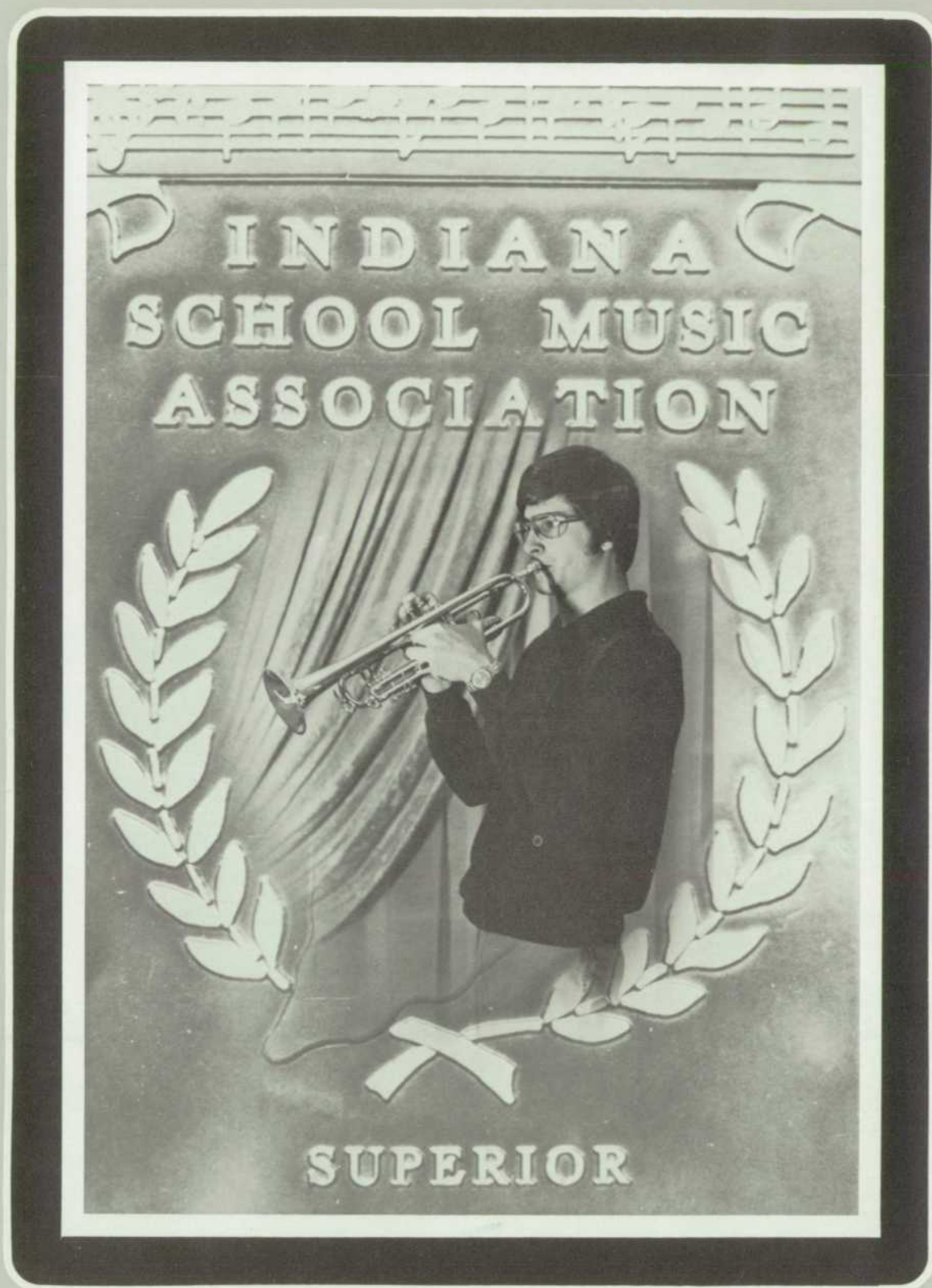
Now that we have finished the year at our new school, the attitudes have changed quite a bit. The student body has come to appreciate and enjoy the advanced facilities of our school.

