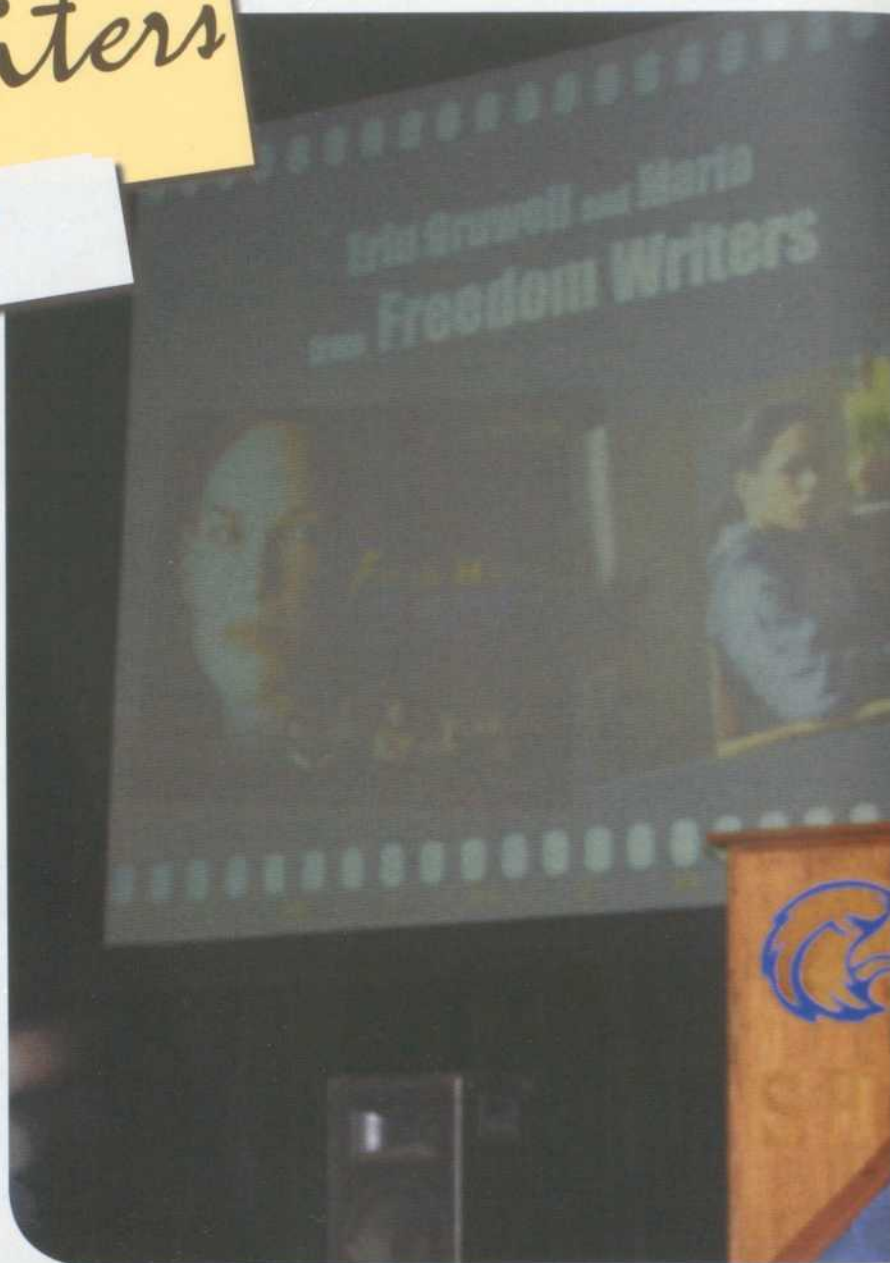
Freedom Writers

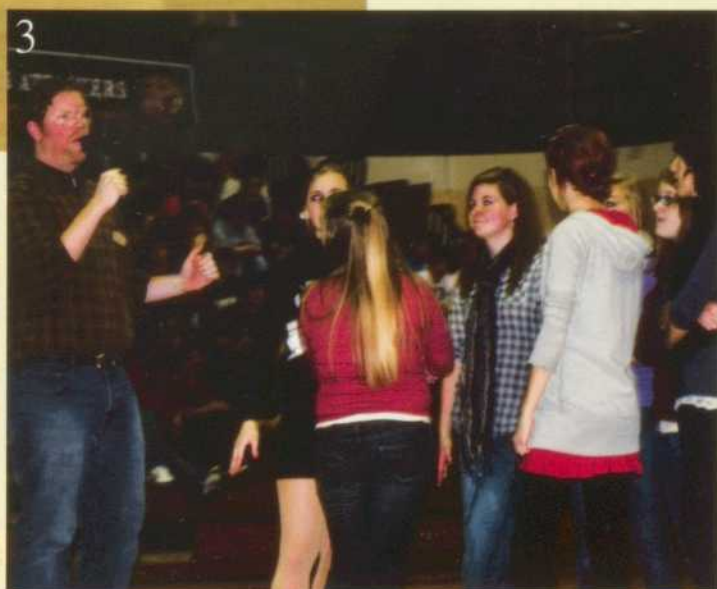

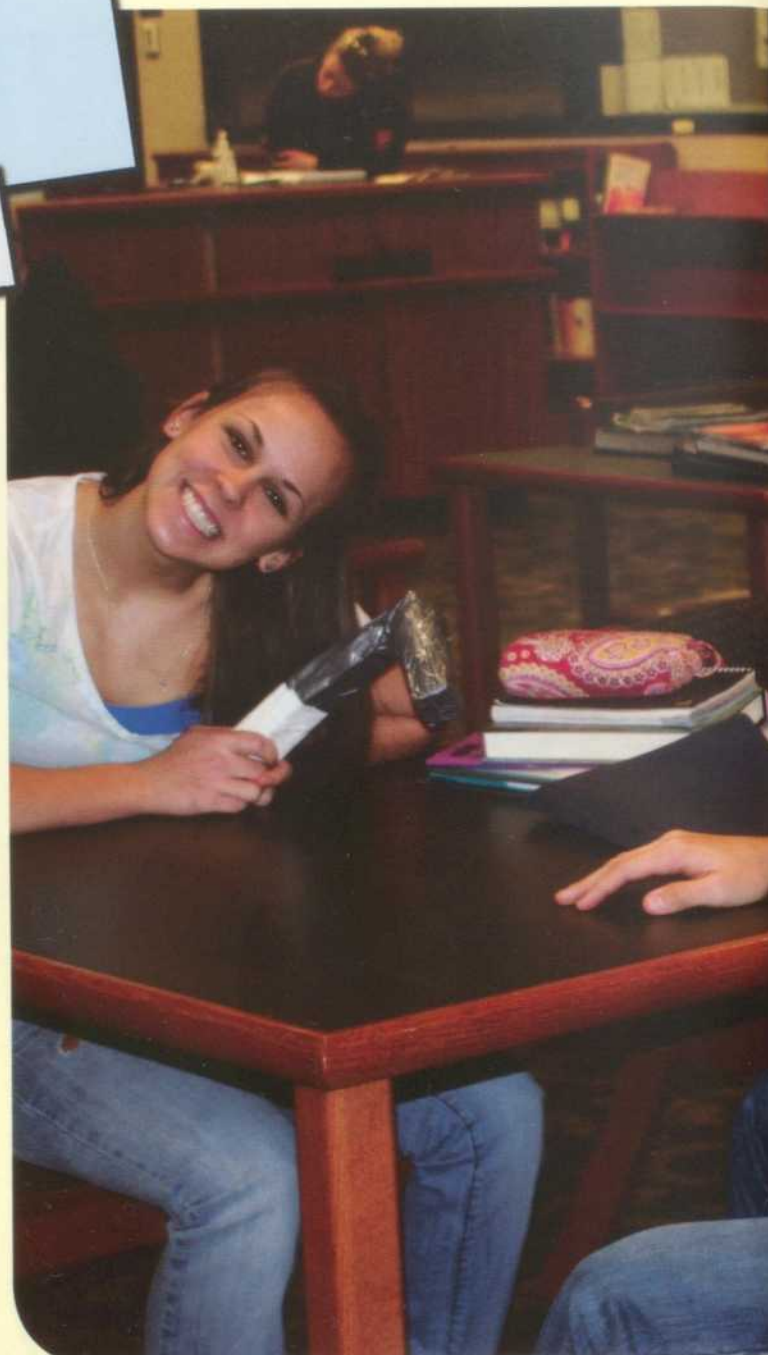
New Soul

Thursday we had a convocation to see how much money we have raised and donated this entire year, which was around \$15,000 to various organizations.

