
### These Cats, They are a Changin' 2009 - 2010

A Brand New Day Sept. 24-28



### Freedom Writers — 0d.10-09














#### Brain Damage Dec. 21-22



Everyone got the winter storm they were wishing for and got to stay home and enjoy the snow!






The basketball team also played on Saturday, against Vincennes. They played a great game and won. As they played, the pep band rallied the spectators and cheered our team on.










# Here's To The Night April 5-9






# Remix to Ignition April 19-23










#### 2010 Retirees

Reminds me of a boy and all the things I had done.








Coming into the 2009 soccer season, all the returning players were worried. They had lost an excellent group of athletes and a big group of freshmen were expected to fill their shoes.


Warm-ups were a key for the Wildcats this season to get ready for the game. The Wildcats won their first sectional game since the 06' season.






With a large and talented freshman class, coaches were given the task of making sure everyone got their minutes. With this task, they did a fine job.










Below: Senior Austin Ahrens receives the Mental Attitude Award after the 3A state championship game.