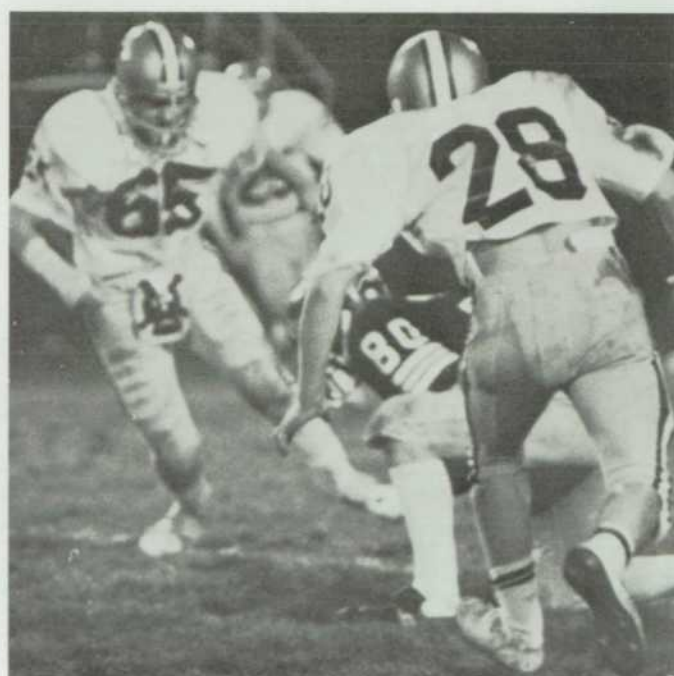
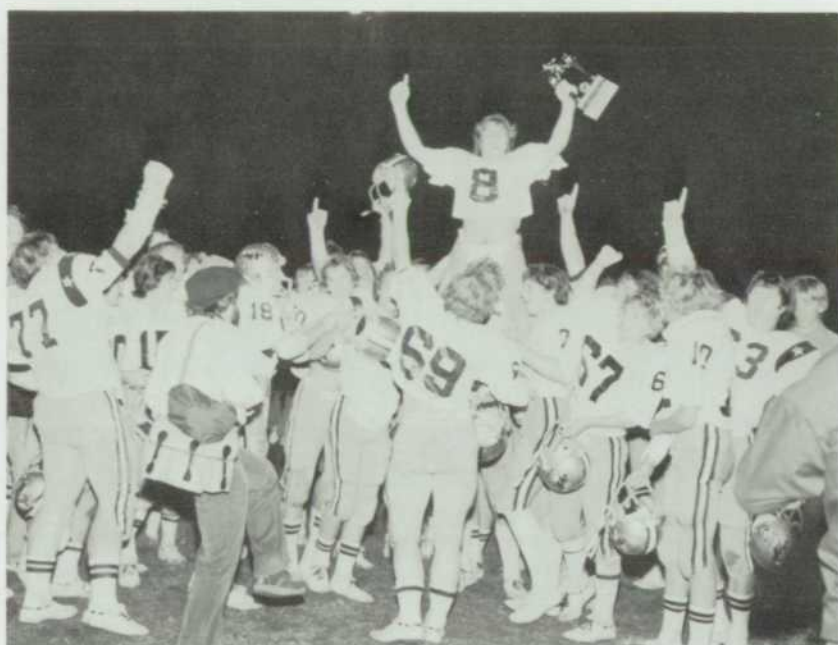
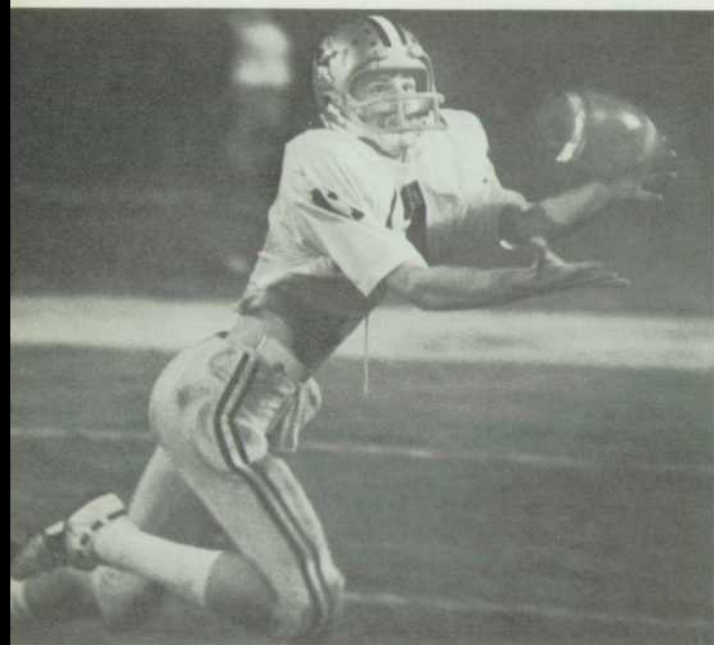


JASPER vs. CLARKSVILLE

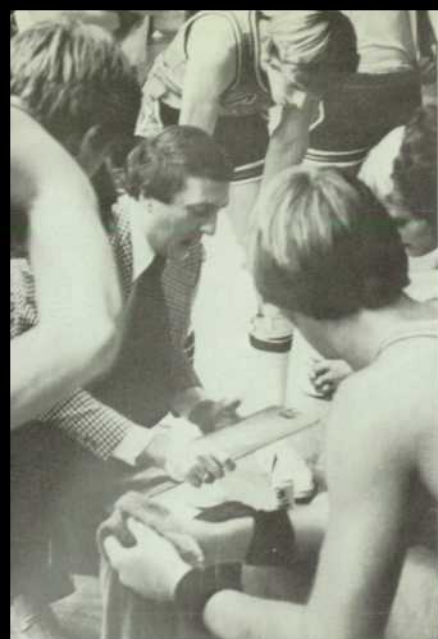