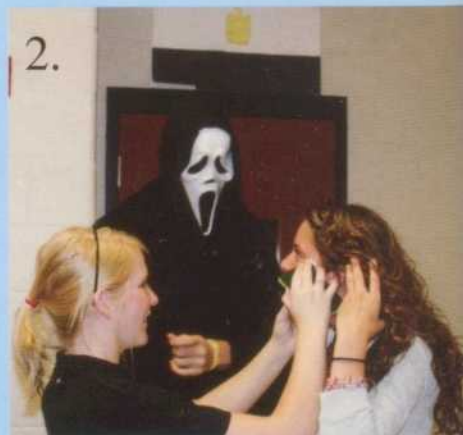

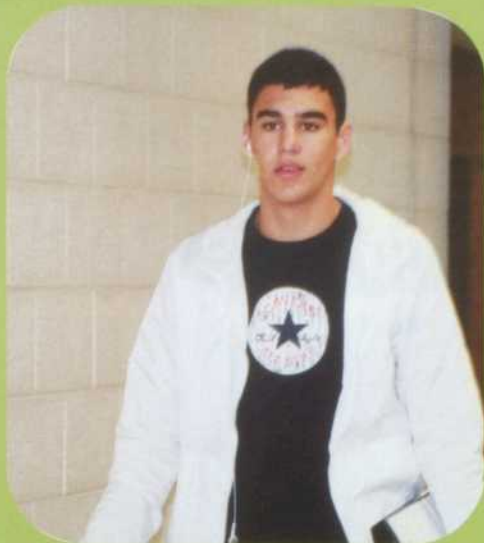

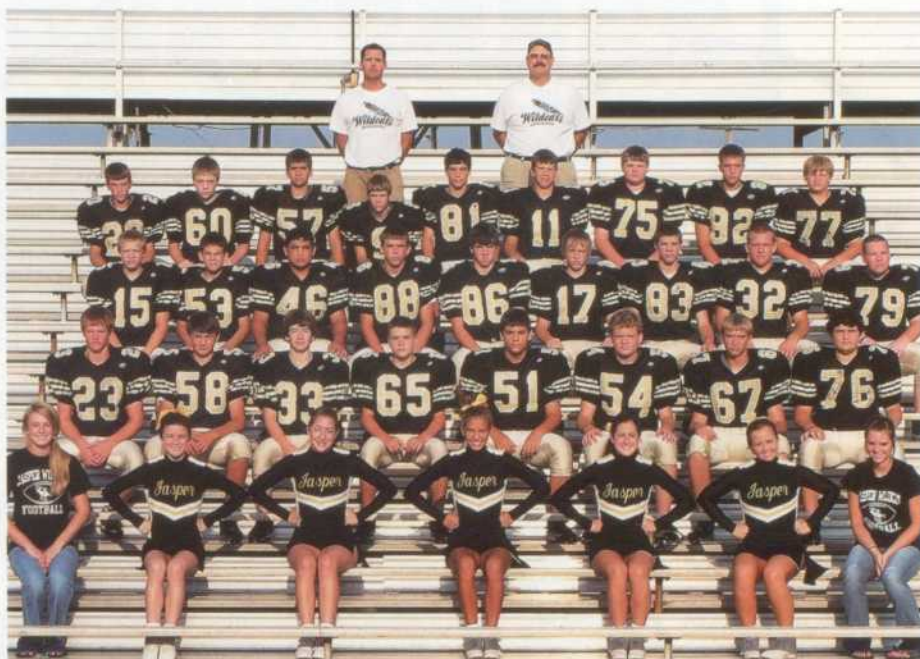

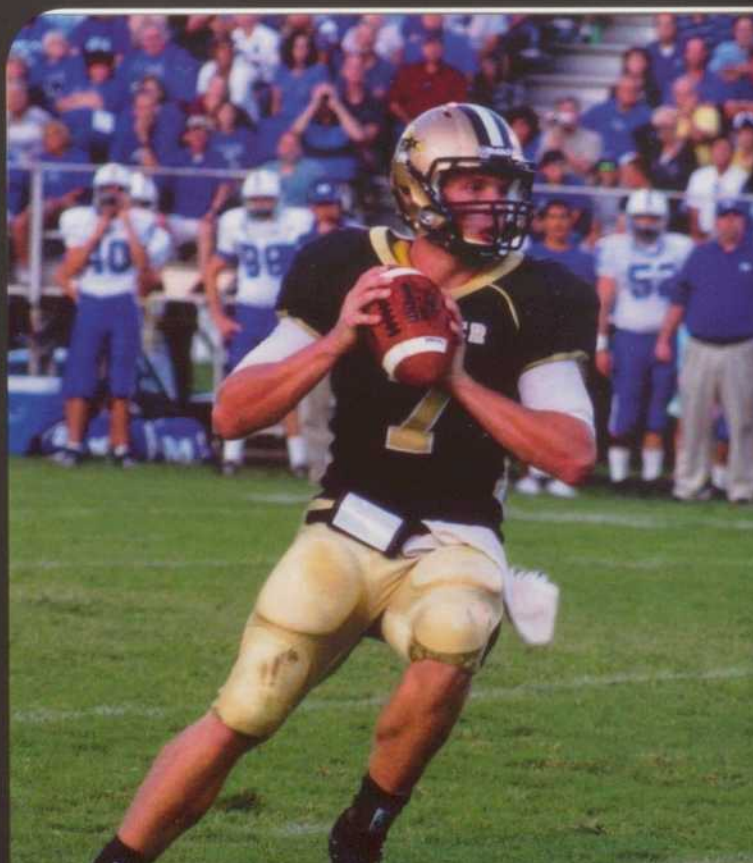

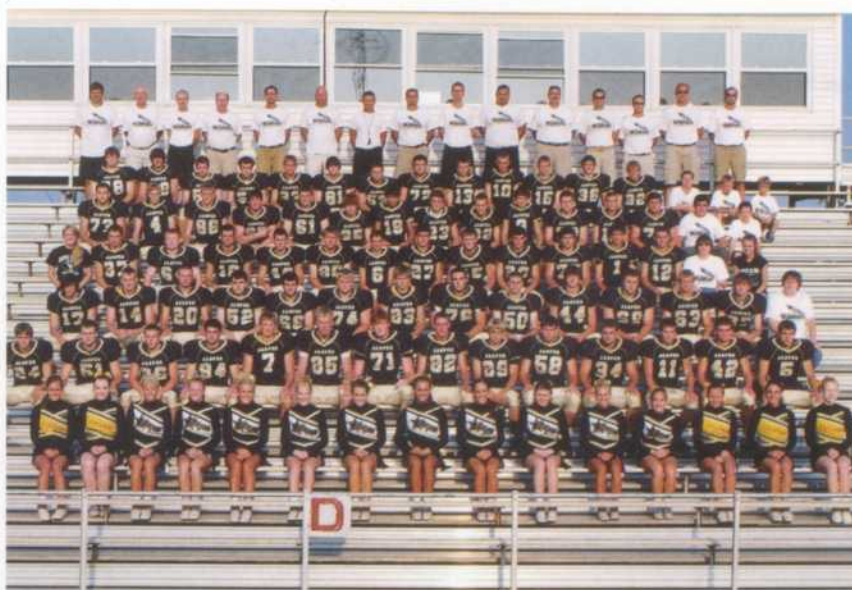

