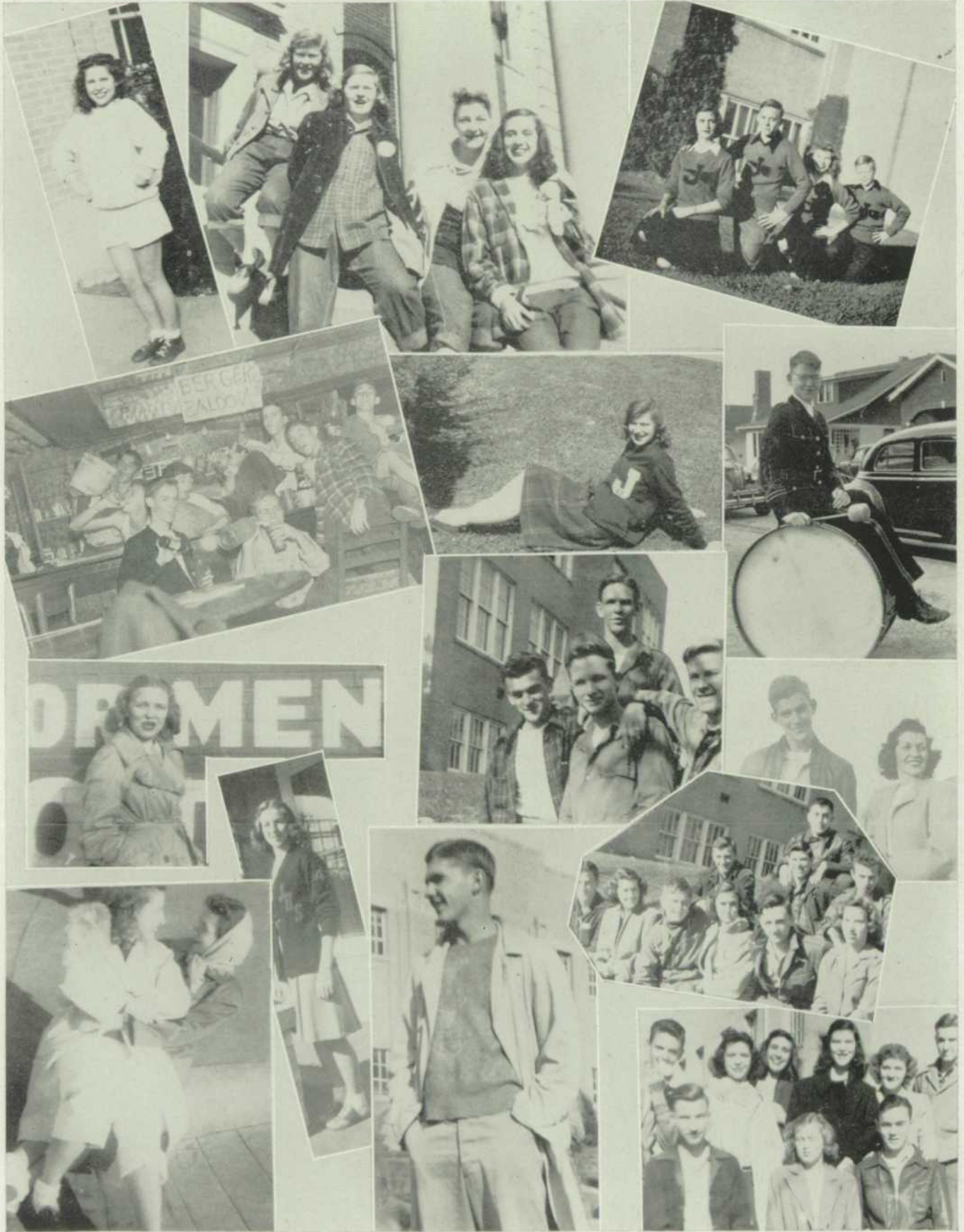
HAIL TO -