Three year regular Mark Block was named to the 1977-78 All-SIAC team. "Goose" scored a career total of 1033 points, fifth highest in JHS history.

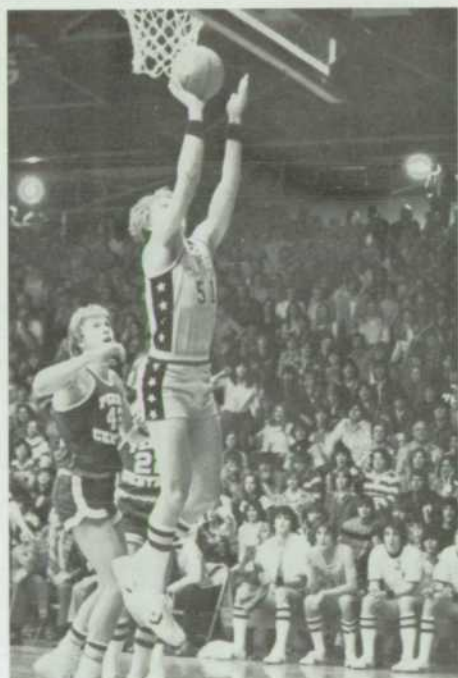
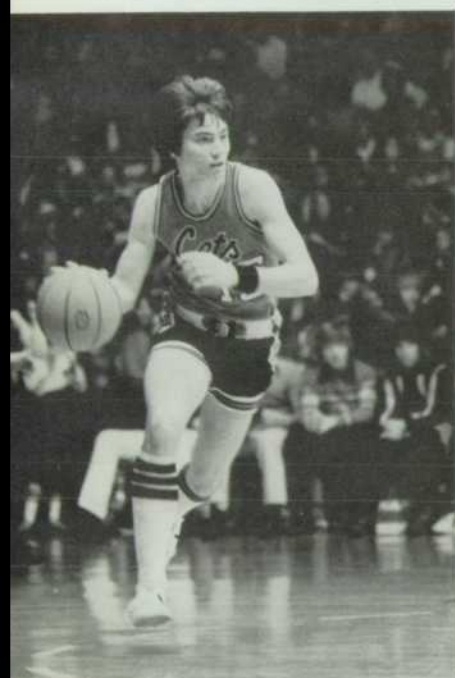
