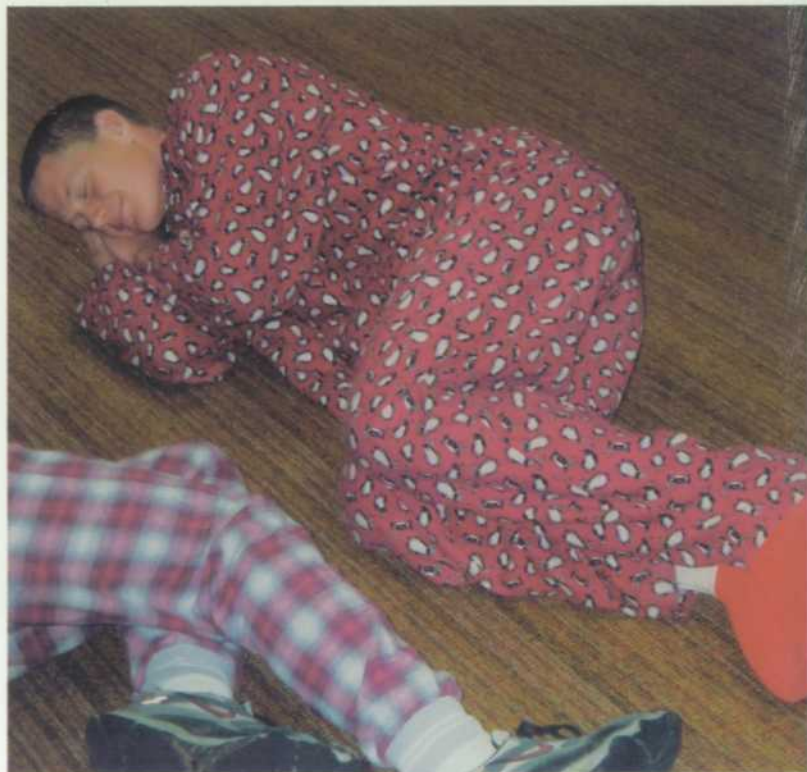

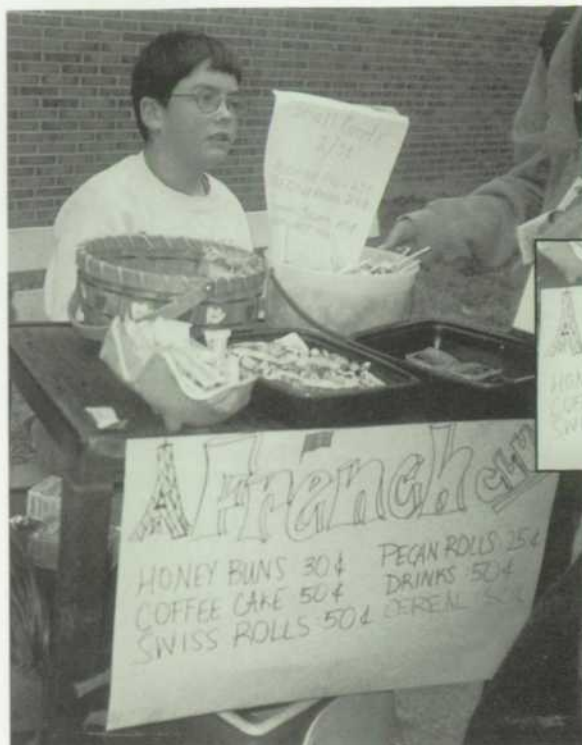

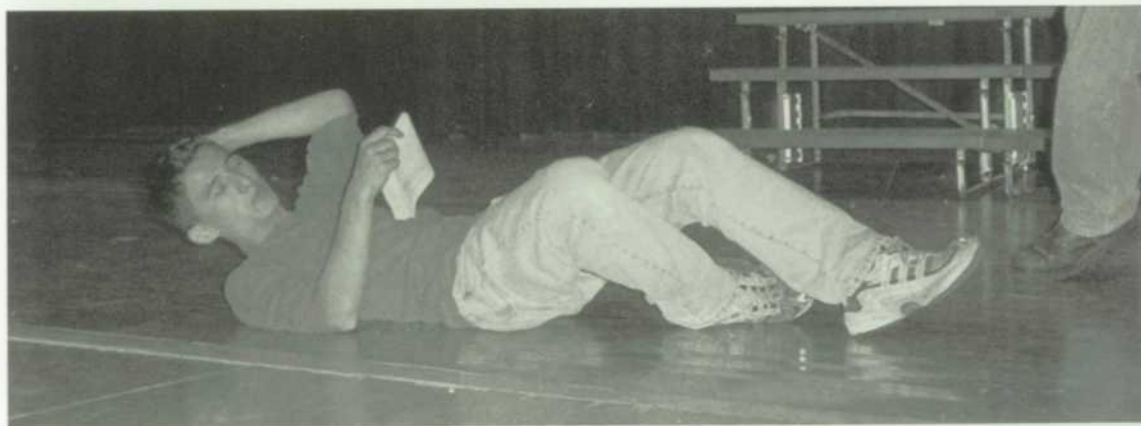

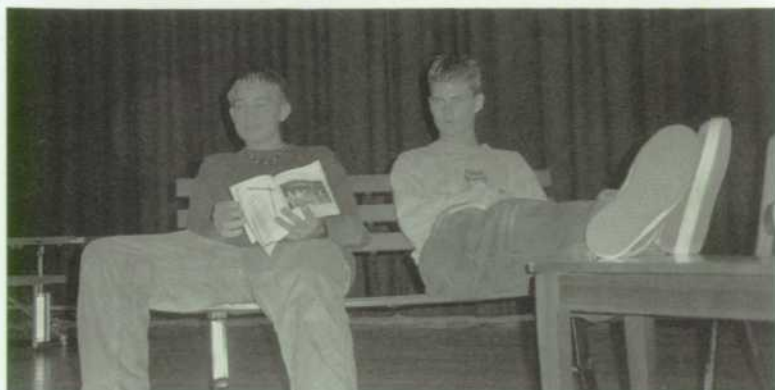

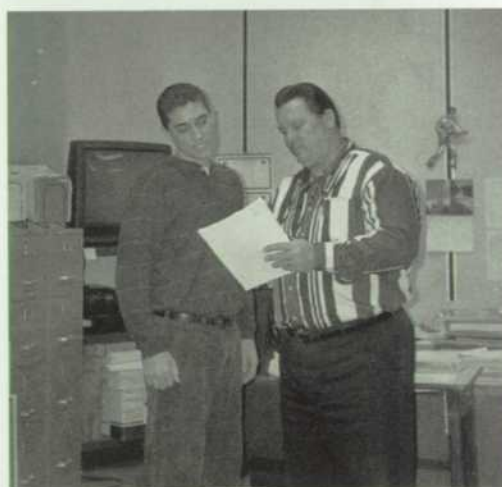
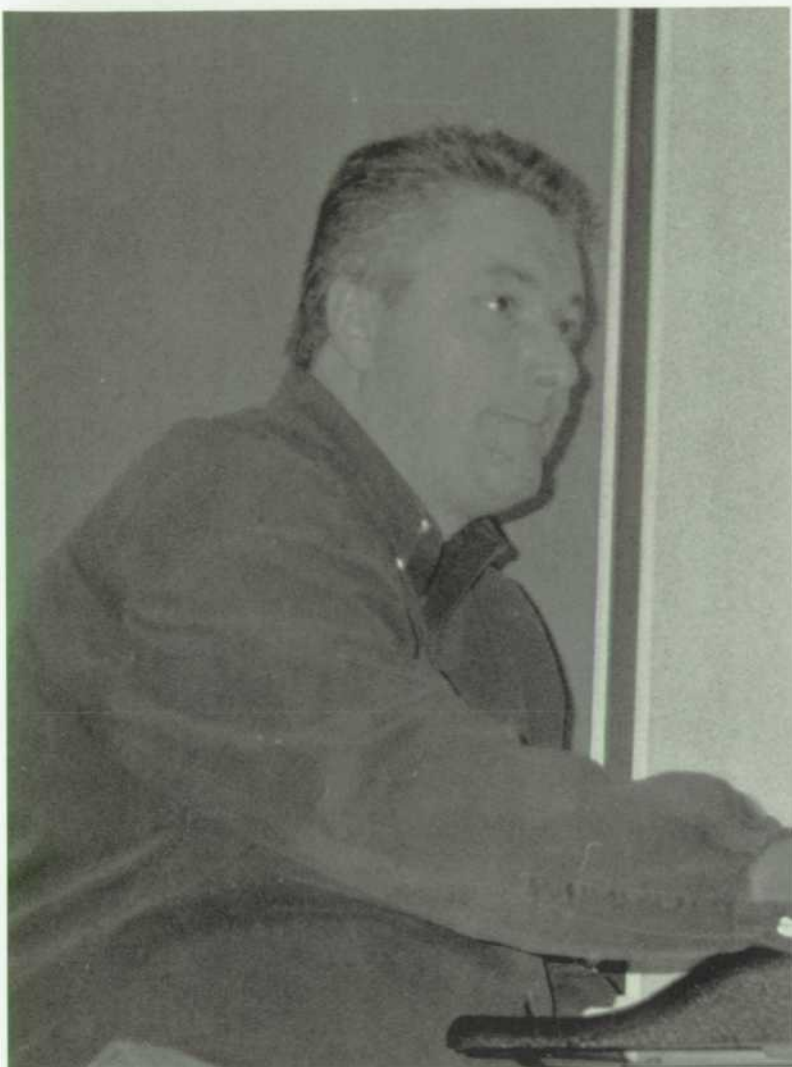

