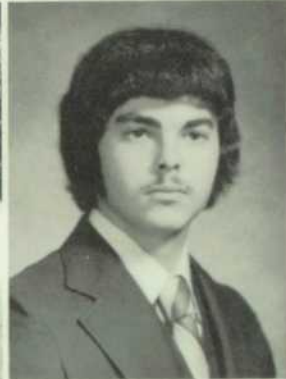


# SENIORS 1981

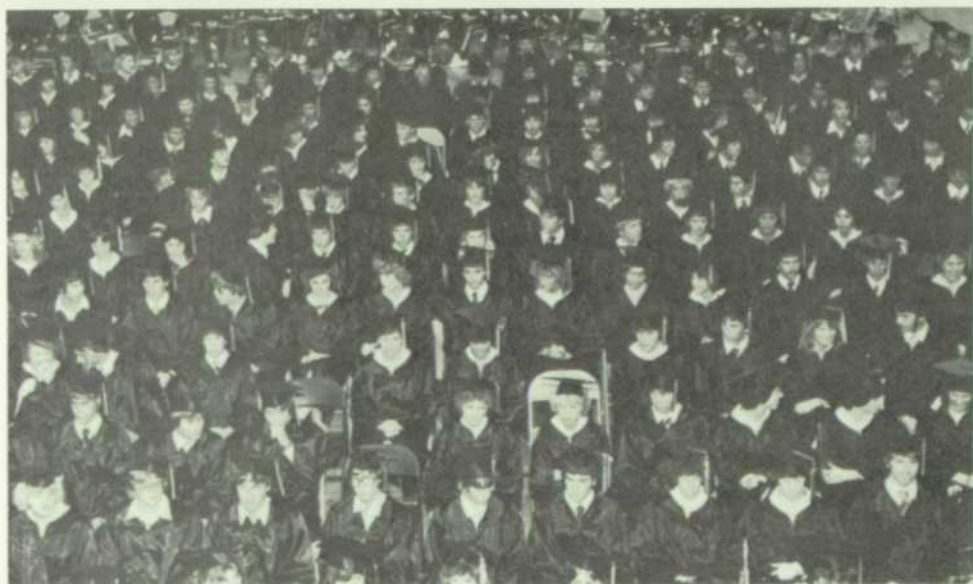
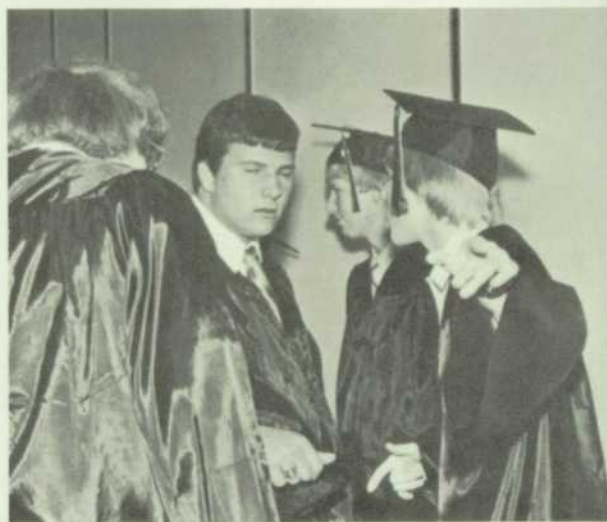
# GRADUATION '81

With the job he's done in his years at Jasper, few would dispute that Howard, too, deserving of a shot at a state title.

