No matter what, passing periods are a time to let go of the pressure of studies and show your wild side!





According to Mr. Jessee and Mrs. Lechner, between 60 and 70 percent of the student body have at least some kind of after school job.
















# Sophomores My Monday Morning Blues . . .






























Boys' Tennis






#### Discovering Artistic Creations Art Club




