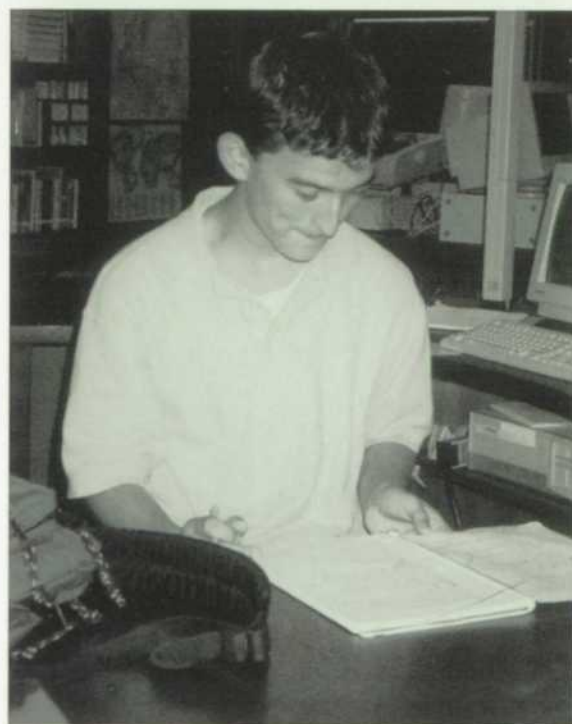

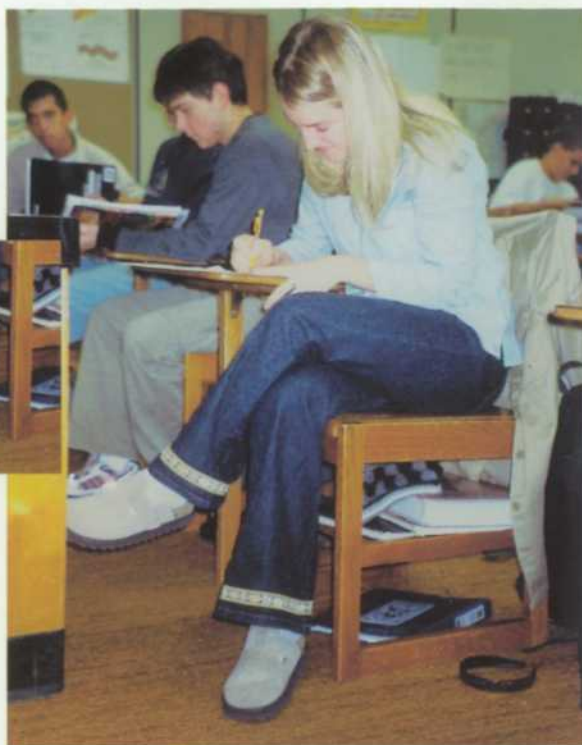

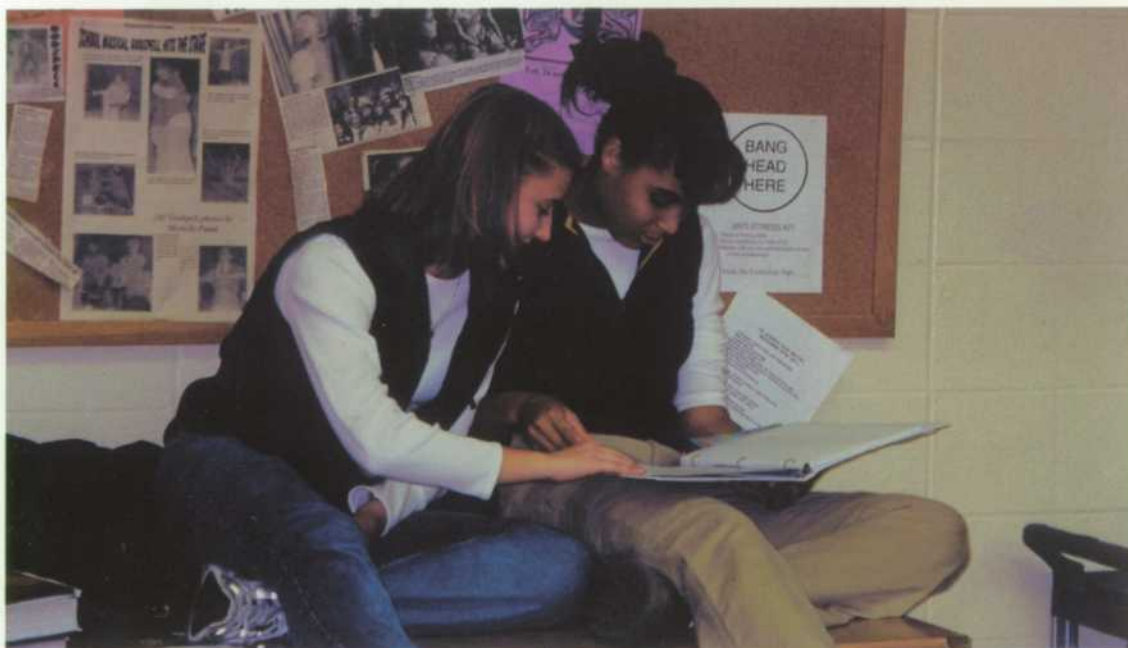
Fashion

By demonstrating their own styles, students emphasized JHS diversity.

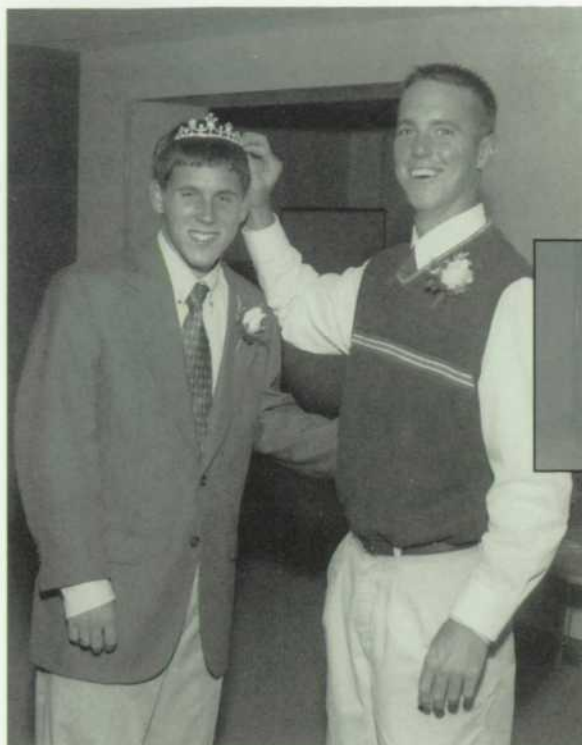

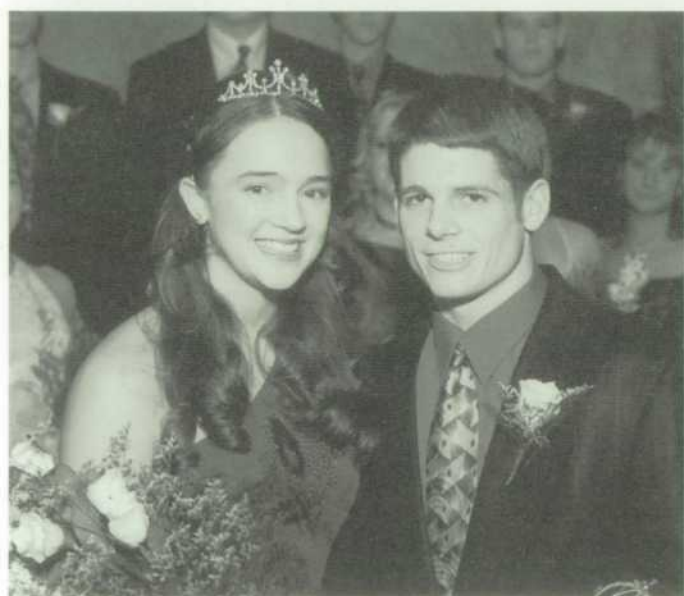

the Snowball. Jill Dittmer and Dustin Mehringer were crowned King and Queen. All the dances proved to be memorable experiences.

