Dance Team

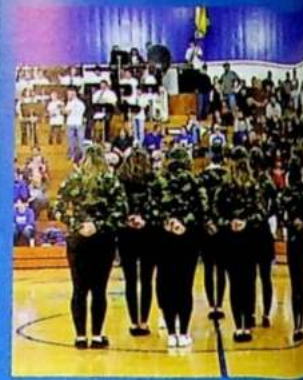

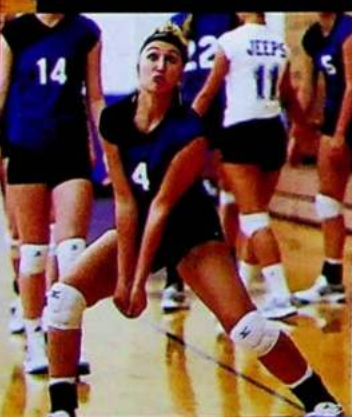

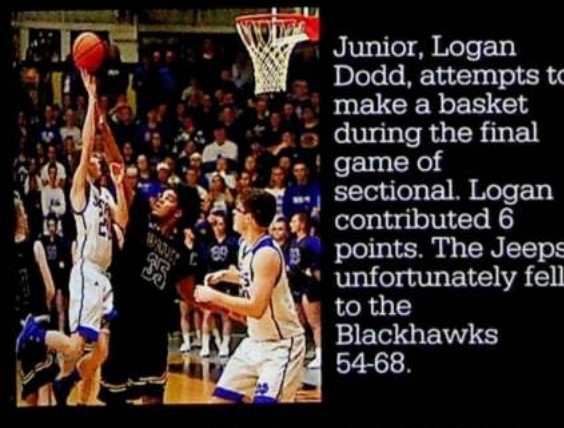

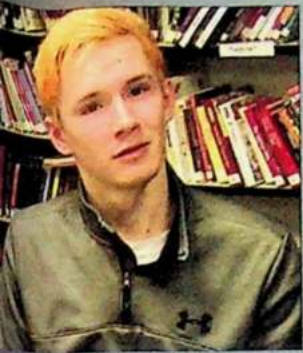
POE Boat Races

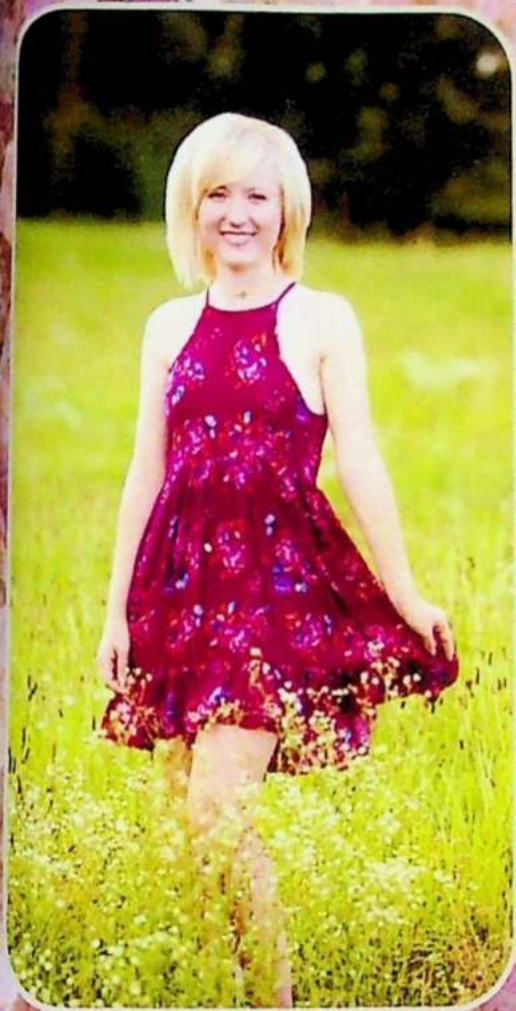
IN CLOSING,
