




#### Administration




The administration is responsible for selecting the faculty, approving expenditures and buying all necessary equipment. Credit is also due them for the new school addition which is now under construction.



Members are continually striving to promote school spirit and assure the student body of an exciting


school year.


Work on the annual is done entirely by the staff and their advisor, Mr. Tom Renneisen. They unselfishly give up their free time to insure the success of the publication.






#### Band

The purpose of this organization is to give the students an opportunity to increase their appreciation and skill in the musical field.






## Bklahoma!



A bouffet type supper was then served on a table decorated with silver candlabra and Doman flower arrangements.