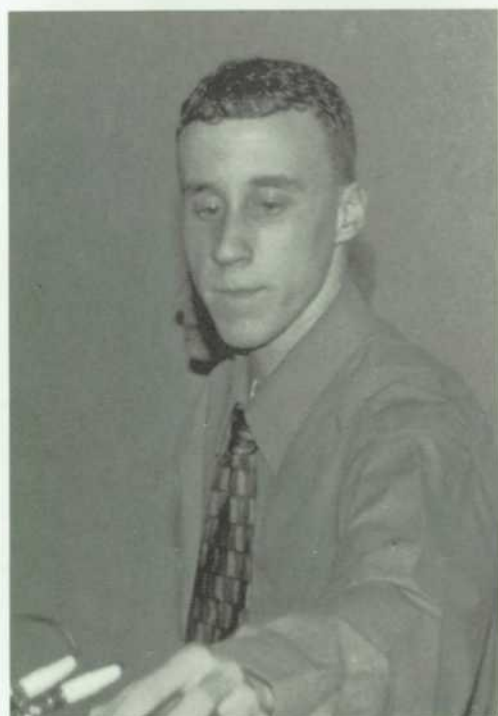

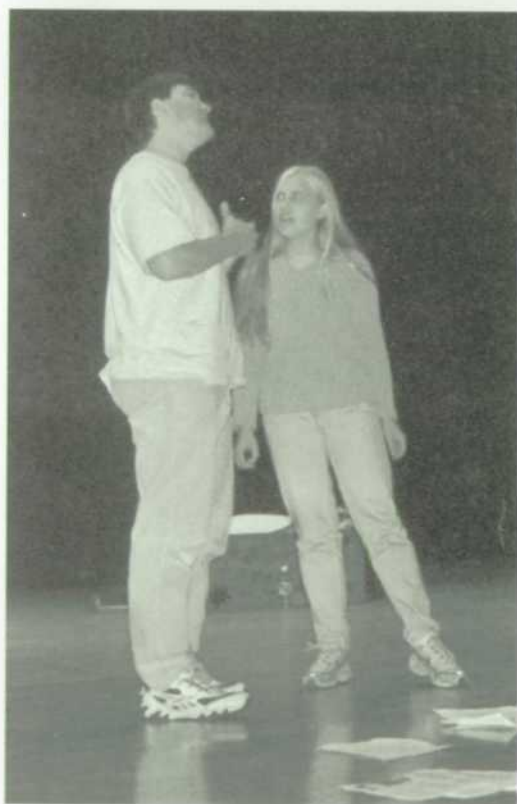

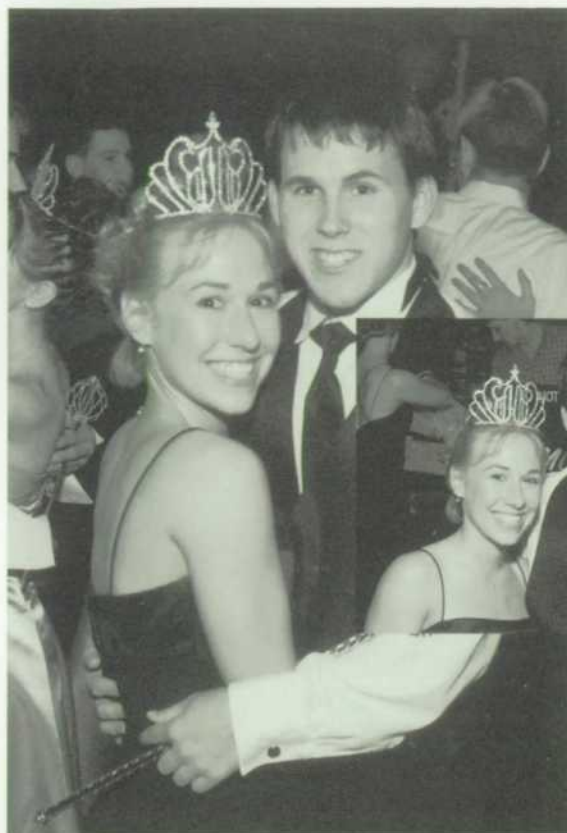

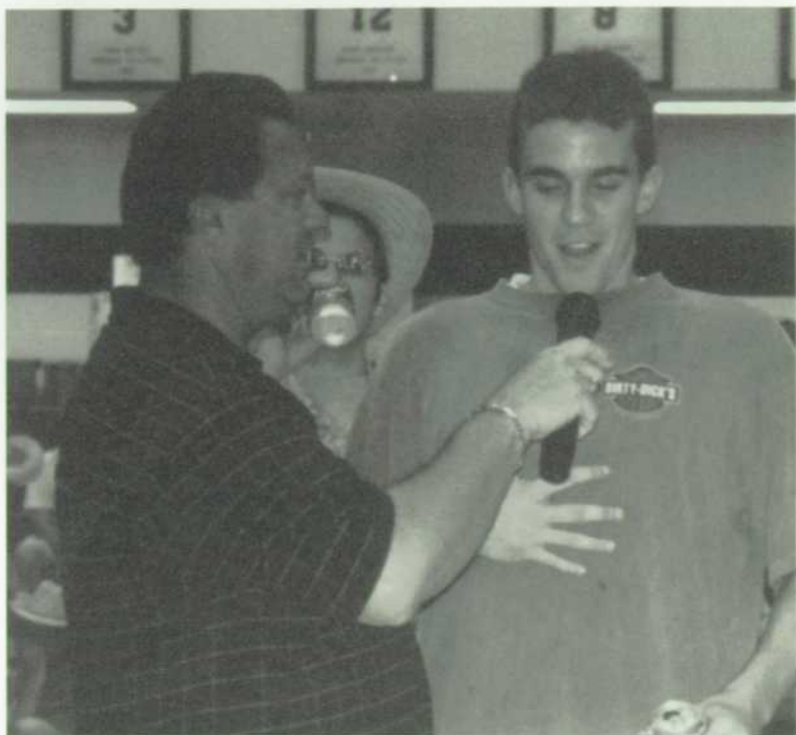

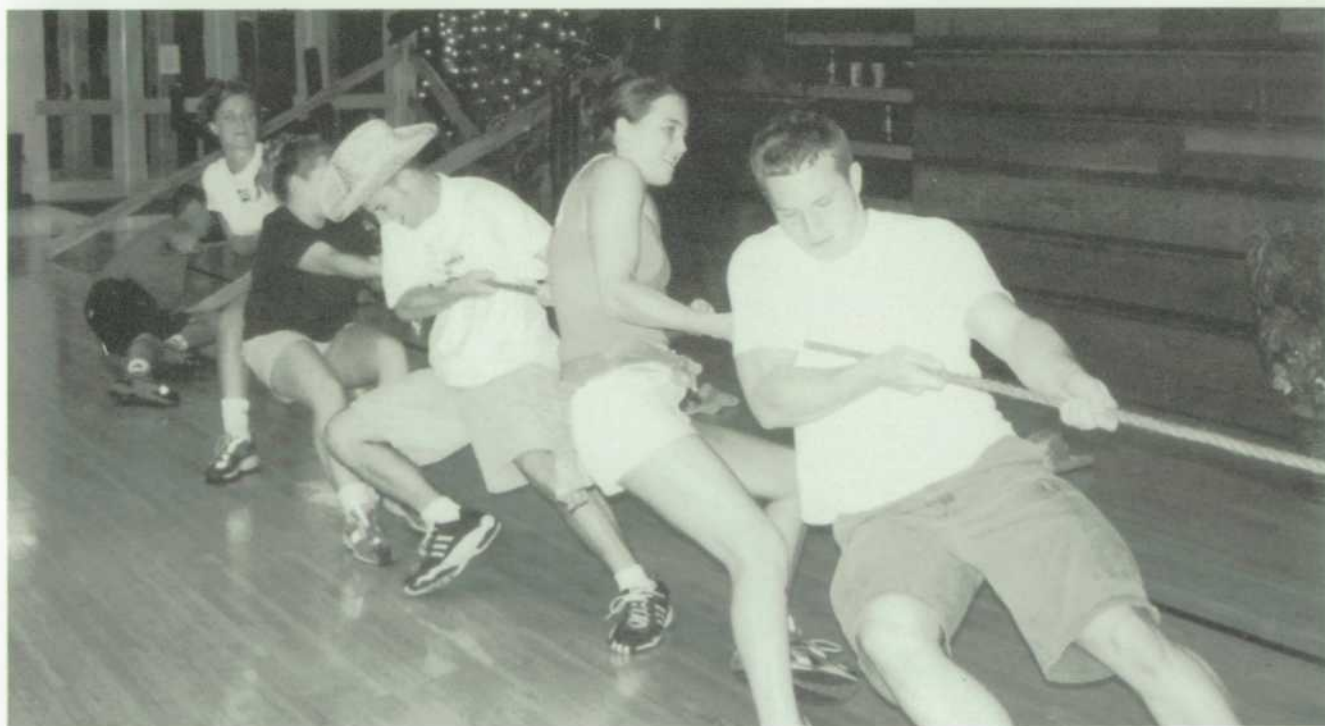

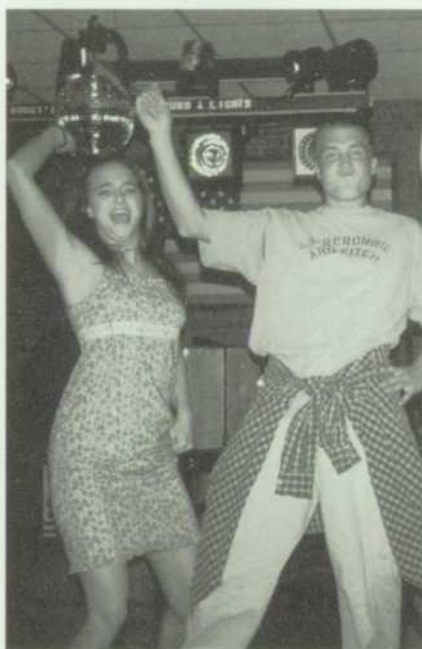

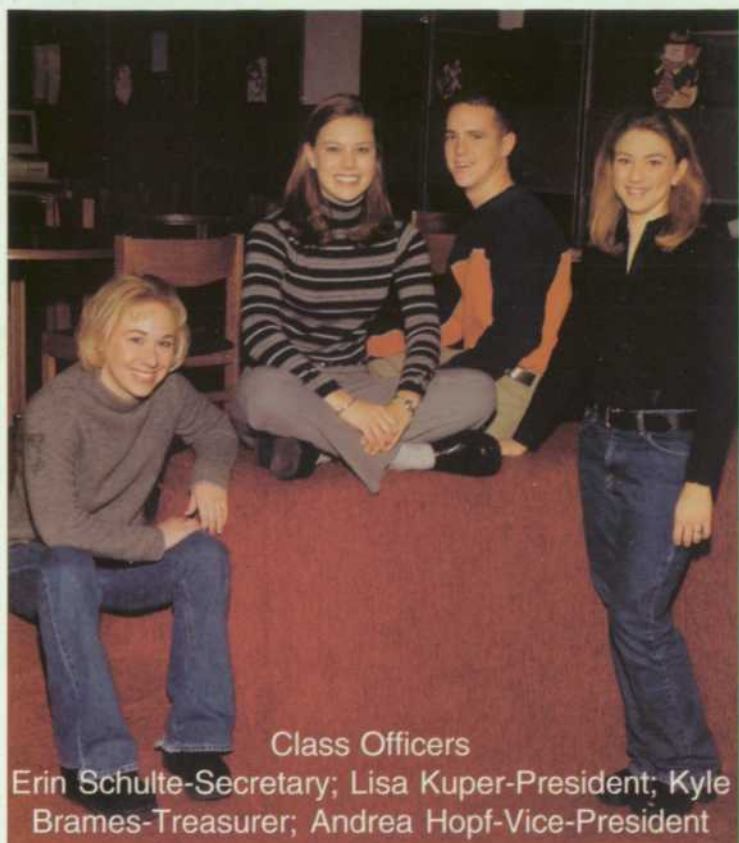

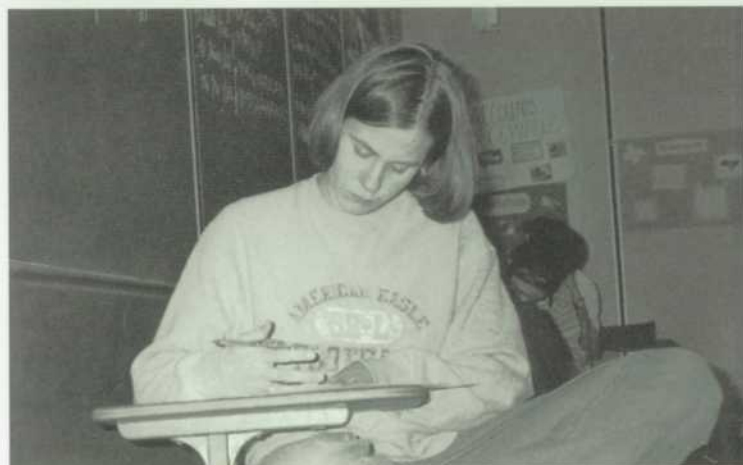

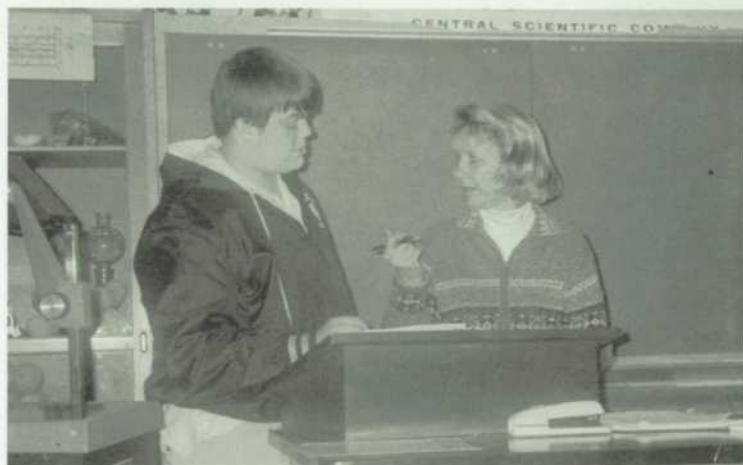

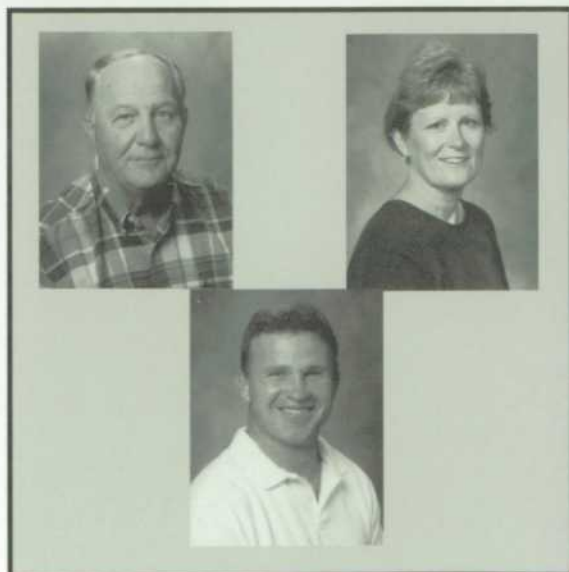

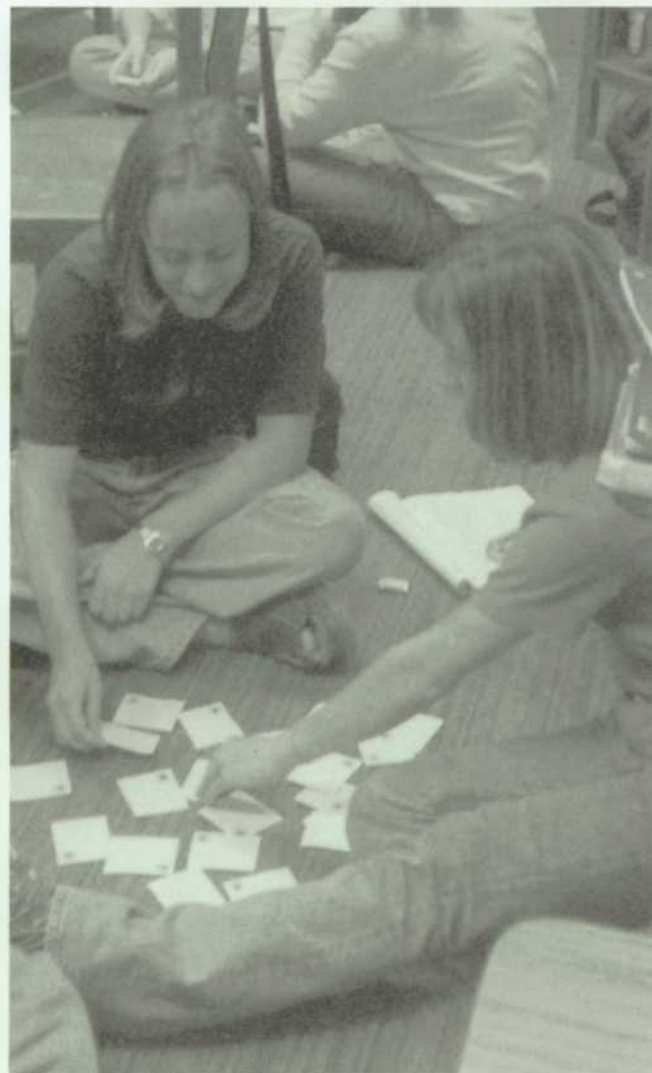

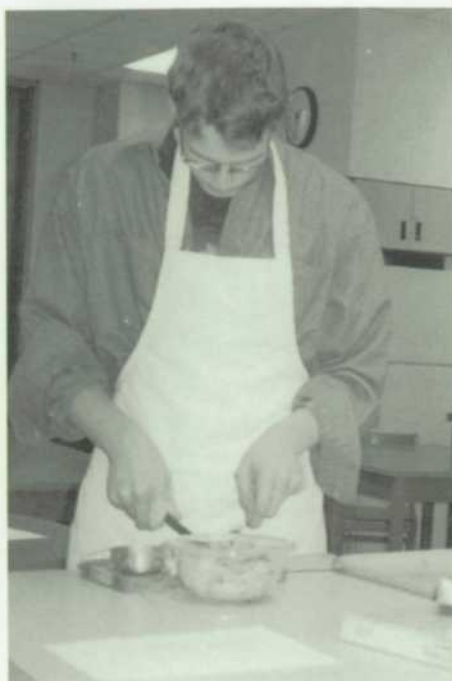

Becoming a teacher was not a hard decision for Mrs. Hurm, considering she was inspired at a very young age by her first grade teacher. Her grandmother and her aunt were always very creative with crafts, which inspired her to become a Family and Consumer Sciences educator.

