Once A Student, Then A Teacher, Now Our Principal

A DIRECT INTERVIEW WITH MRS. TINA FAWKS

Interviewed By: Gabrielle Schepers



Have there been any major struggles that you had to deal with during the transition from teacher to principal?

"YES! In the beginning of the year, I couldn't believe how difficult it was for me to figure out how to structure my day, because as a teacher, you have 7 periods, and you go bell-to-bell, and now, on the surface, my day is open. It fills up incredibly quickly. Just figuring out what I need to do with certain times of my day, that is difficult."

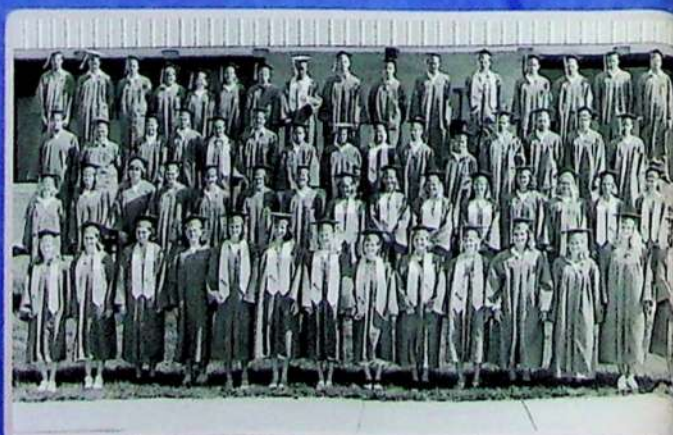
"The other thing that I really struggled with is I felt pretty confident in myself as a teacher, because I've been doing it for, well 9 years, and I just felt like I knew what I was doing. This is such a learning process, and I feel like I'm doing a good job, but that confidence that's inside you, I don't have that (as principal) yet, you know. I want to do a good job, I want to do right by people, so that's been hard for me."

What made you decide that you wanted to apply for the principal position?

"I never ever thought I would end up here (as principal) when I went into education and when I got my first teaching job I thought I would be a classroom teacher forever. And then life just takes you places you don't expect, so when I came back here, that was a great decision for my family, and then maybe because it is a small school, I found myself taking more leadership roles. I don't know, it just made sense."

With becoming a principal and dedicating 100% of your time to being our administrator, do you miss coaching extra-curricular activities such as spell bowl and track?

"Probably more than anything. And that's the other thing, when you're in the classroom and when you're coaching extra-curricular activities, that's how you get to know kids more than any other way. Other than the kids I taught, the kids I know from track, and through spell bowl, I don't feel that the student body really knows me as a person yet, and that's tough."





How much has administration changed since you were a student here at Northeast Dubois?

"Hmmm. I think there is more involvement with students making decisions now. That's probably the biggest change."

"Our students do a lot more thinking for themselves, which is a good thing. That is also a challenge in a lot of ways."

What is your favorite thing about being our principal here at the high school?

"I always got to interact with students in the classroom, but that's still the best part about being in education. I get to see them learn and grow, help them through difficult times and come out on the other side, and become stronger and more resilient people."

How was it, adjusting to the time commitment required for a principal versus the commitment of a teacher?

"What has been nice, is actually when I'm home, I'm home. My mind doesn't turn off, but I'm not grading papers on Sundays (like when I taught Composition). That part of it is nice. The other thing about my evenings, there are definitely more evenings when I have to be at school, for like freshman orientation and things like that, but when it comes to sports, and that kind of supervision, they come with me, which is wonderful."

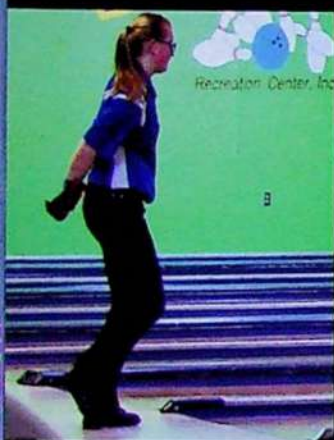
Ms. Jessica Pfau

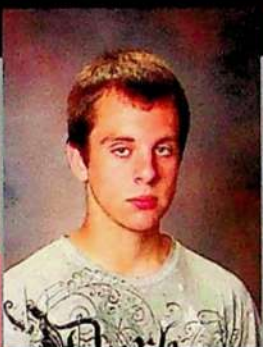

Ian Wilson, grade 12, gave us a lot of great information about the Robotics Club. The following information is from an interview with Ian.

"I believe the pictures you have are of the Mark V propulsion system, built for near-human speed and drag racing. It is different than the one we used in competition, though there we still had the fastest robot."

"At competition at VUJC we placed number 11 out of 18 teams, number 2 among the rookie teams."

This robot was built for FIRST Tech Challenge. We are allowed to use any commonly available parts, Tetrix, which was the one we used primarily, Vex, for the front wheels and axles, Legos, just about anything we could find at a hardware store, as well as 3-D printed parts, which we used for front axle bushings. The robot is controlled by two phones, one plugged into the robot, the other into the controller. In competition there was a 30 second section where the robot had to be programmed, followed by two minutes of remote control. The remote control program had to be created by us. With it we could make the robot drive at 25, 50, 75, and 100% power, use two arms, which packed quite a punch if one happened to be holding it when somebody pushed the wrong button.... It could also scream 'EXTERMINATE' like a Dalek, and had a sort of plow and holding area in the front to move things. In the competition arena, we never had a chance to practice on until our first match.

When Ian Wilson, grade 12, was asked about what happens during a normal meeting, he replied "At a 'normal' meeting we tend to work on the robot and terrorize people up and down the halls with it, (trust me, getting hit at full speed will break ankles and dent doors, if you look carefully at some doors....). We also listen to Nordic battle music and the Soviet national anthem (best not to ask why)."

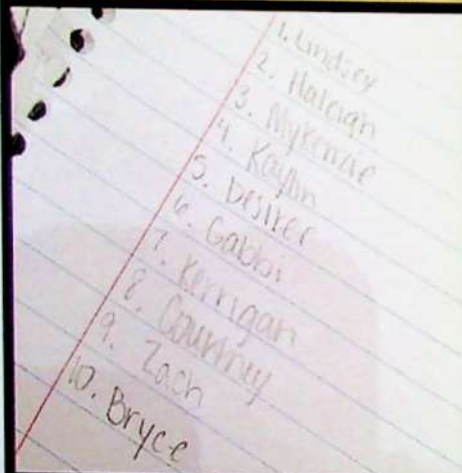

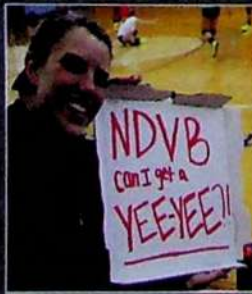
