

Jasper High School Band State Fair Champions 1954-1955



The Student Council is under the guidance of Mr. Joe Rowekamp.





Our State Champs

The Jasper High School Band, under the direction of Mr. Tom Bishop, was an outstanding example of the heights that can be reached by a group of high school students when they have the proper training, backing, and spirit.

In September at the State Fair in Indianapolis, they competed against 75 other marching units and were crowned the State Championship Band.

A few weeks after this outstanding accomplishment, the Band and Mr. Bishop received an invitation from the Indiana Society to represent Indiana in Washington D. C. 's annual Cherry Blossom Festival. Over five thousand dollars was raised to finance the 71 members who made the five day trip.

The Band during the course of the year, presented four football shows, five basketball shows, won first division in the district marching and playing contest, and made about three dozen civic appearances.









Cross Country Team Wins 5