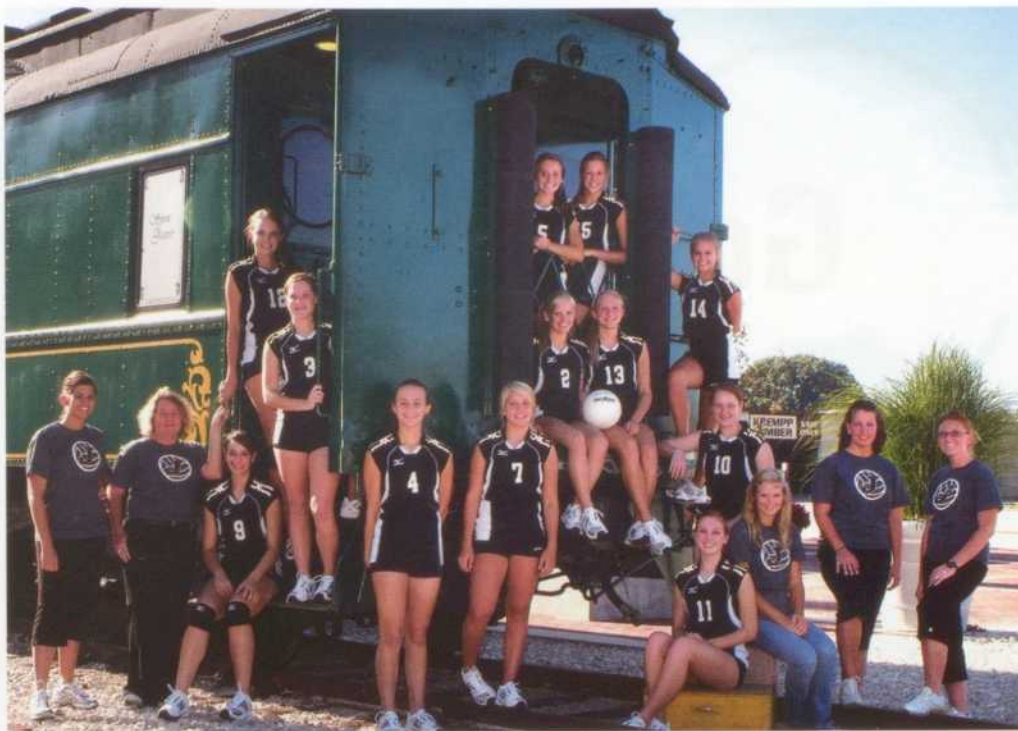

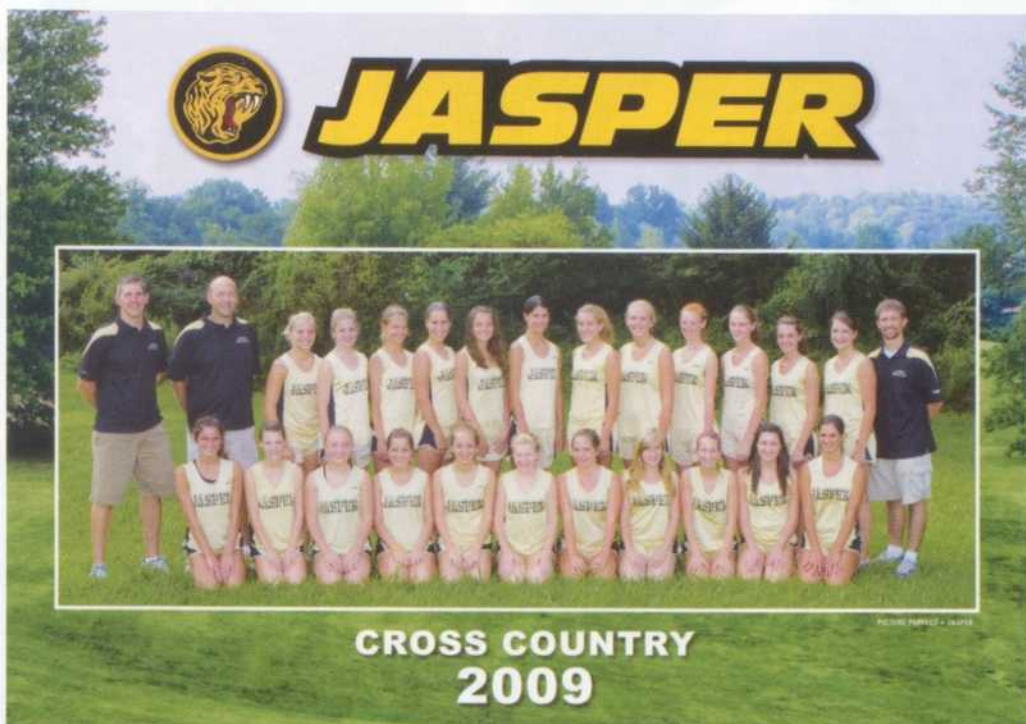

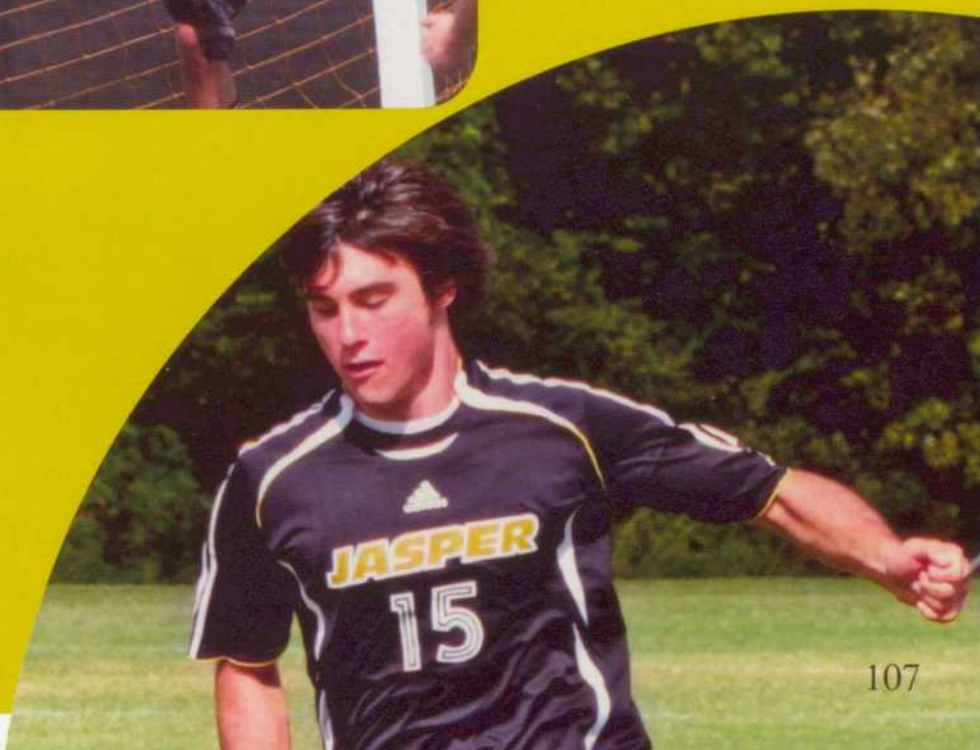

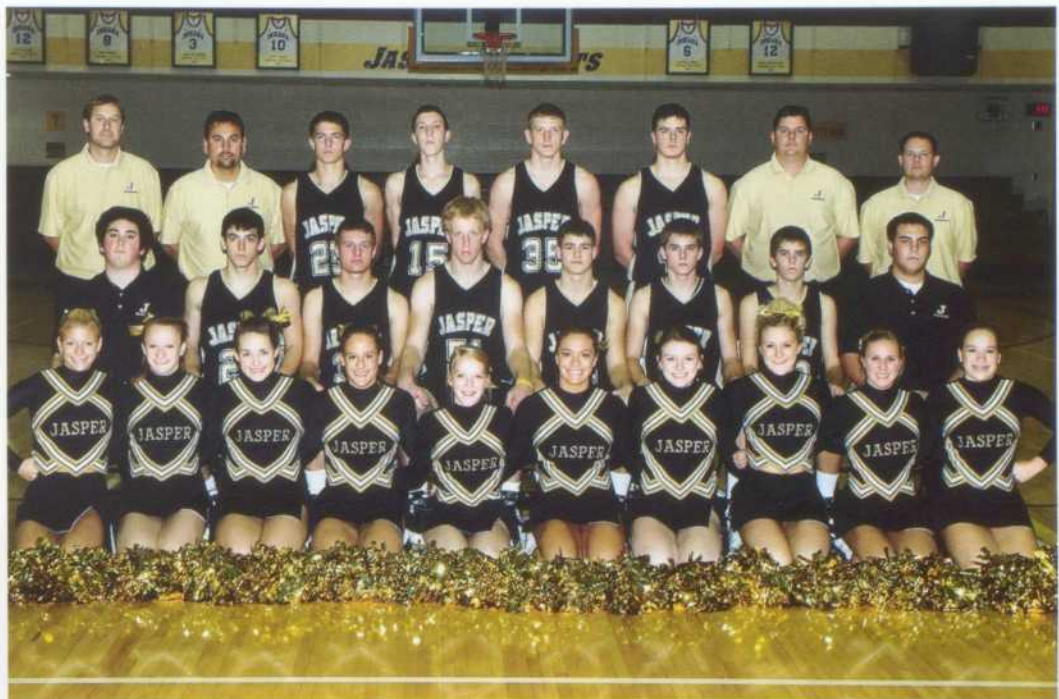


Warm-ups were a key for the Wildcats this season to get ready for the game. The Wildcats won their first sectional game since the 06' season.

With a large and talented freshman class, coaches were given the task of making sure everyone got their minutes. With this task, they did a fine job.