Seeing students grasp concepts and watching them grow were just a couple of Mrs. Hurm's favorite things about working in the classroom. Sponsoring the Octagon Club and the National Honor Society helped her reach students in a way she couldn't have in the classroom. She said that during extracurricular activities teachers were able to see students at a more natural state.

Recently, Mrs. Hurm accepted the job and responsibilities of State President of Alpha Delta Kappa International Honorary Sorority for Women Educators for the 2000 through 2002 biennium. Therefore after her retirement from JHS, she will be traveling around the state to fulfill the duties of this honor.

Her grandmother always taught her that she should, "Enjoy what you do, and do what you enjoy." This would be one thought that she would like to be able to leave with the future students at JHS. She said, "Everyone should choose a career that they are interested in, and never forget to put your heart into whatever you do."



Mr. Tom Schum attended Oakland City University, the University of Evansville, and Indiana State University. He graduated with a B.A., M.S., and also has Driver Training Certification.

For the past 34 years, Mr. Schum taught at JHS. His teaching career started at Dale High School where he taught for one year. Thus he has been making a positive impact on students' lives for 35 years.

His first inspiration for going into the field of art came from observing his father carving tombstones. He was also inspired by an eighth grade teacher and by a college professor from Oakland City University. These people helped him develop his skills and inspired him to help others develop their skills by becoming a teacher. Understanding the sacrifices that his parents made by providing for him and his six siblings, he has looked up to them throughout his life.

When asked what his favorite thing about teaching in the classroom was, he responded, "Interacting with the students, becoming a part of their lives, and experience, not only in art, but in other activities as well." He would also like his students to remember that he always tried to treat each one fairly.

After retirement, Mr. Schum plans on continuing to produce art, traveling, and engaging in outdoor activities in the West.

If he was able to give the future students at JHS one piece of advice, it would be that students should take this opportunity to take classes that will broaden their knowledge and hopefully develop their interests in new areas. He said, "Developing a wide range of interests is important to a quality life. Your total focus should not be just on your career."

