






HOMECOMING DISPLAYS



Hors d'oeuvres and Hawaiian punch, along with the music of "Hard Times", added to the restlessness of the natives.


















UNDERCLASSMEN

The band sold magazines and fruit during the year to finance its wide variety of activities, thus making it another successful year for the Marching Cats.















Hello! We're Kimball International, Inc. Although most people refer to us simply as "Kimball," around Jasper we're also known by other names . . . such as The Jasper Corporation, Jasper Stylemasters, Electronics, the Cabinet Division, Stylemasters Plastic and Stylemasters Upholstery.

This is probably a bit confusing at times, especially to you young people who weren't around when the company was developing. So the purpose of this message is to explain what these names mean, and also to

tell you a few other things about us.

Let's begin with the name Kimball International. This refers to our "parent company." It owns and operates a number of other companies and divisions that are engaged in various forms of manufacturing and services.

Kimball International is a new name. Our parent company was called The Jasper Corporation for almost 25 years until the name was changed to Kimball International in 1974. The change was made so we would be more closely identified with our principal products--Kimball pianos and organs and Kimball home and office furniture.

Here in Jasper, one of our divisions is still called The Jasper Corporation. This plant also is known as the Cabinet Division because it manufactures television and stereo cabinets. In addition, it makes Kimball

piano and organ cases and home furniture.

All Kimball electronic organs are produced in Jasper by the Kimball Electronic Division. This is the plant people are referring to when they say "Electronics."

Another of our divisions is Jasper Stylemasters. In its main plant, Stylemasters manufactures cases for Kimball pianos and organs, cabinets and plywood. Jasper Stylemasters has its own divisions.
