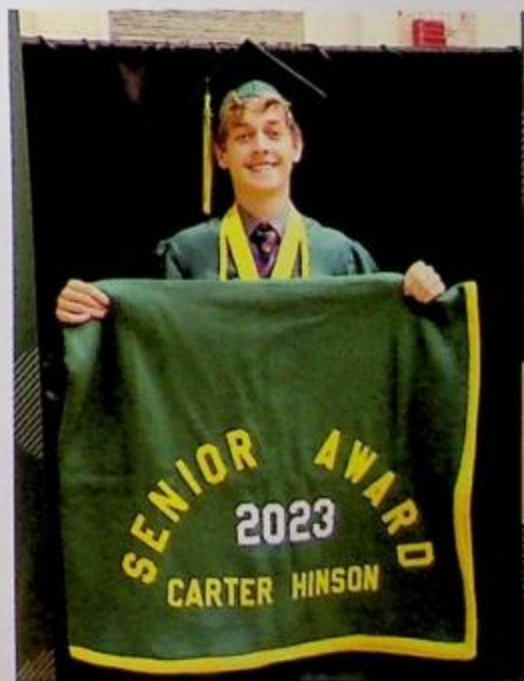
### Carley Begle