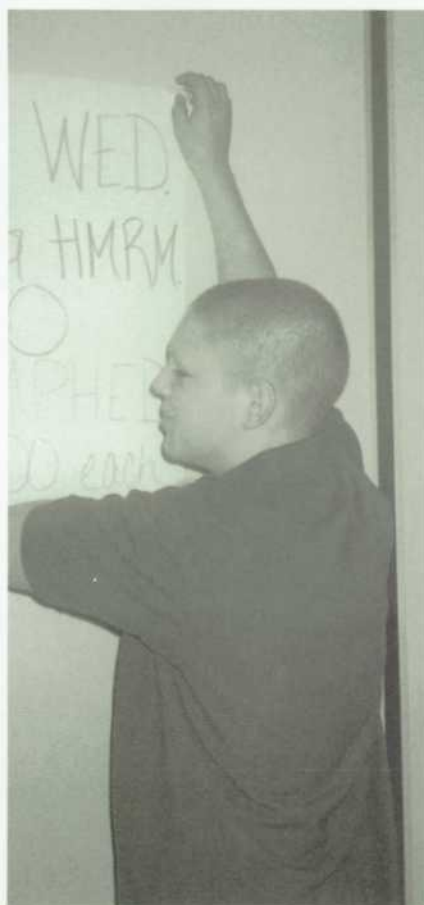

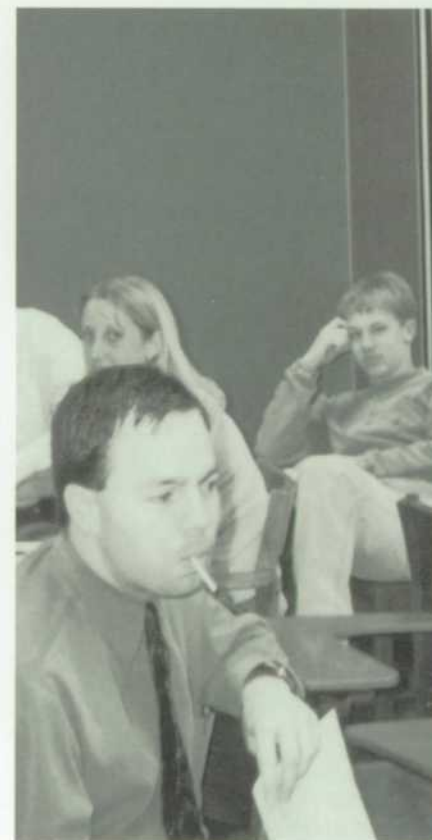

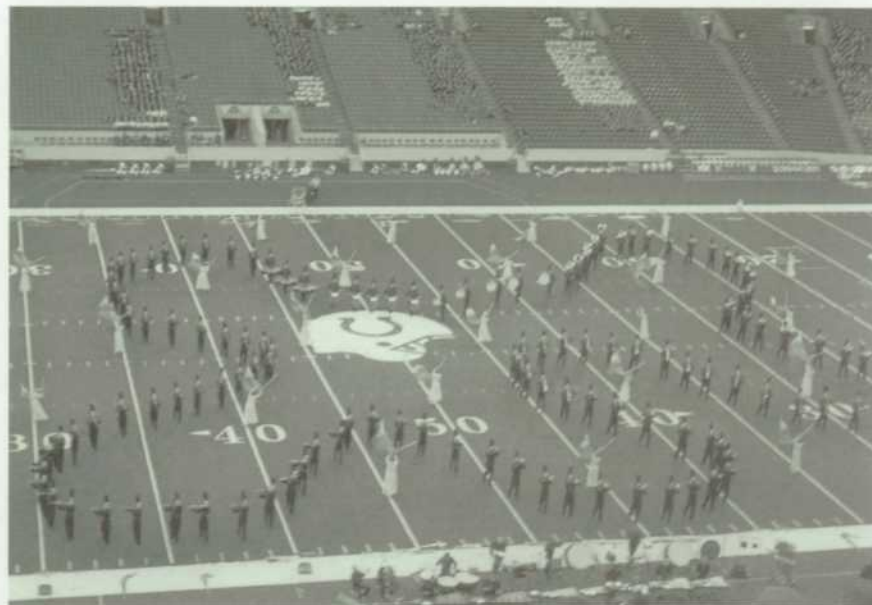

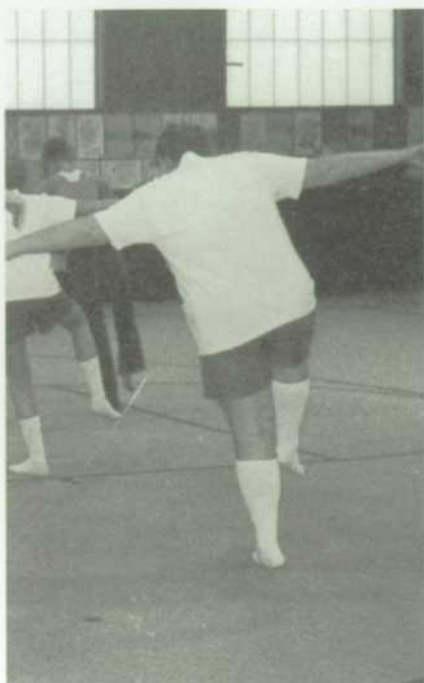

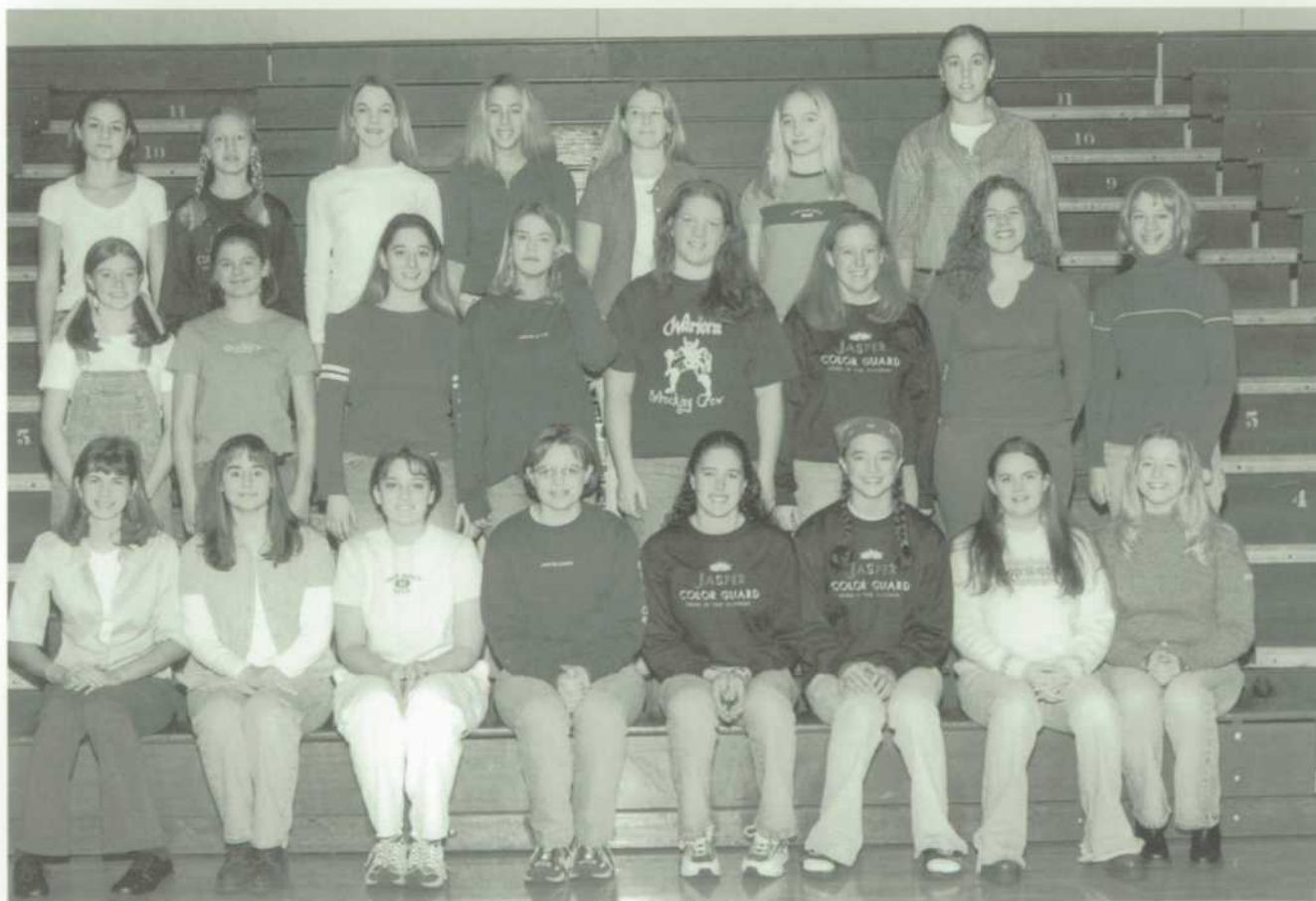

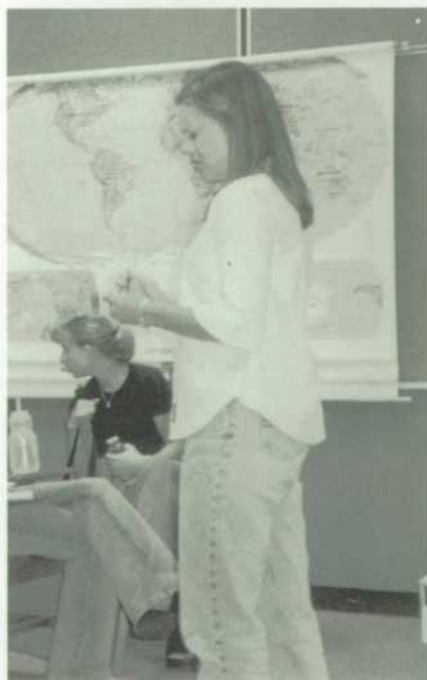

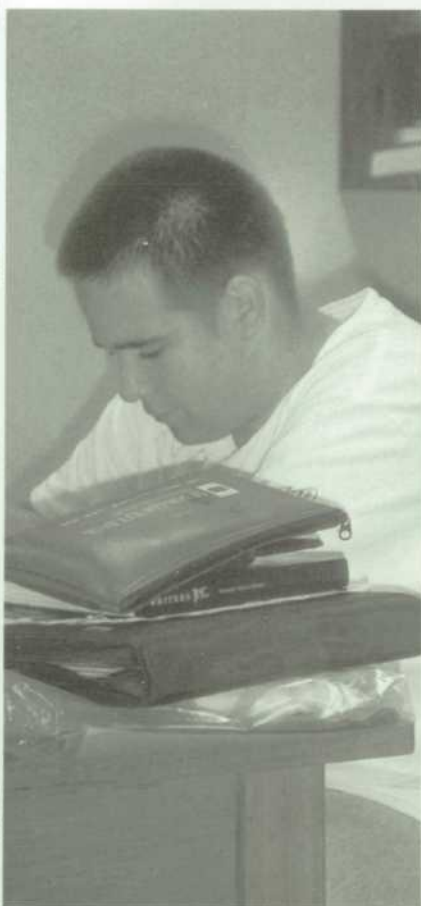

