
As the years at Jasper High School draw to a close, seniors begin a new stage of their lives. But all the memories especially of senior or "Party" year will stay with them forever.








































# MAURY AND BRENDA CROWNED



# PROM: "MY LOVE"






#### Freshman Display—"Wildcat Showdown"







### GERMAN CLUB














