







DEDICATION





The queen and her court enjoyed a 67-52 Wildcat victory over Memorial.













The hard-hitting defensive attack was led by Allen Schmitt, Bill Jahn, Rick Reynolds, Mike Seibert, and Jim Rees.




FOOTBALL