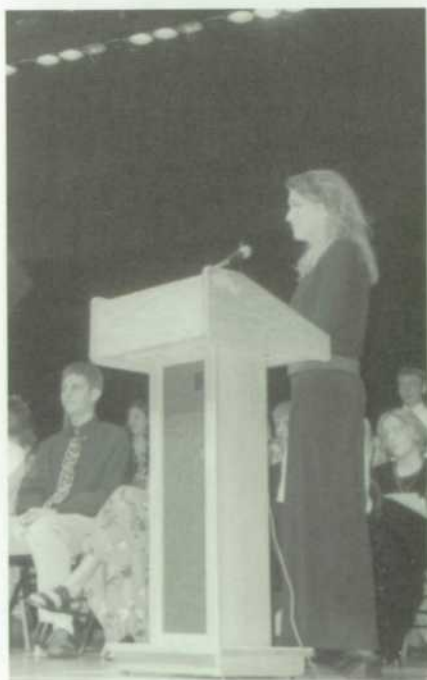

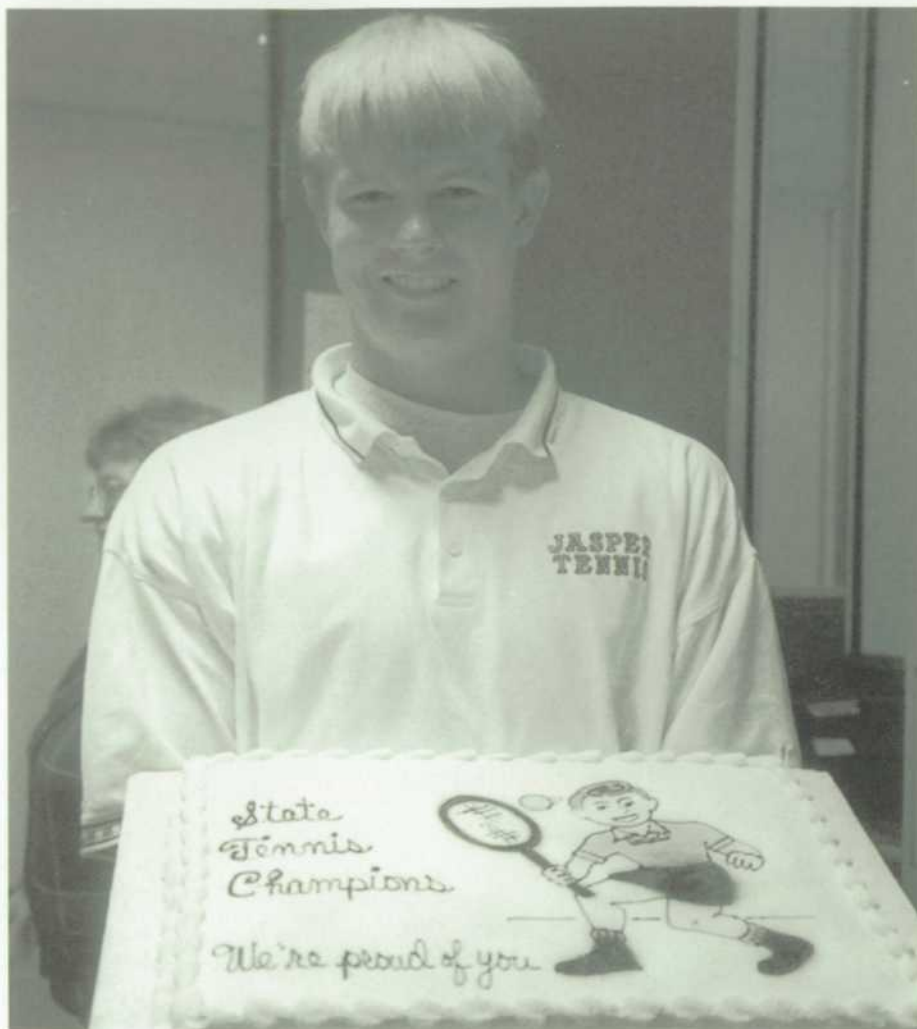

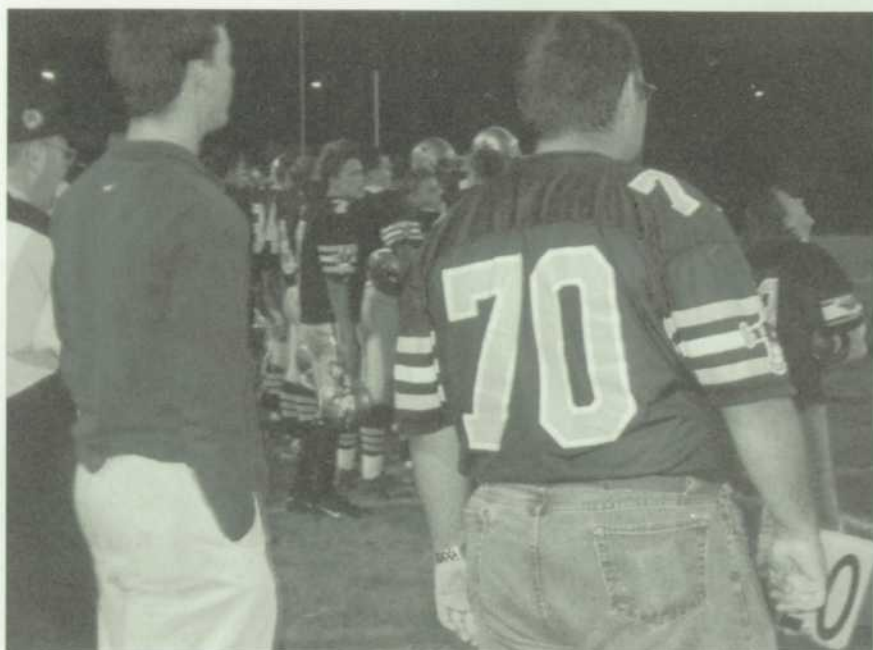

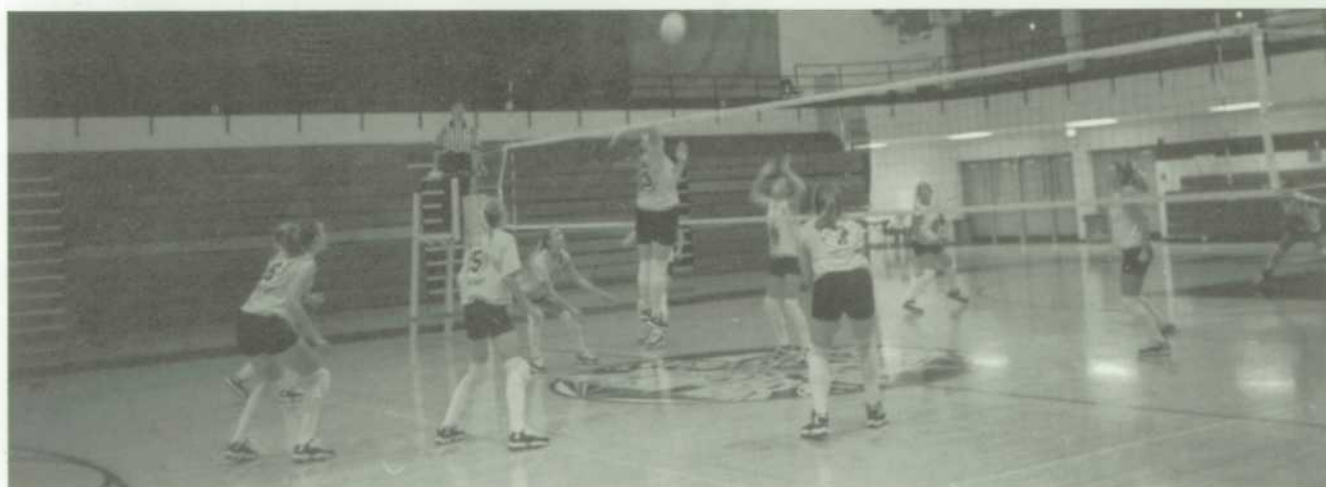

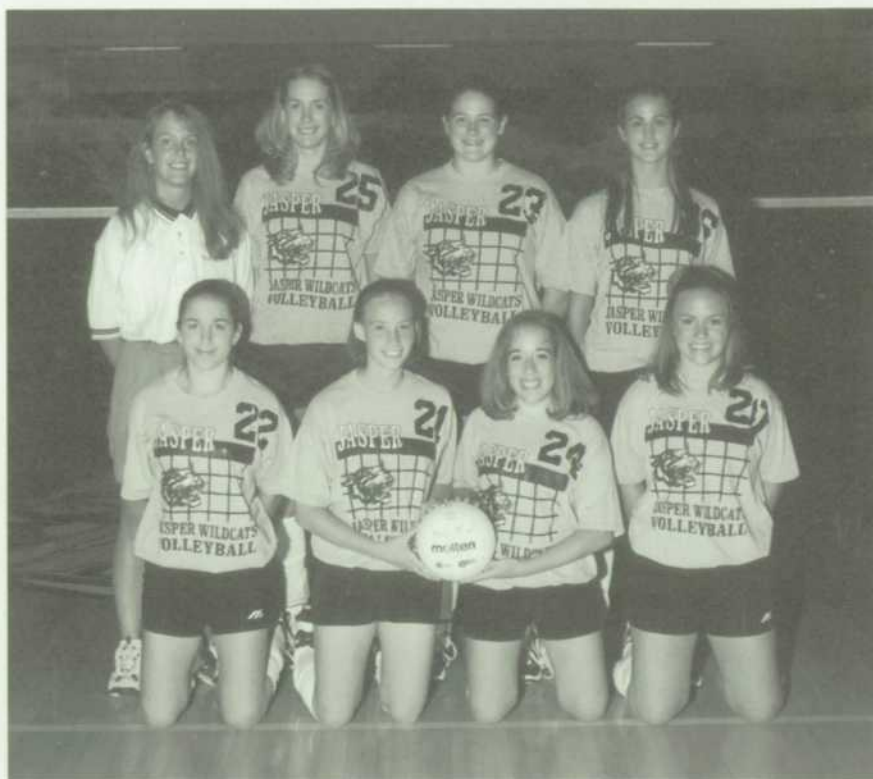

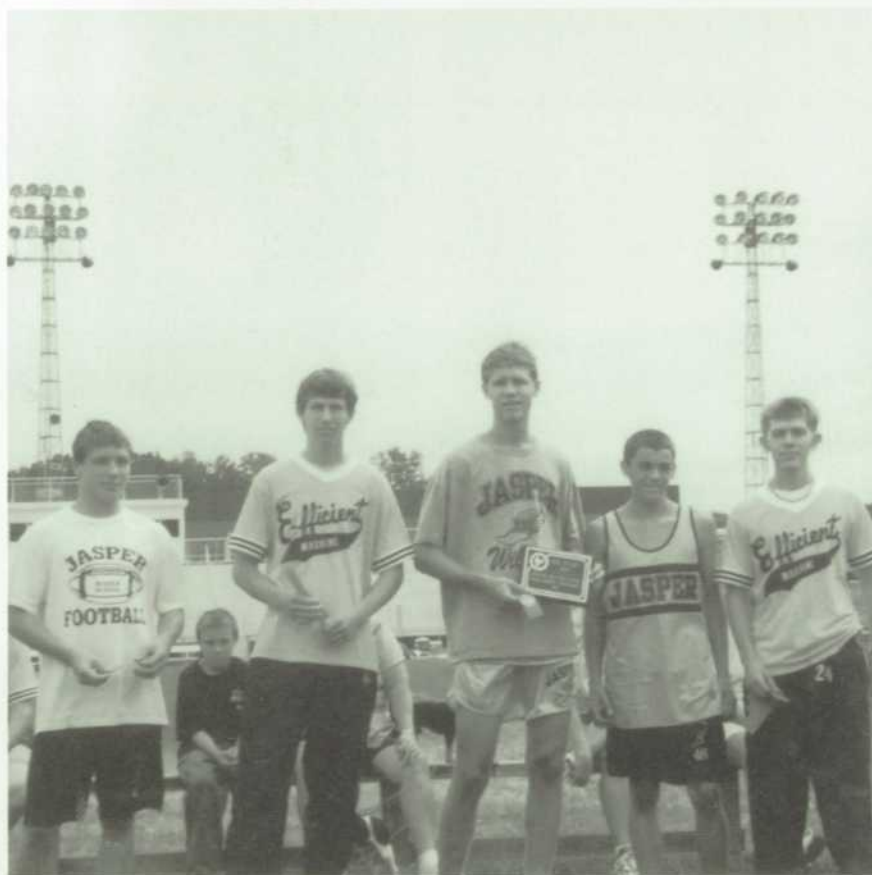

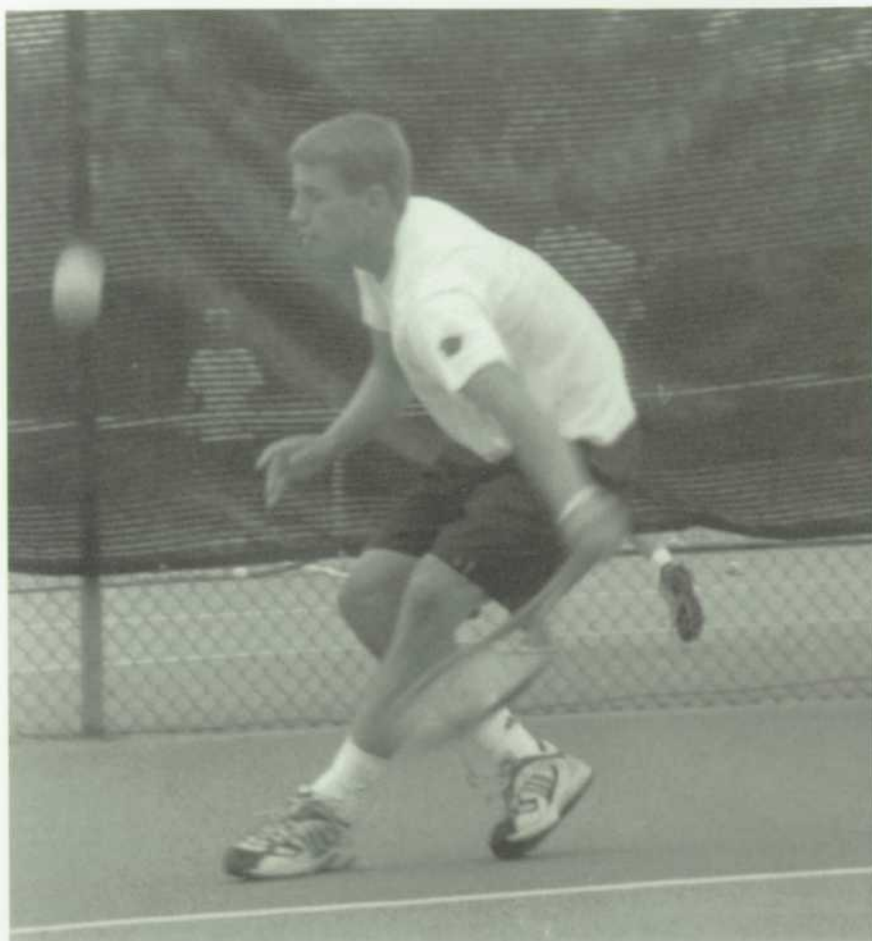

