No one knows what the future holds for us, but no matter what we do or how separated we become, we will always carry with us many fond memories of JHS.

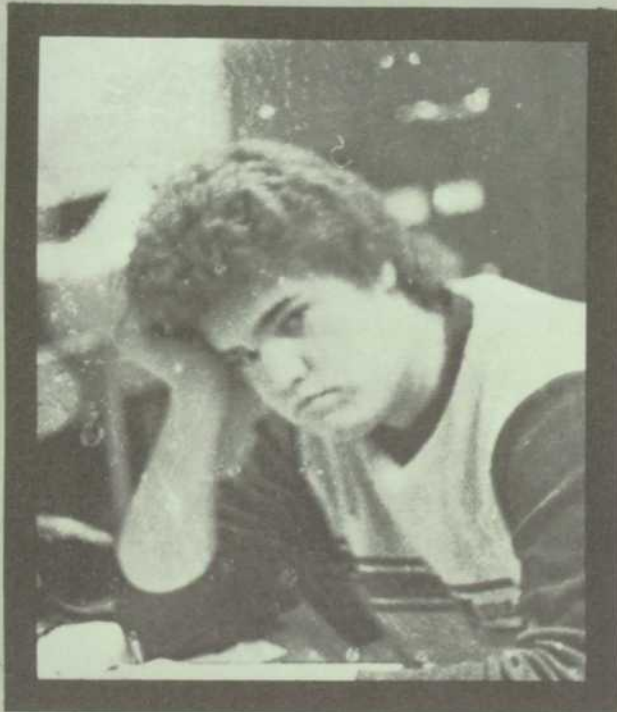

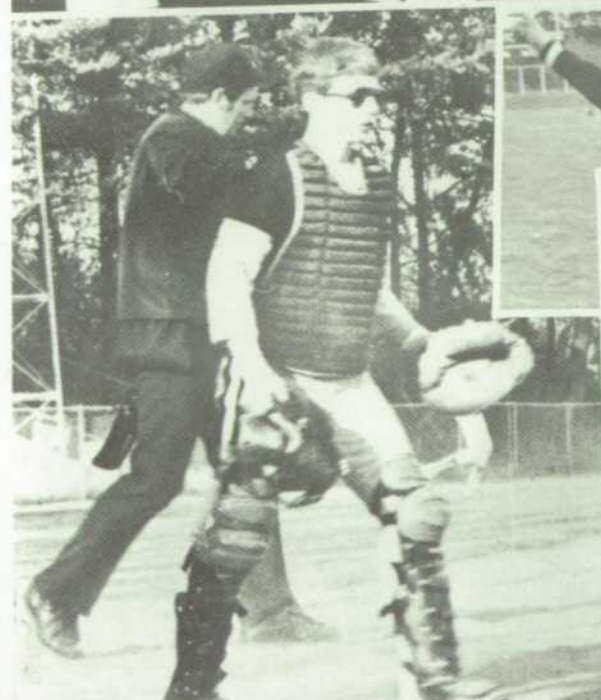

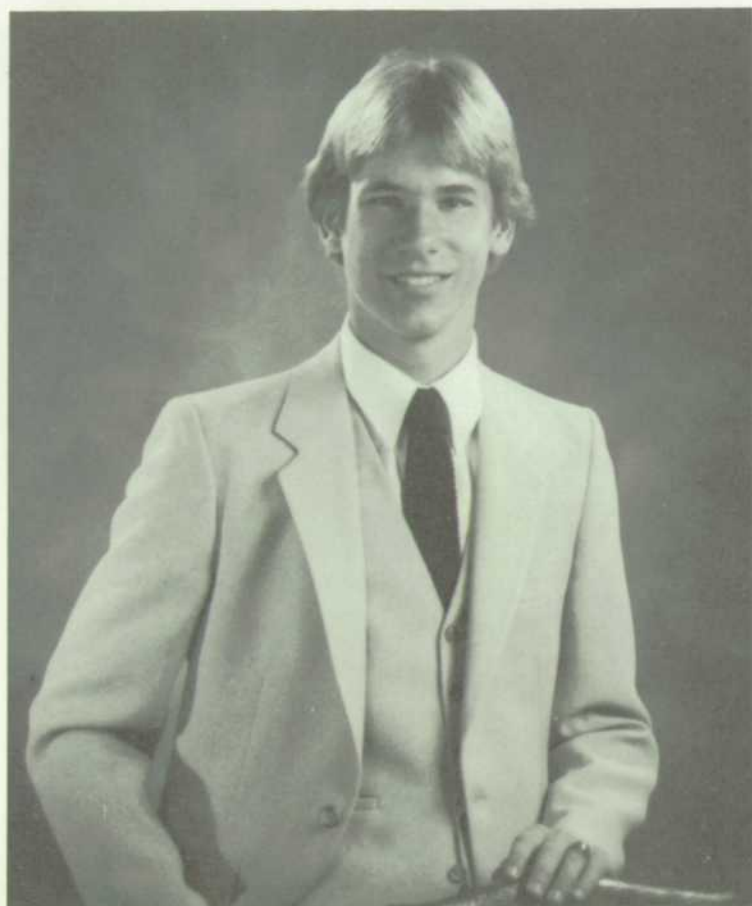
## Optimists

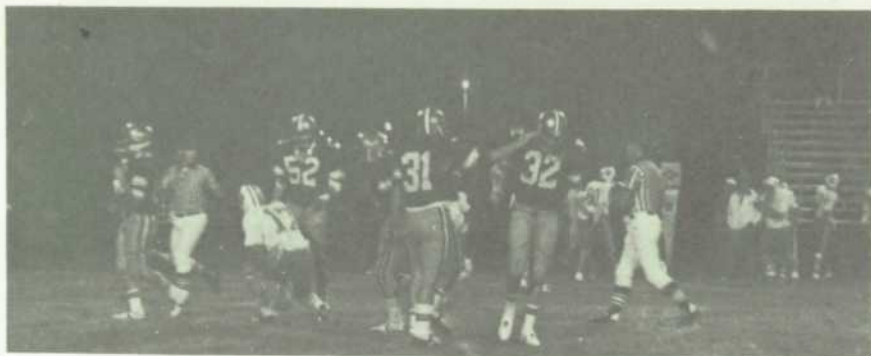
Another great Wildcat play