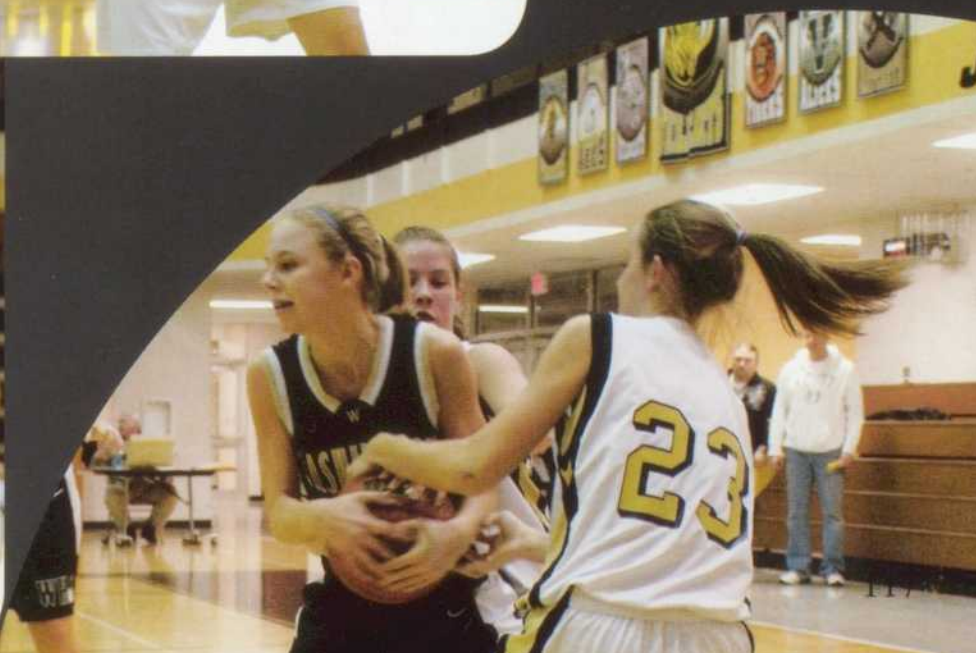
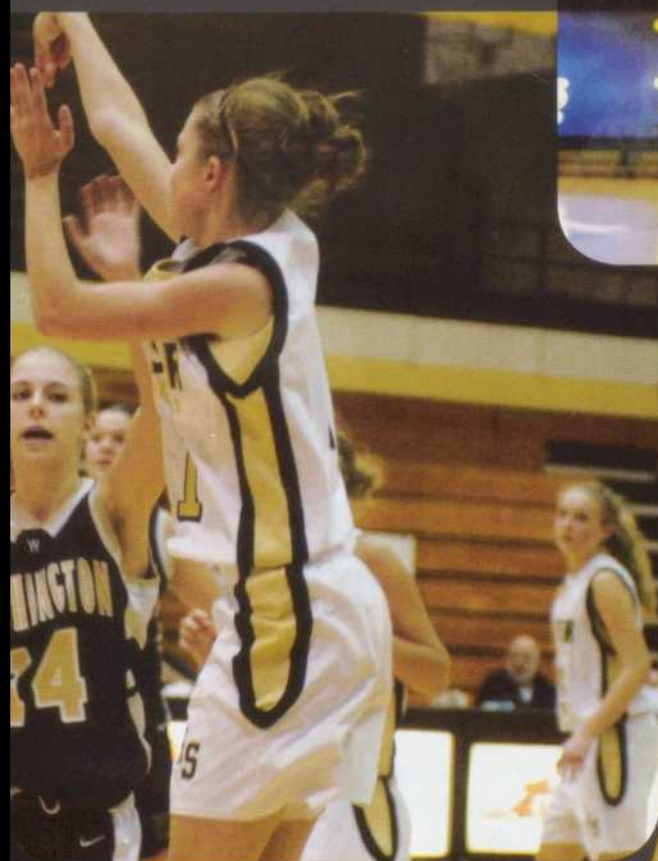