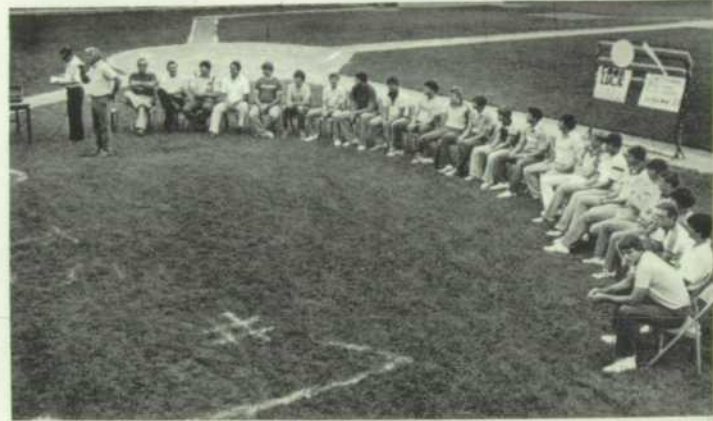
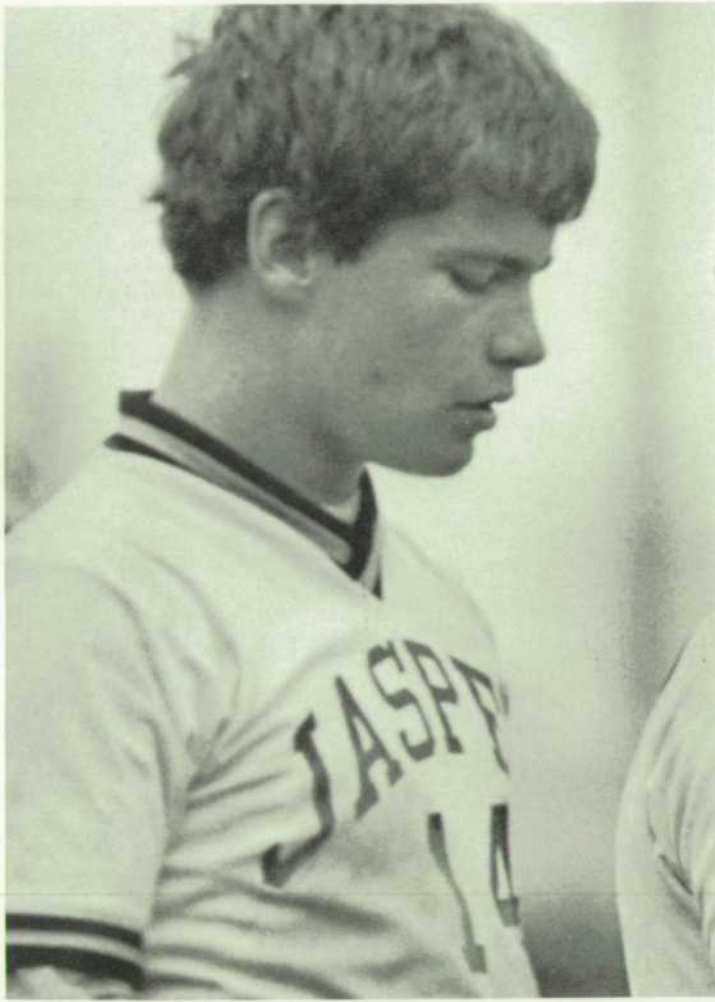
"I felt all along when I came down here, the circumstances were such that the Lord helped me," Howard said, explaining coaching position had been vacated for two months before he accepted and was accepted.

"Everything just fell into place just like it was supposed to be."

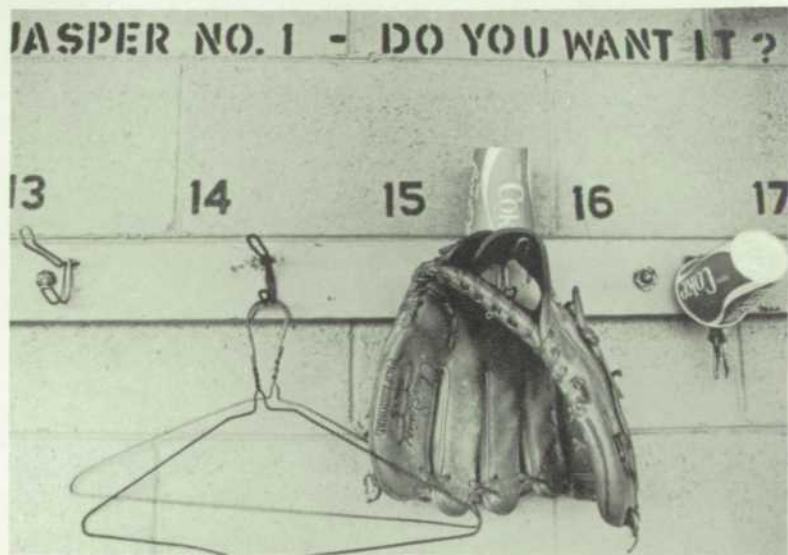
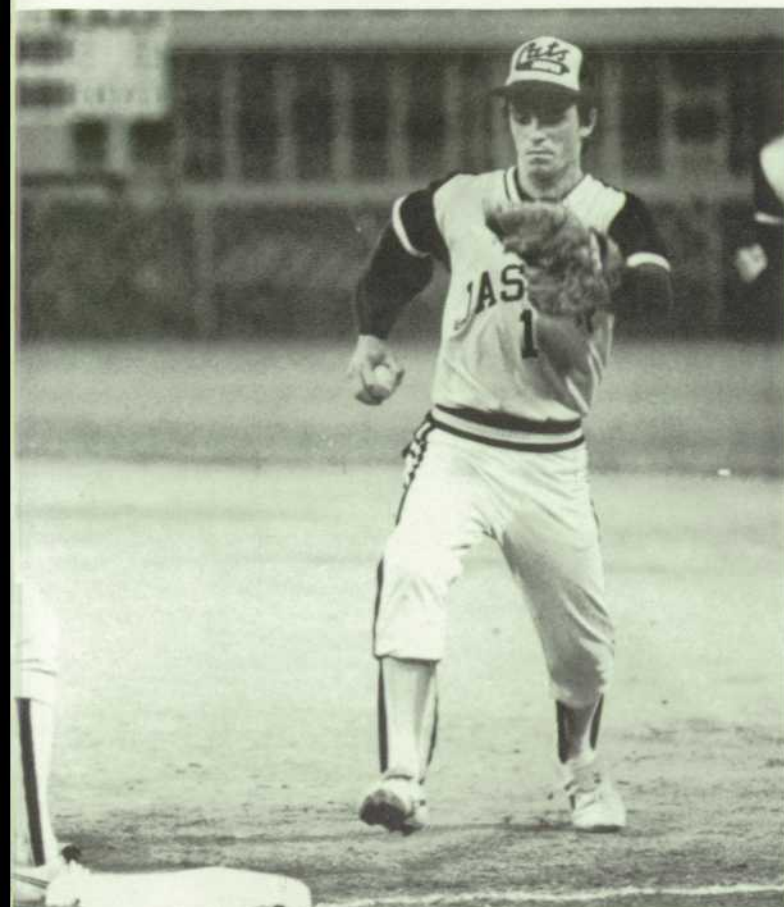




