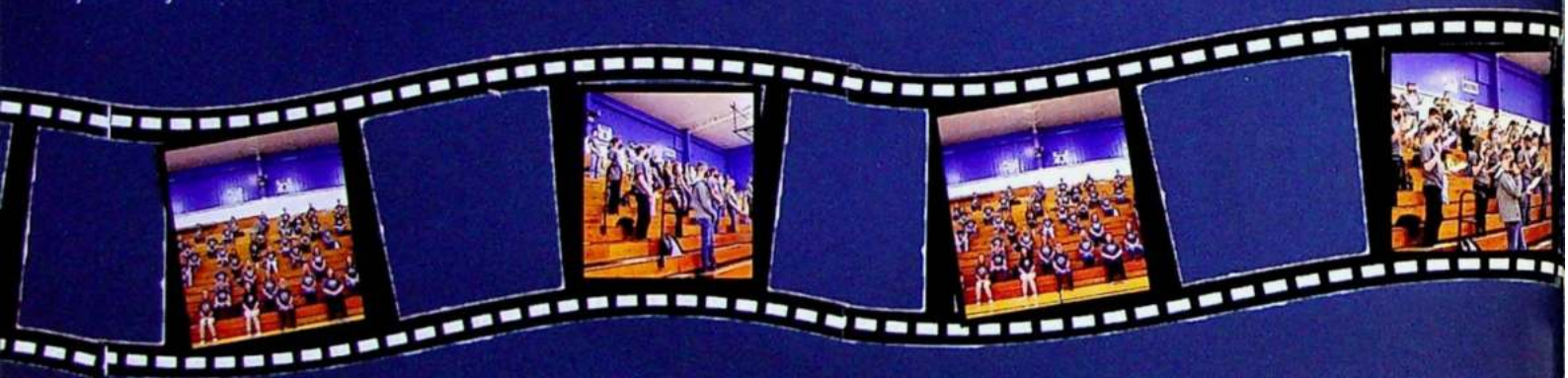


Beta Club Convention was virtual this year. Corbin placed 3rd in the Agri-science competition.
