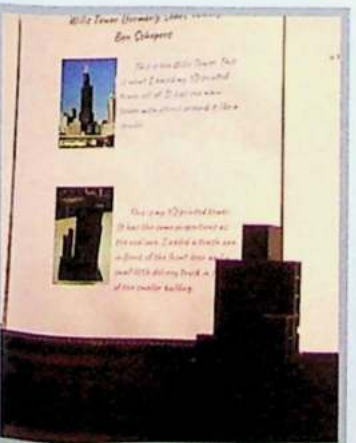
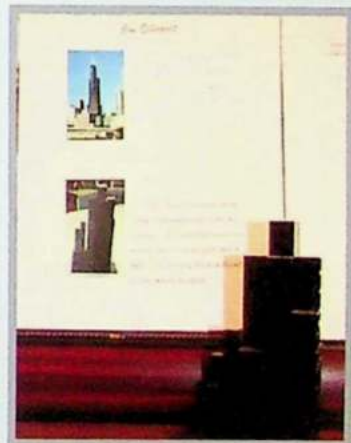
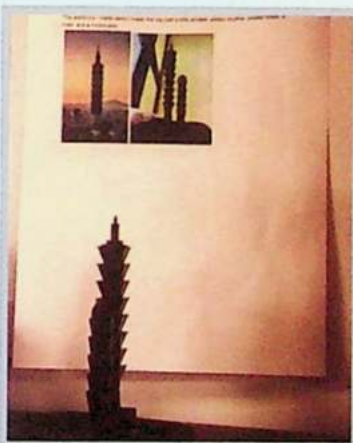
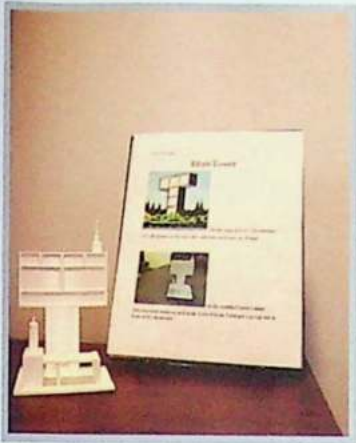
This year we had a small team but they held their own and had fun doing it. Three seniors will be graduating so the team is looking to rebuild the team.

- Tortilla De Patatas**
 1 kg Potatoes
 200 gr Onions
 1/4 l Olive oil
 8 eggs
 salt

Peel onions and cut into strips. Peel Potatoes and cut into strips. Wash and rinse potatoes. In a frying pan, simmer the onion and sliced potatoes until soft, on low heat. When tender, take off the excess oil and season potatoes. Mash them a little and brown slightly. Beat the eggs, season them and pour on the potatoes. Stir until mixture is solid. Let brown and simmer. Turn over. Slide from pan onto a plate.