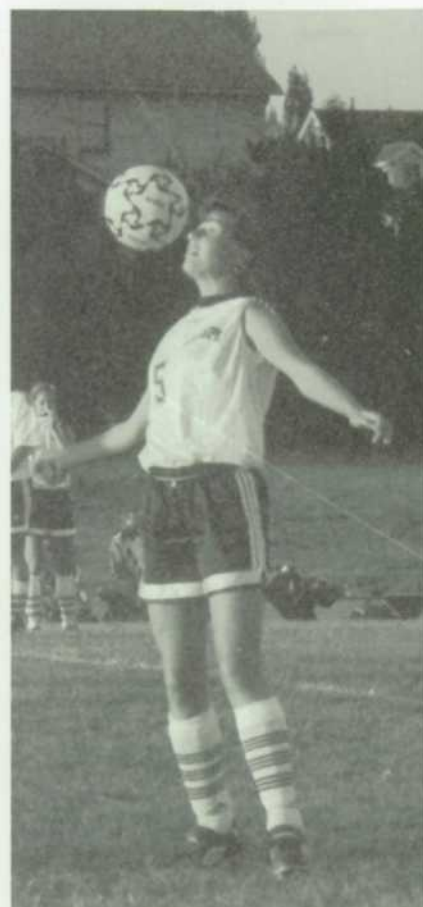

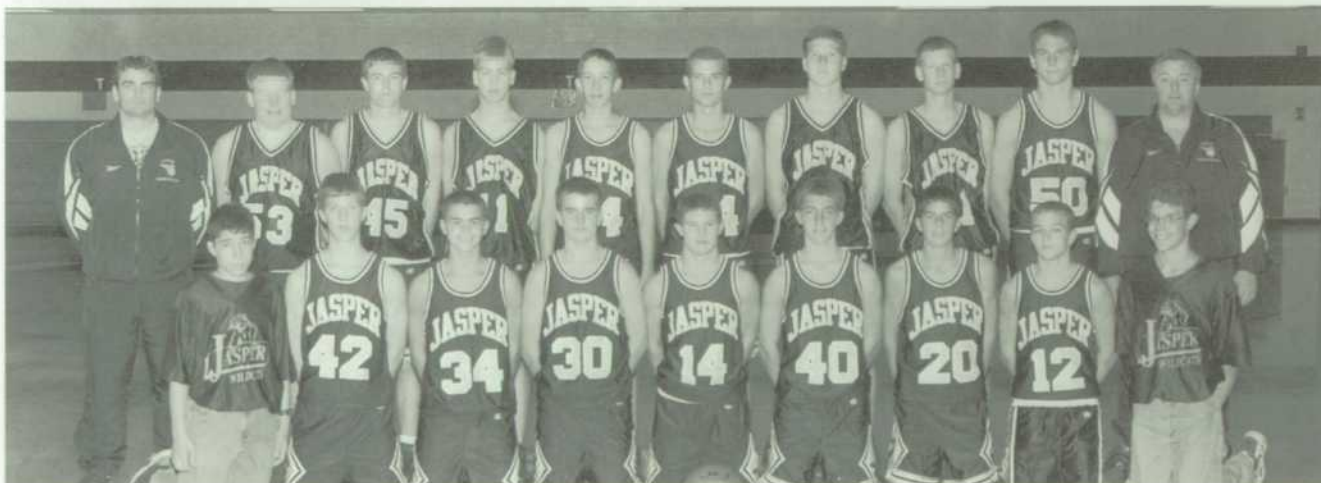

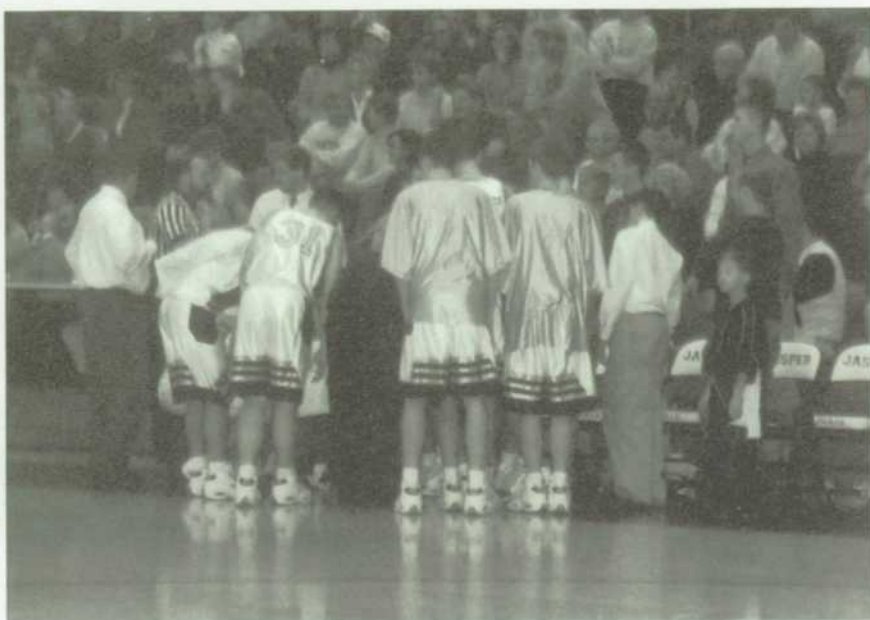

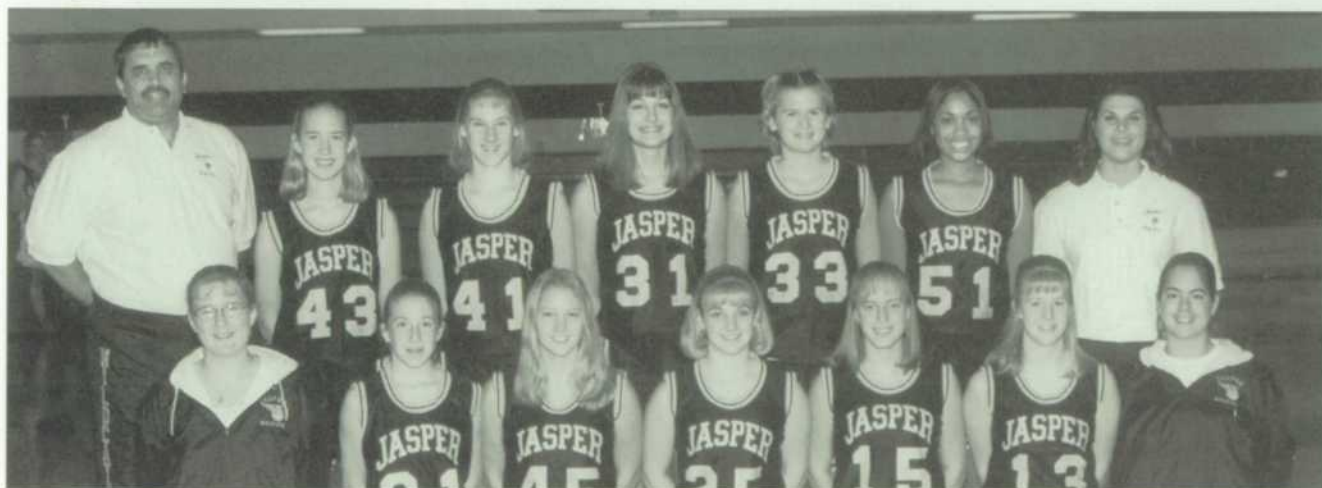

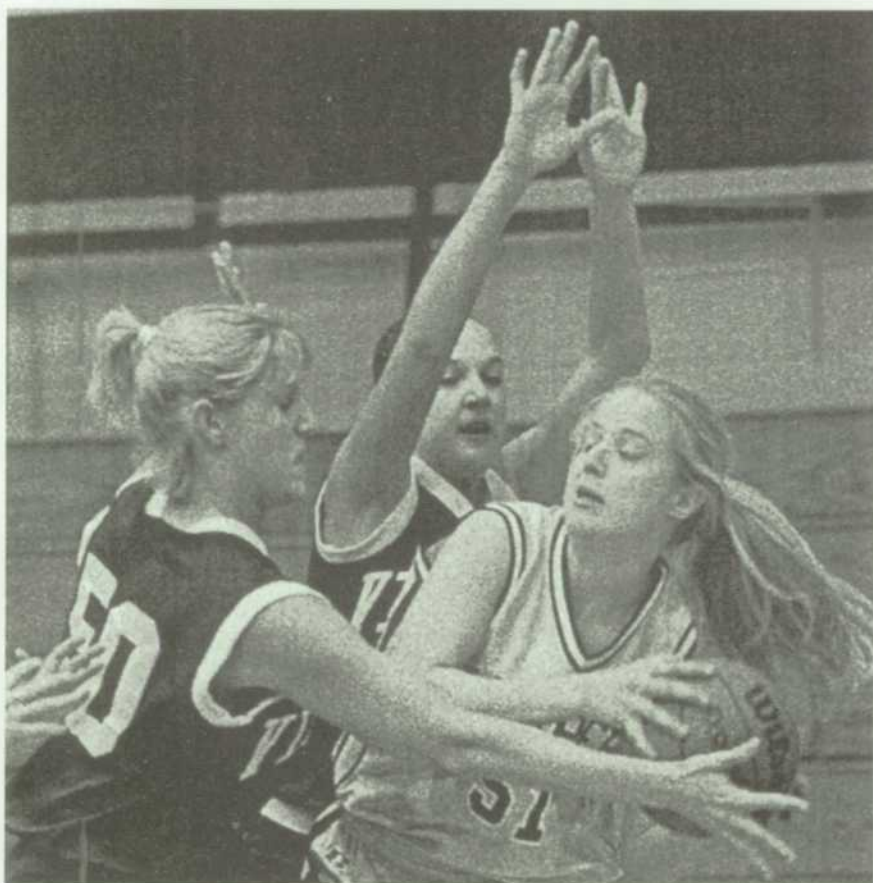

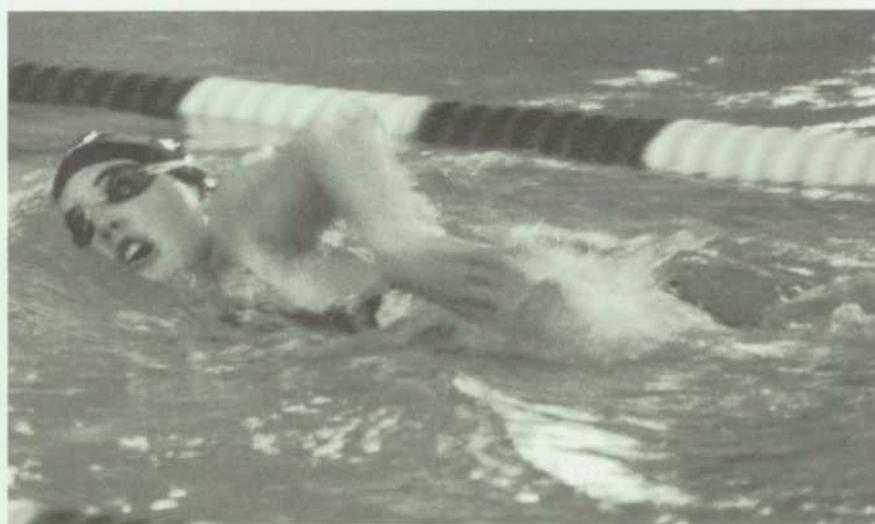
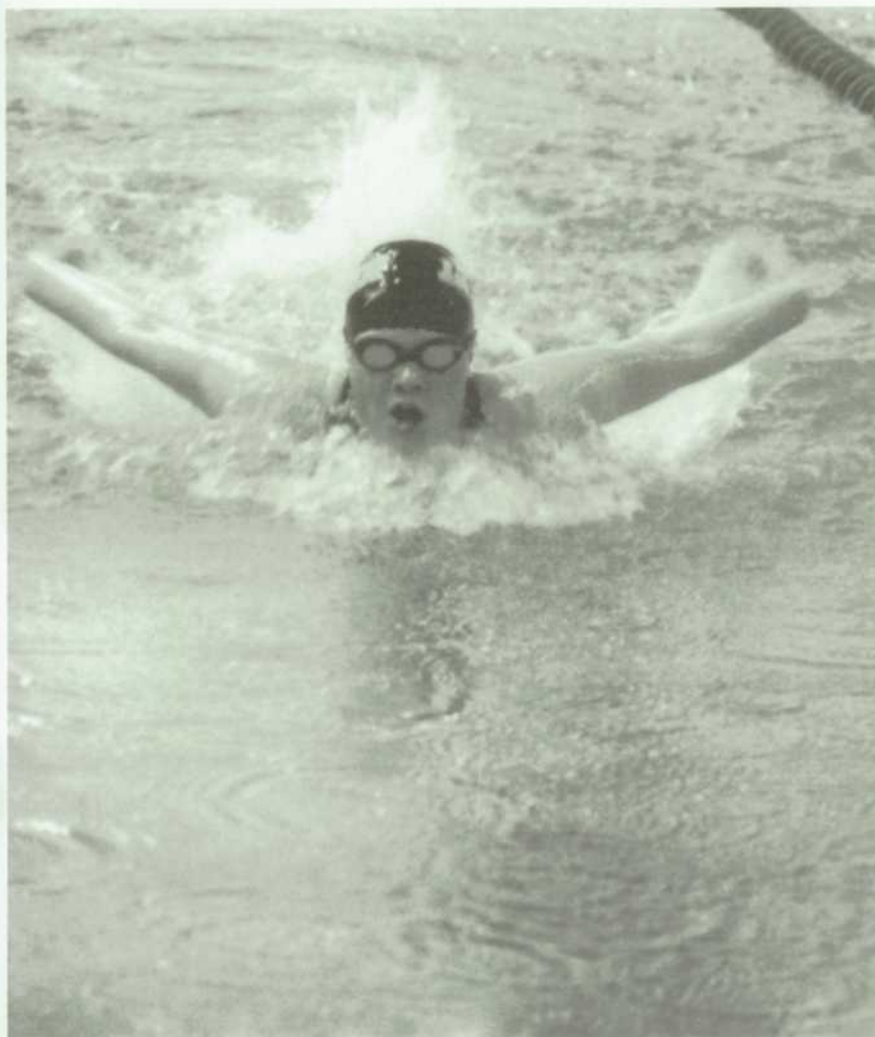