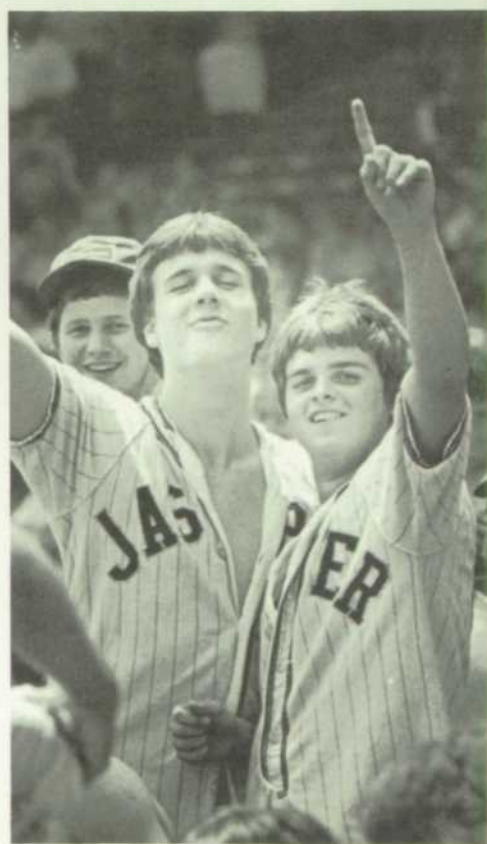
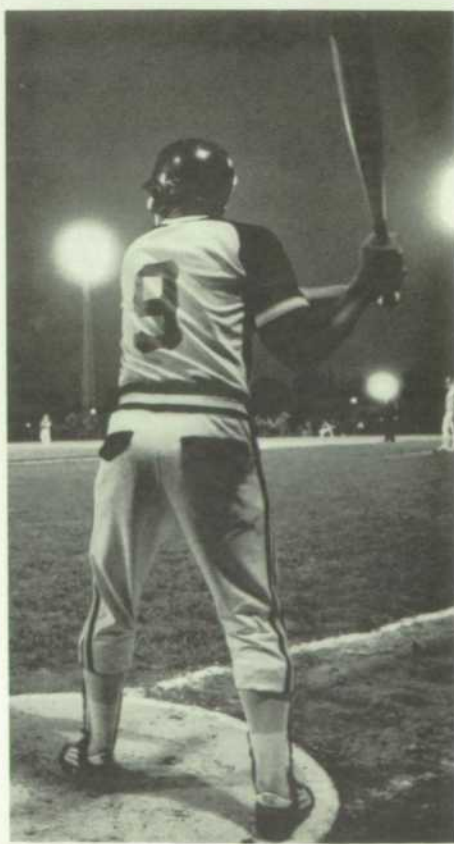
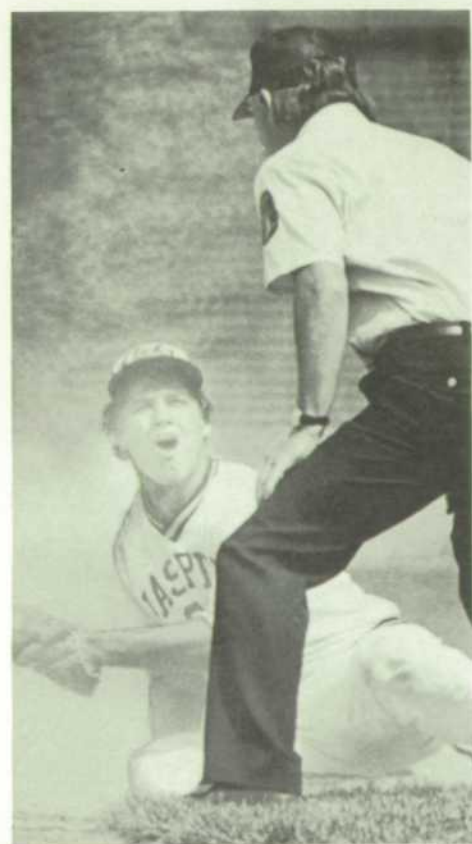