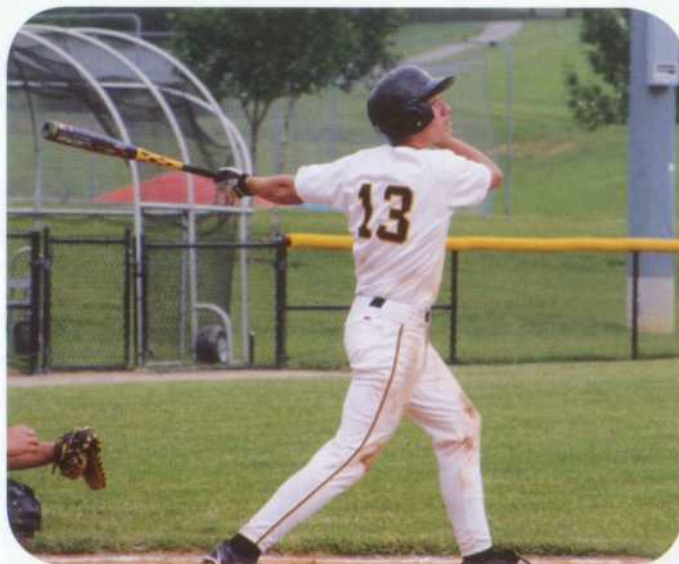

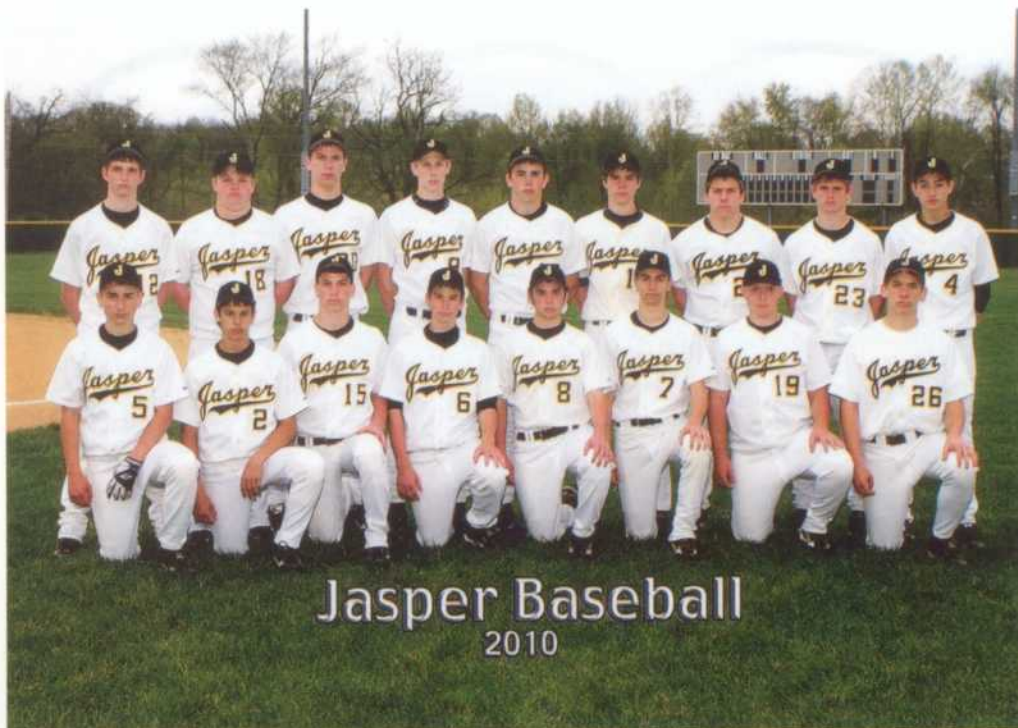


Ben Mundy (10) was one of the Junior Varsity's top pitchers this year. The JV team finished their season 18 and 2 with his pitching skills.

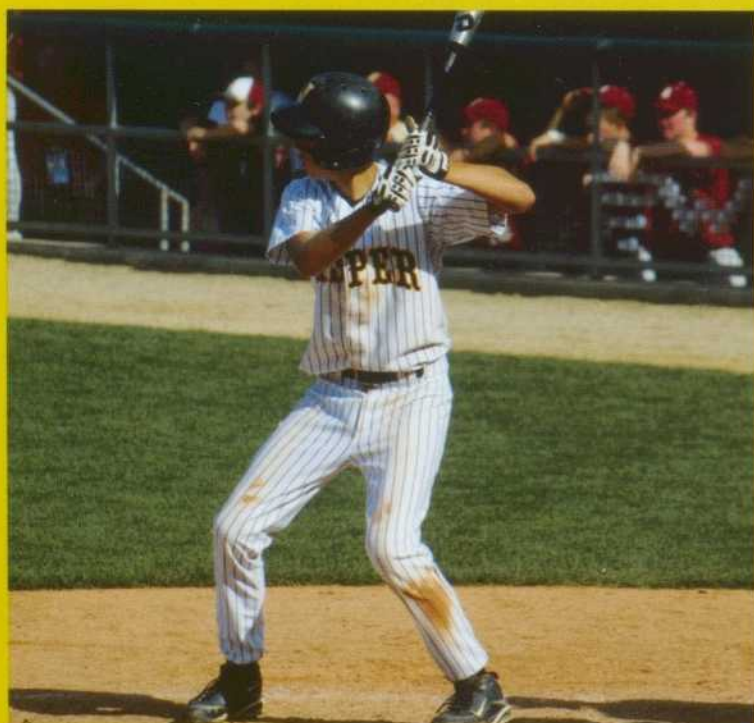

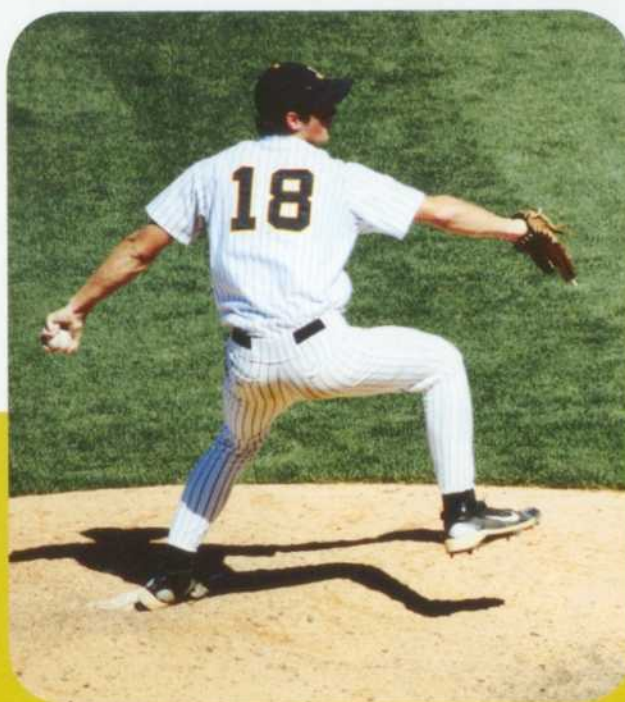

With the seniors leaving, the team will be fairly new as the upcoming freshmen arrive. The Seniors did a great job this year, and with them gone, they will be missed.