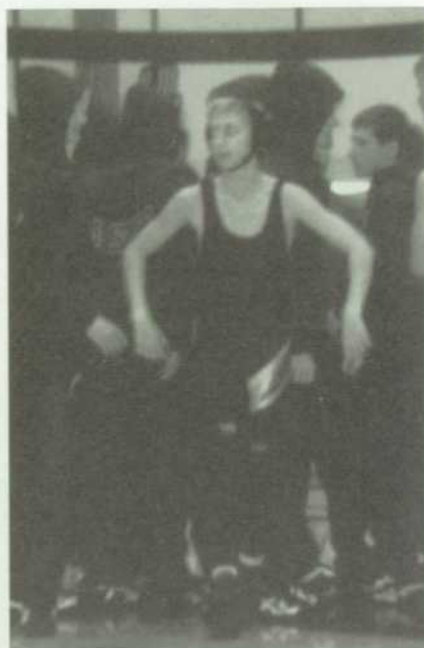

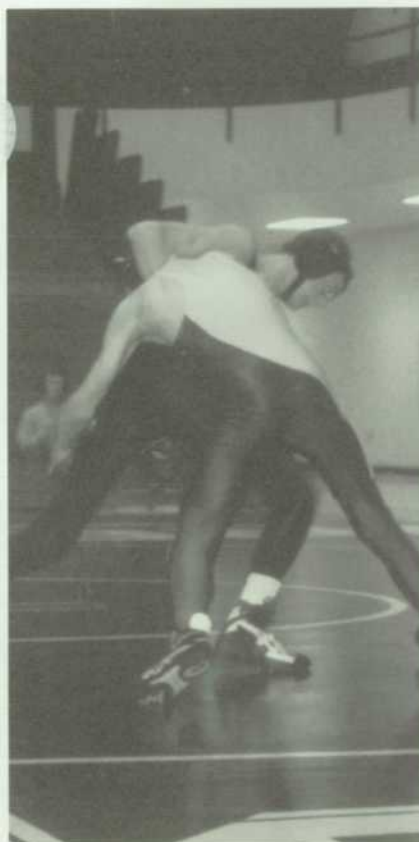

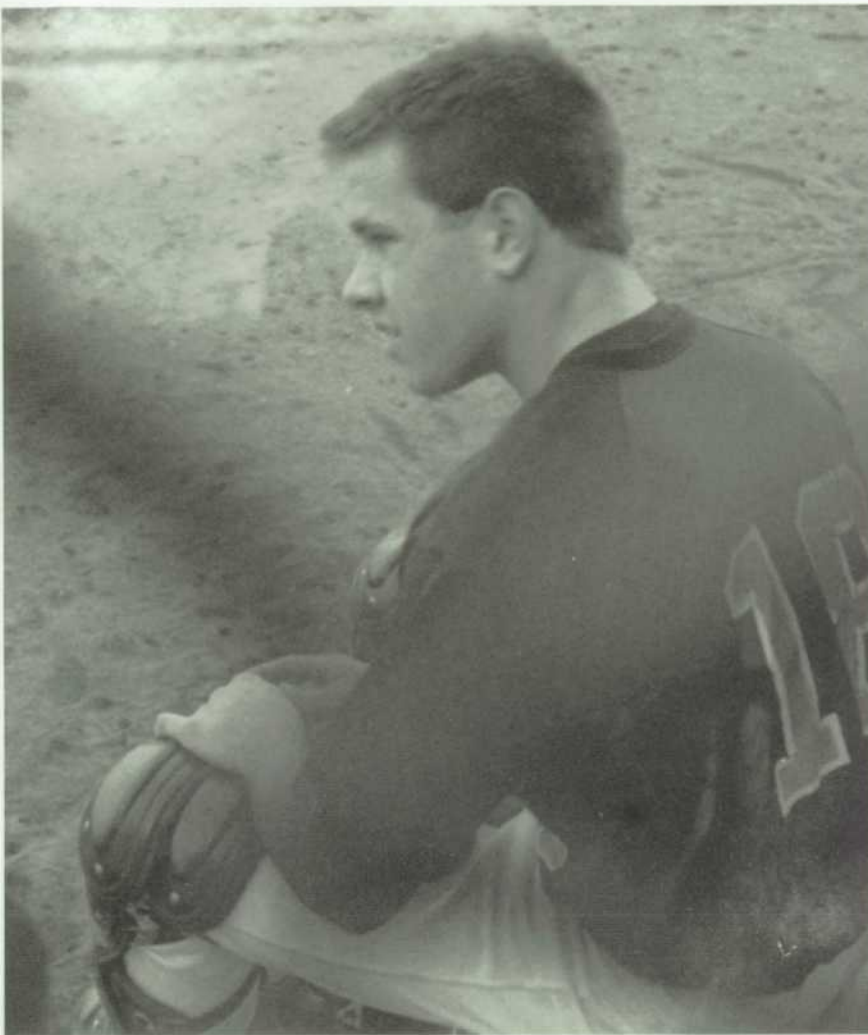

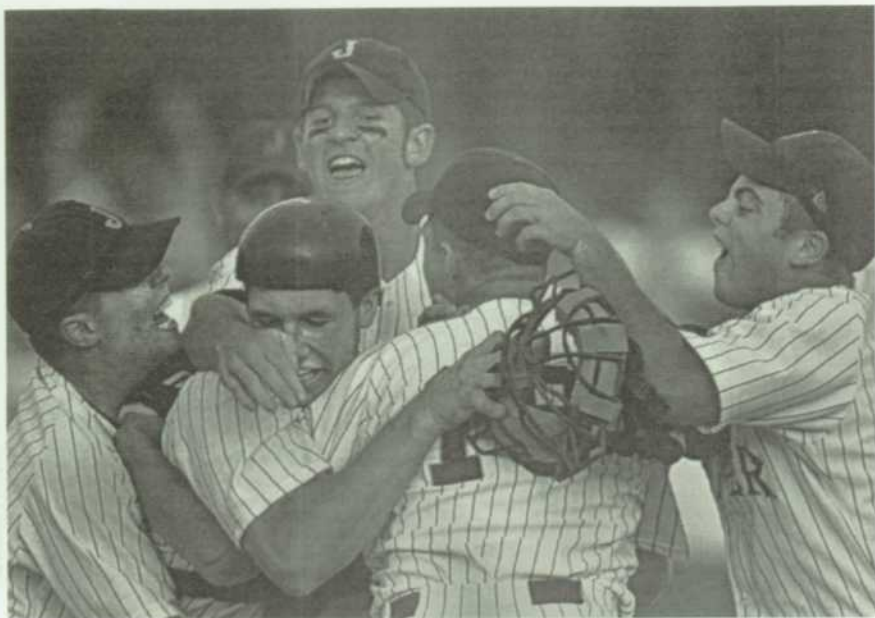

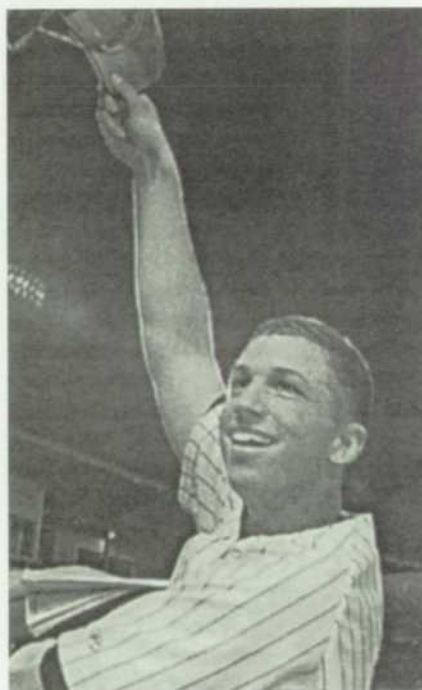

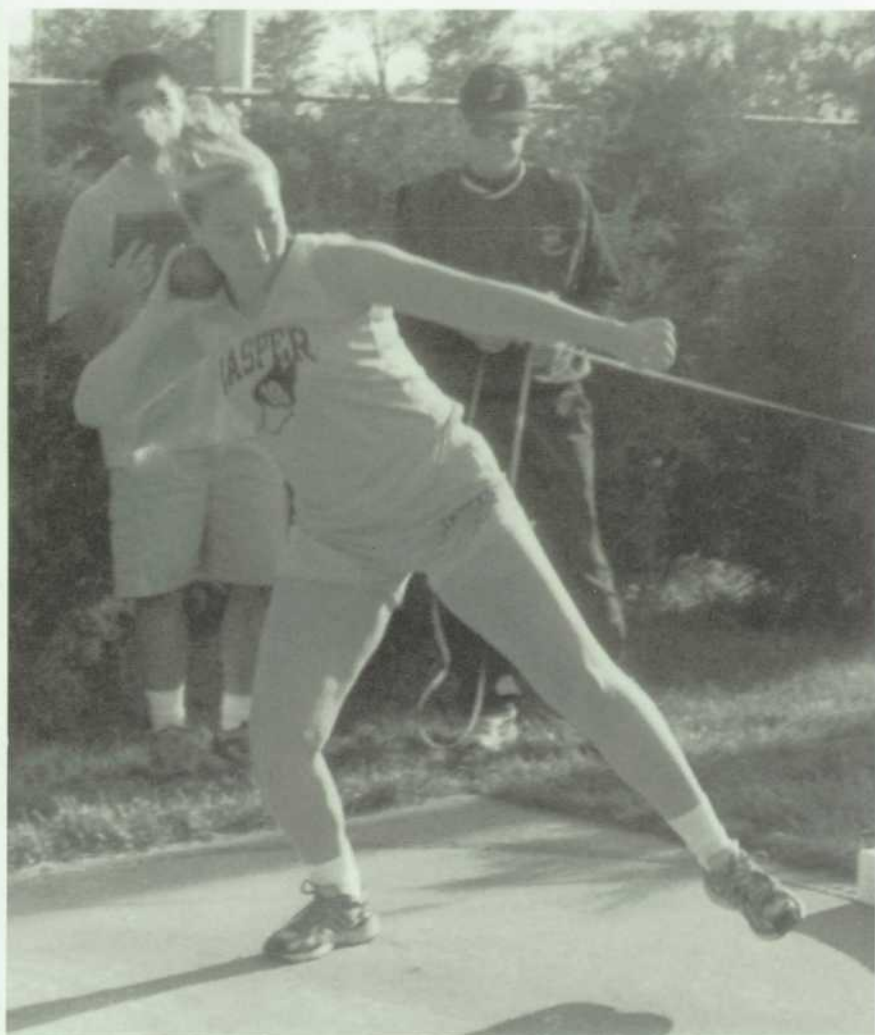

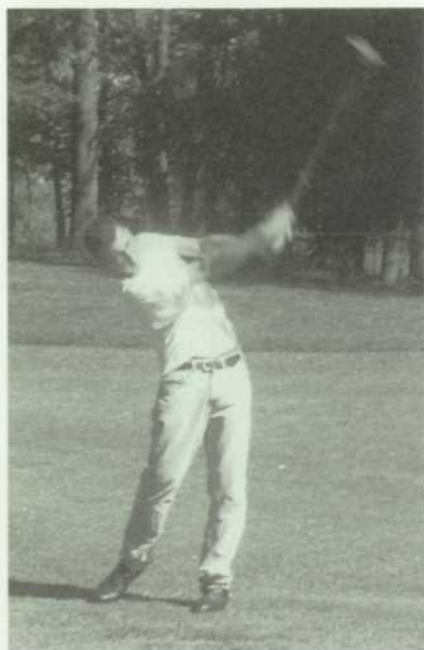

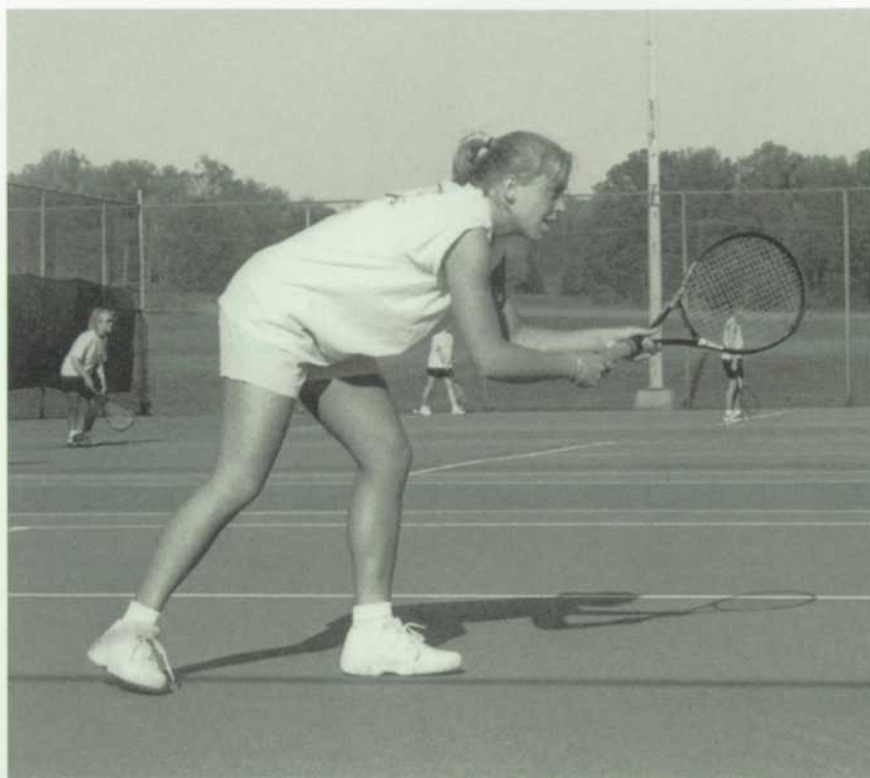

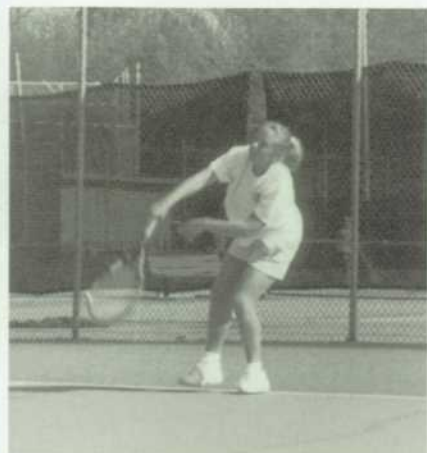

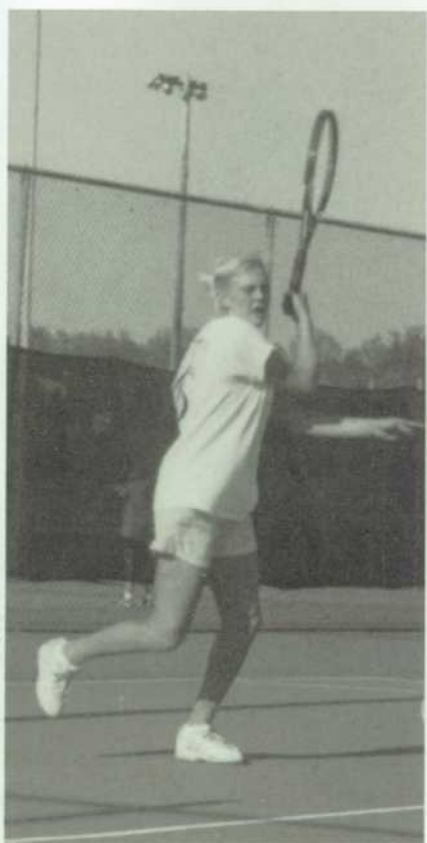
