


BASEBALL CLUB


MADRIGALS










THESPIANS



The Félines posted a 22-3 record, won their first SIAC title since 1943-44, were crowned Sectional champs, and trounced Huntingburg thrice. The Wildcats took possession of the Evansville Courier Dope Bag by downing Princeton and then lost it at the end of the seasons when upset by Reitz.

The Wildcats broke the school scoring record of 87 points with a 94-61 victory over Memorial of Evansville. Jasper finished the season with a 70 point offensive average and held their opponents to





Bob Merder Wins Jasper Jaycees' Free Throw Award


Bobby Merder, who converted .775 per cent of his free throw attempts into points this year, received the Jasper Jaycees' annual Free Throw Award

Luegers Selected To Play For South



If selected, he would play in the Prep World Series that will be played in Sam Houston Coliseum, Houston, Texas on June 8 and 9. He would report for practice on June 4.






