
## **GRADUATION '81**

Thanks to the hard work and cooperation of the various clubs, the annual Christmas Dance was once again a huge success.





The members enjoy projects such as the following: a weekend trip to St. Louis, Jayteen banquet, canoe trip, and various sports activities.