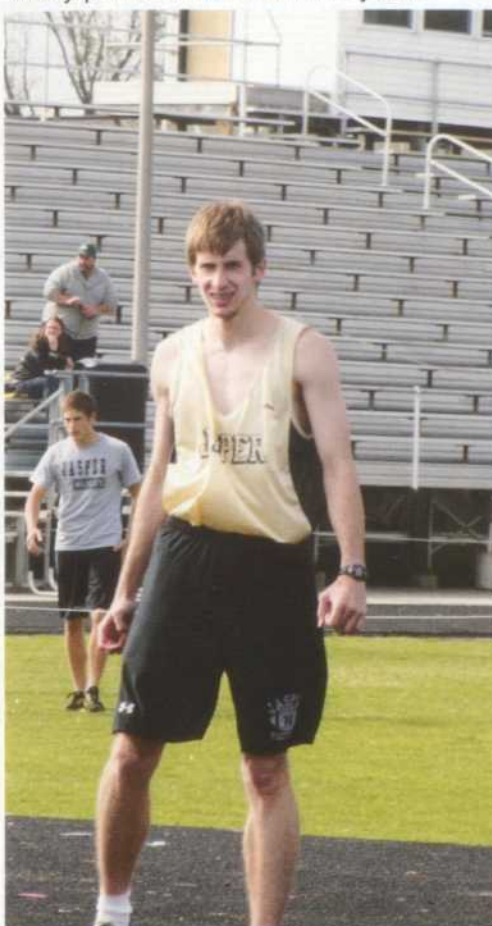

The girls track team lost their head coach this year. Mrs. Schaffer decided to retire after fourteen years. She will be missed by all the team members.



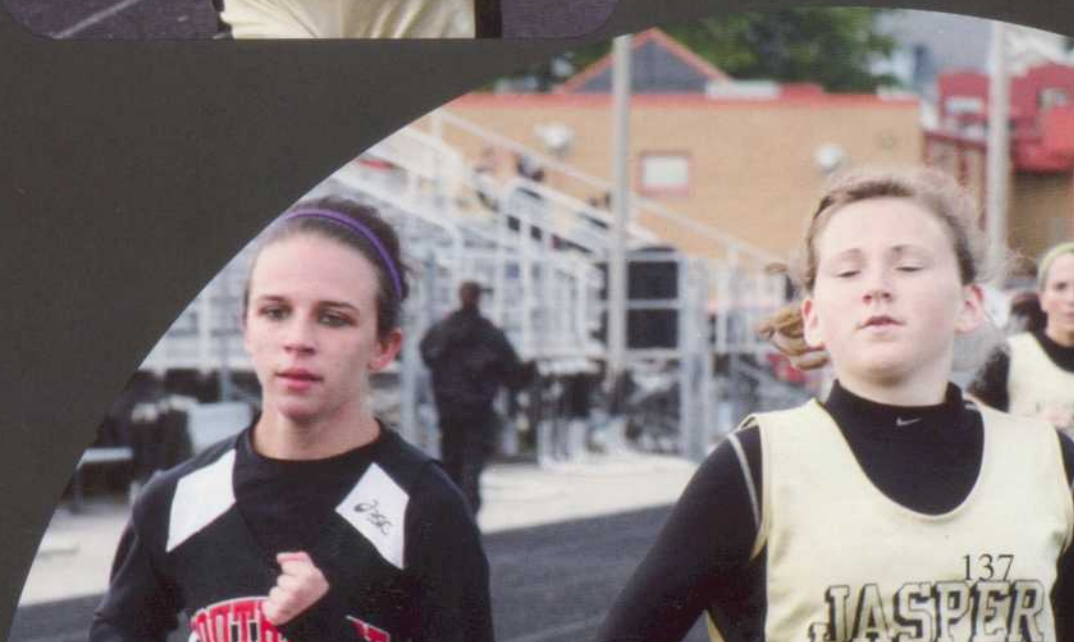

Can't be Touched was the motto of Jasper Wildcats tennis and they were not touched! You could tell because the boys' Wildcats finished the season 11 and 5.

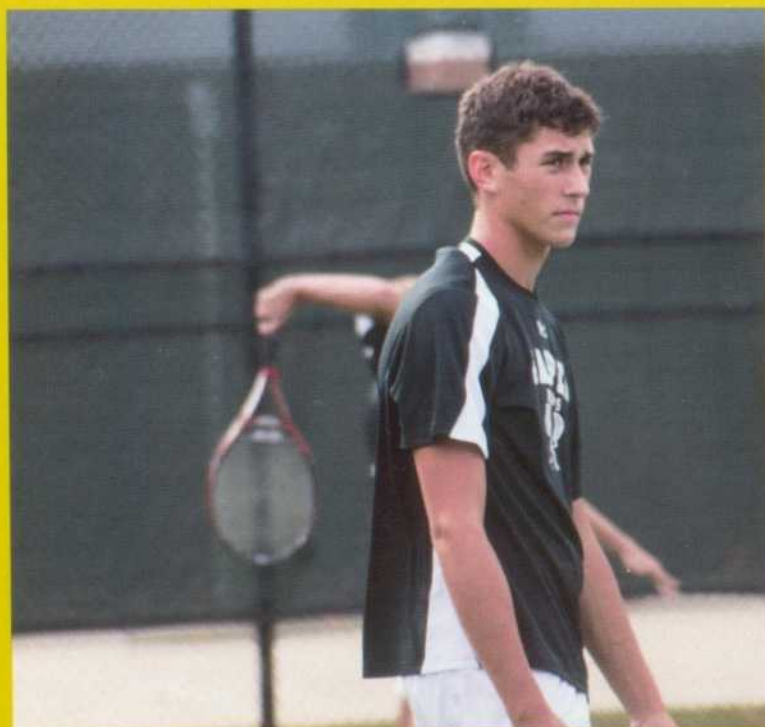


The boys' tennis team made an incredible run for state this year! They started by practicing in the midst of summer and took time out of their busy summer schedule to dedicate their time to the team.
