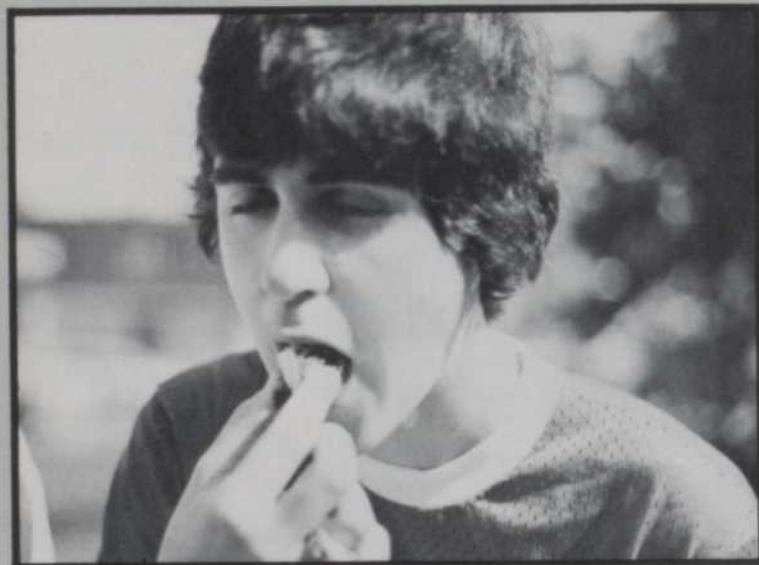
ROGERIO MENESCAL

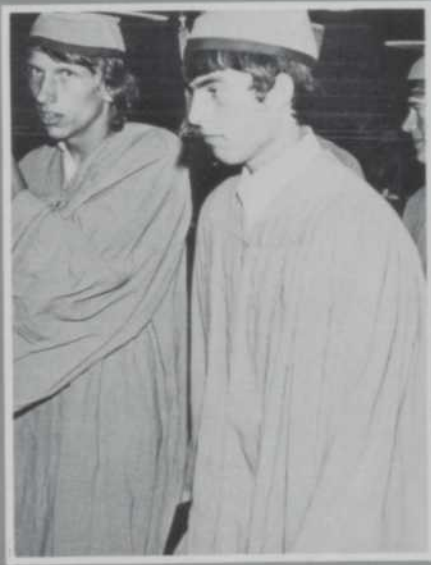




Our high school days have ended, and the time has come for us to venture onward. We've made our contributions to Jasper High School and have received much in return.

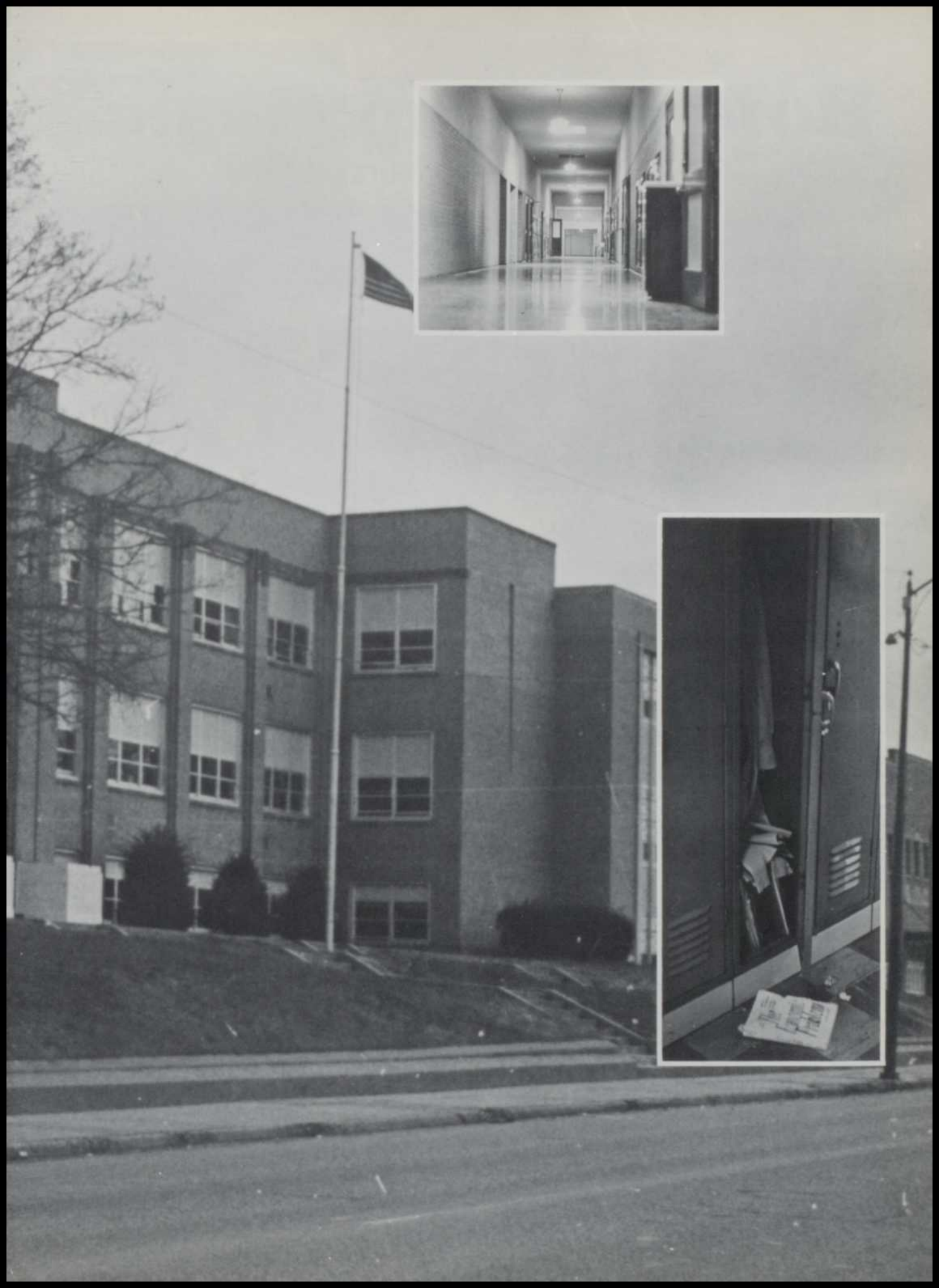
The future holds many unanswered questions, but wherever we go and whatever we do, we will always cherish the memories of these four years.
